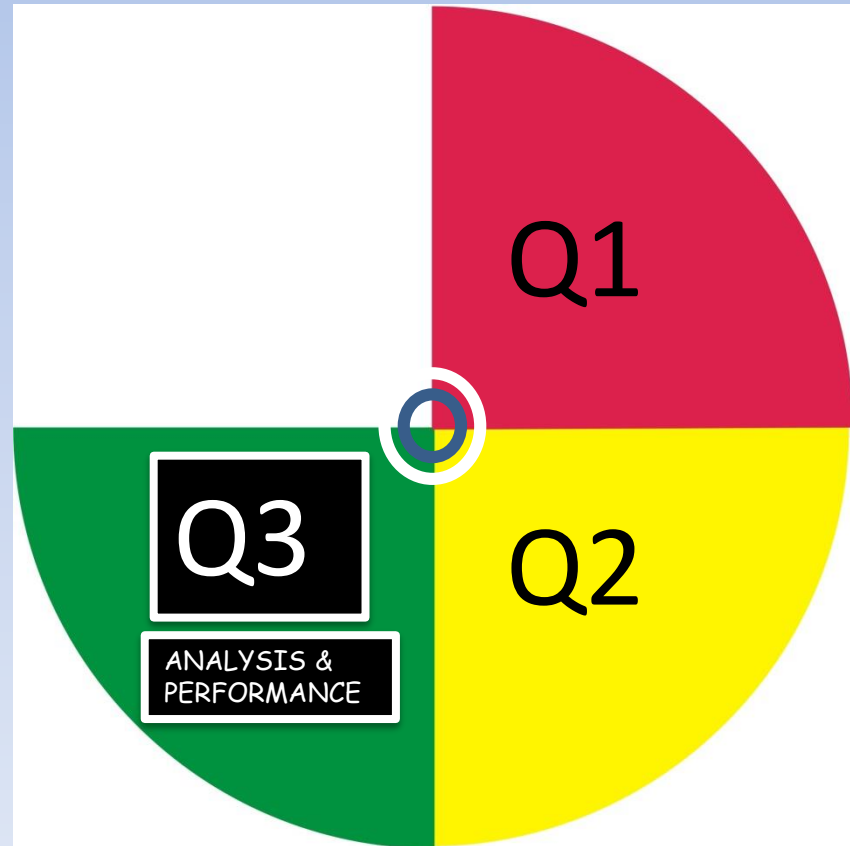


FEDERAL ROAD SAFETY CORPS

Introduction

The primary aim of the Corps is to realize its set target for the year 2014 by reducing road fatalities by 25% and road traffic crashes by 15% nationwide.

The path towards achieving the goal is however encapsulated in a series of events and programmes which is assessed each quarter.

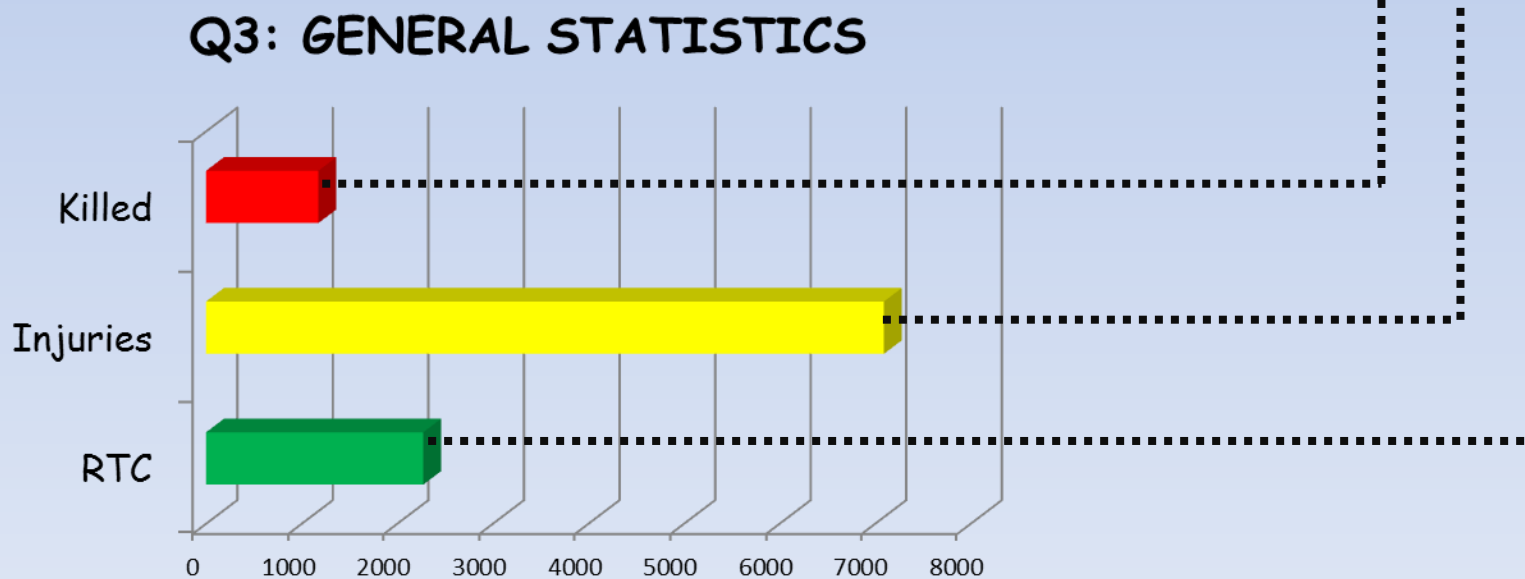
This third quarter (Q3) report and analysis took into consideration the performance of all key functions of the Corps which to a large extent resulted in reduction of road fatalities comparatively to previous quarters of the year.

