

INTRODUCTION:

The setting up of a corporate strategic goal for the Corps is to systematically guide the organization (FRSC) in its quest of: -

- Attaining its Vision for Nigeria NV20:2020,
- Meet the Accra Declaration of 2015, and,
- Achieving the United Nations Decade of Action on Road Safety (2011-2020).

A review therefore of the four parameters outlined as road map for realizing the goals at the end of 2014 will ultimately channel a course for refocusing and breaking new grounds





Cumulative RTC Trend: Jan-Oct 2014





No. of Persons Killed Jan - Oct 2014




The Top Ten Crash-Prone Routes Nationwide





Recommendations for going forward in 2015

- The Corps should specially focus on Crash prone routes in FCT, Nasarawa and Bauchi States to stem the high fatalities and RTC occurrences identified.
- Specific road audits and research should be conducted to provide clear insight to unravel the root cause of crashes in the following States.
 - FCT
 - Nasarawa
 - Kaduna
 - Bauchi
 - Niger
- A special mobile patrol operations should be conducted on crash prone corridors in the country to check excesses of road users resulting in serious injuries which may eventually lead to death.

Recommendations (II)

- Improved prosecution of traffic infractions with the Corps increasing mobile court sittings especially along the identified top ten States/routes where RTCs, Injuries and Fatalities were usually high, to enable the Corps achieve the UN Decade of Action
- The Corps should restore "Roll of Shame" strategy and extended to registered Fleet
 Operators and Freight Transporters who are on FRSC database to curtail driver's
 misbehaviour
- The Corps should increase media advocacy including regular TV and Radio commercials on safe driving and proper road use are aired at peak periods to educate the motoring public on driving to save lives
- Focus on child safety

Recommendations (III)

- The Corps should develop a digitalization policy that will increase the capacity of the Corps to fully digitalise all its operations, including operating a paperless organisaion commencing with running all routine reports only in digital format
- Improved Stakeholders engagement
- Robust Engagement of stakeholders more digitally
- Staff welfare -
 - Vision 20,000 houses ,
 - Self development capacity including encouraging staff to further their studies through NOUN
- Improved enforcement of traffic infarctions through flying ticketing
- Strengthening the regulatory capacity of the Corps through : -
 - amendment of FRSC Establishment Act
 - Ensuring the domesticaton of all relevant international traffic conventions
- Improved regulation of fleet operation and driving schools
- Enfacement of speed limiters
- Improved Road Safety Audit and impact assessment