A recommendation on the way forward on filling the gap that exists before the end of the fourth Quarter was suggested.

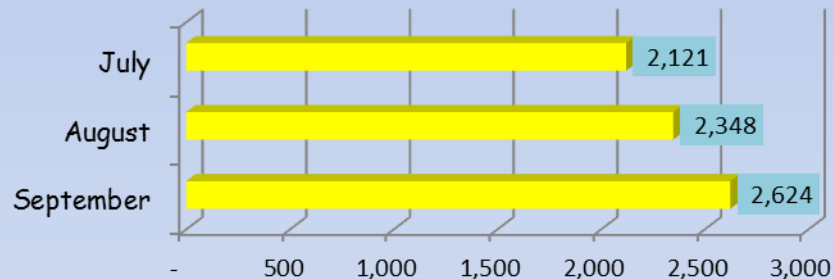

Q3: Road Traffic Crashes by Months



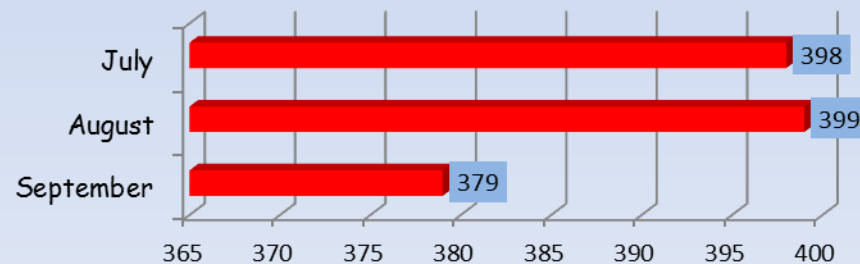

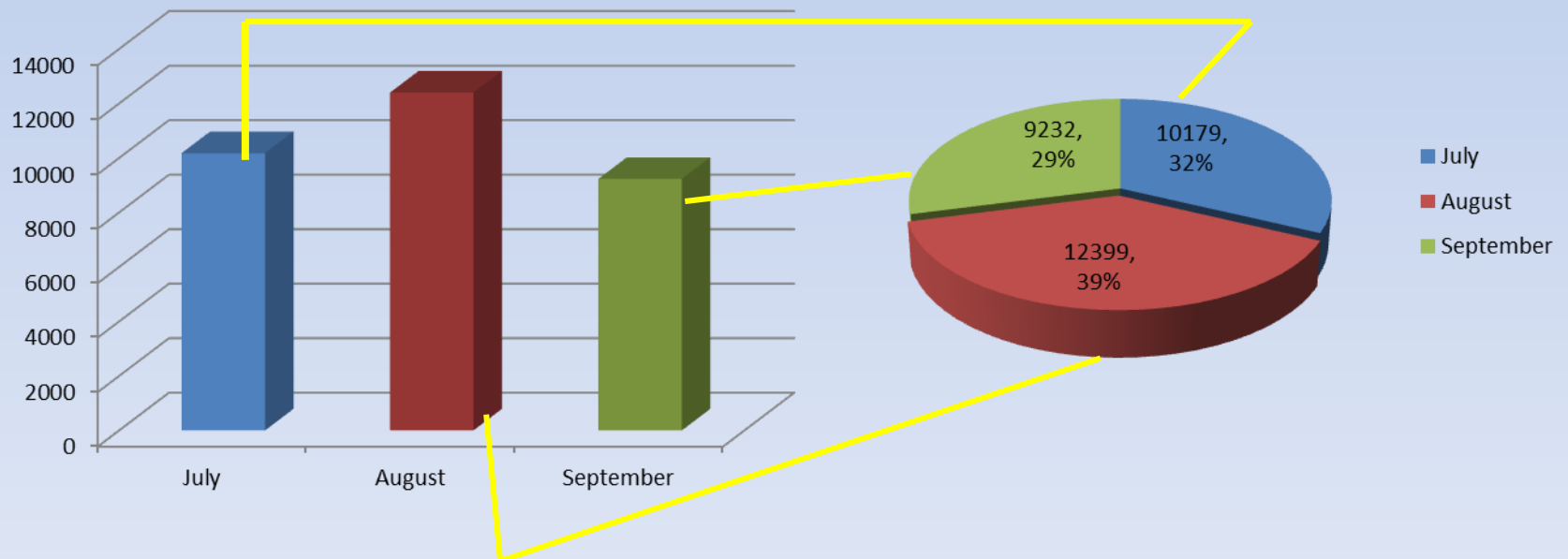

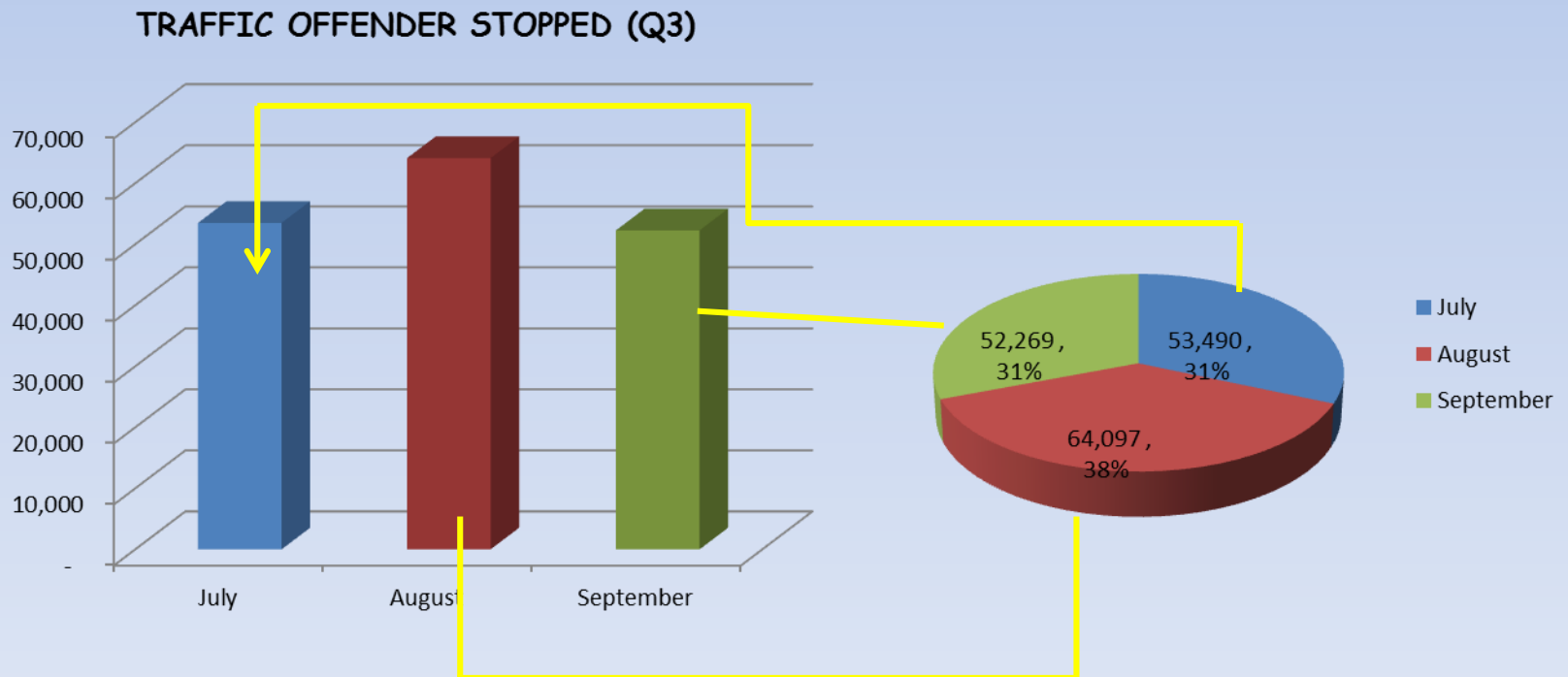

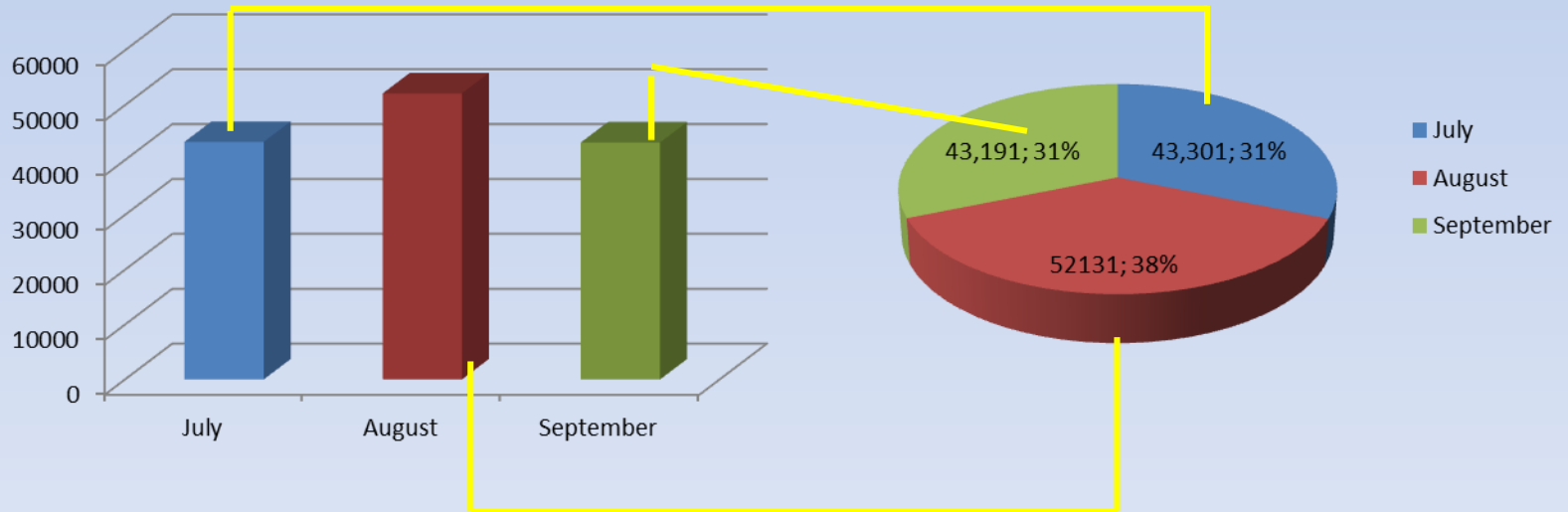

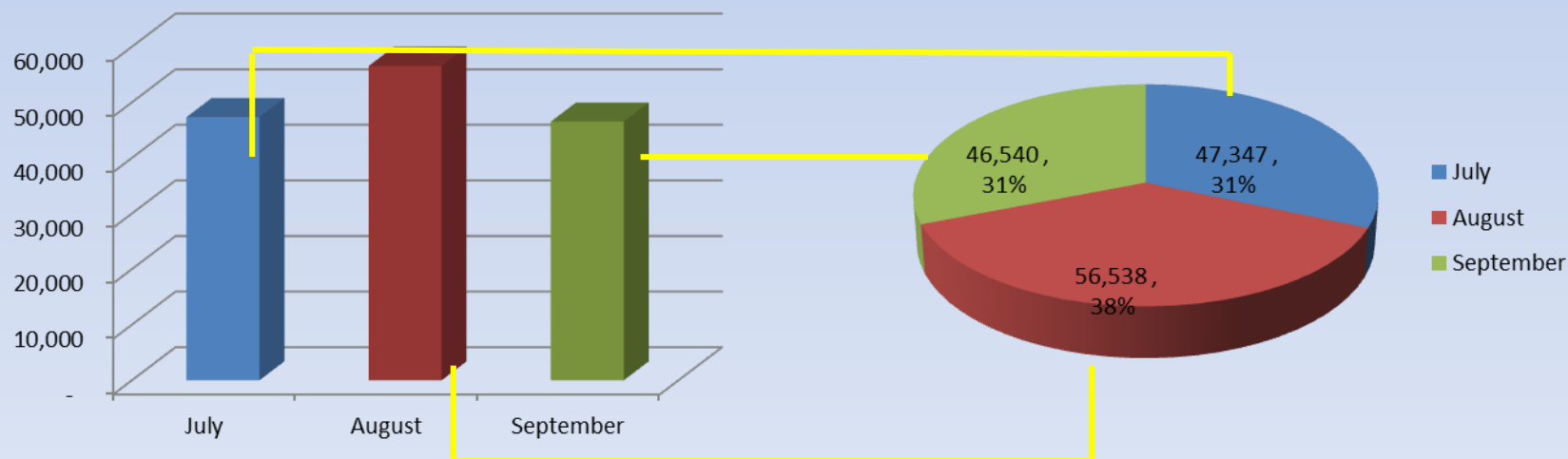

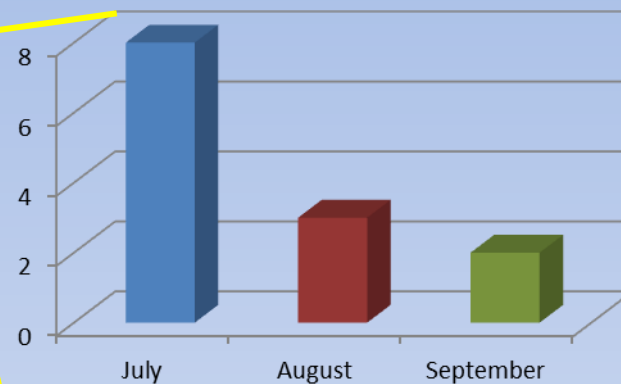

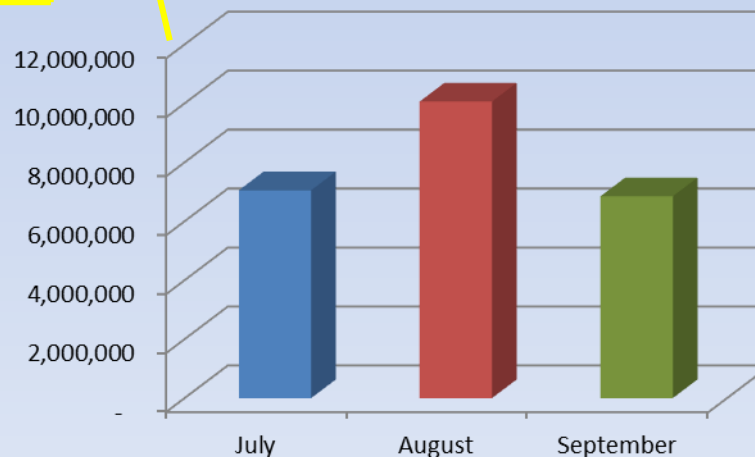

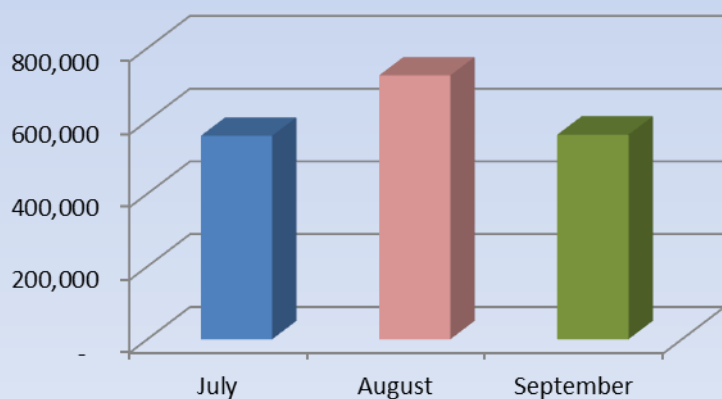
FLEET OPERATORS REGISTERED (Q3)

NO. OF VEHICLES TRAVELLED



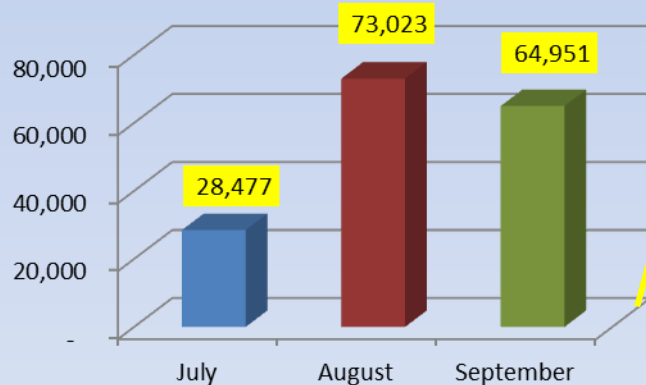

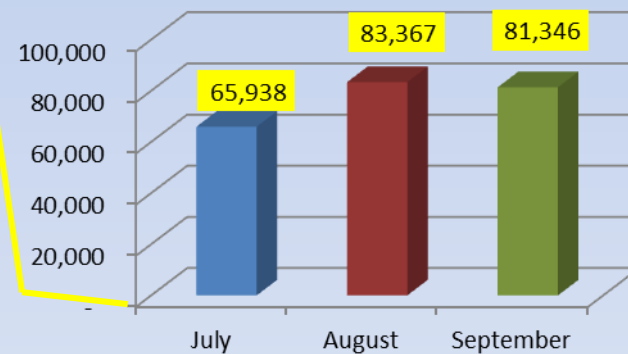

NO. OF DRIVERS LICENSE PRODUCED



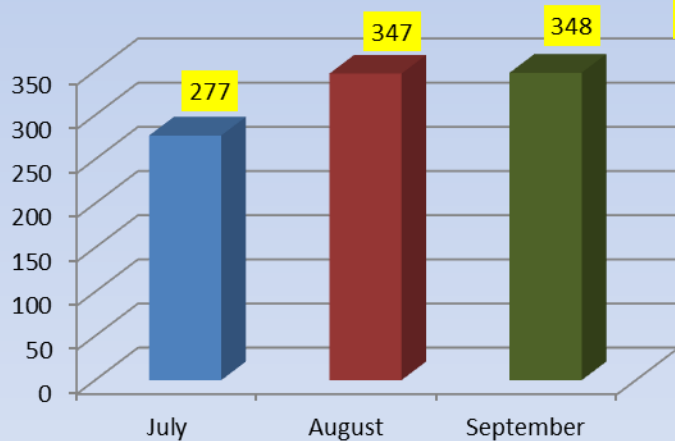

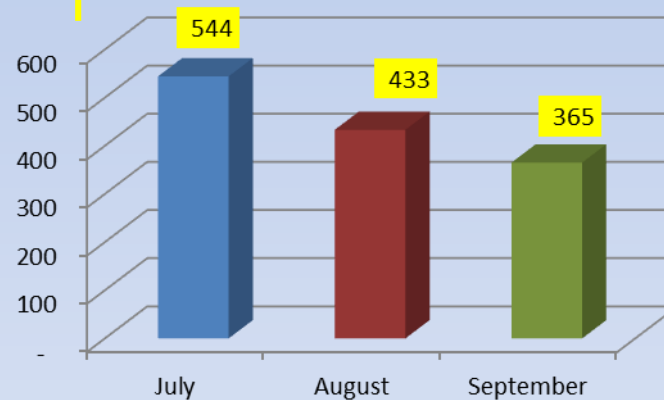

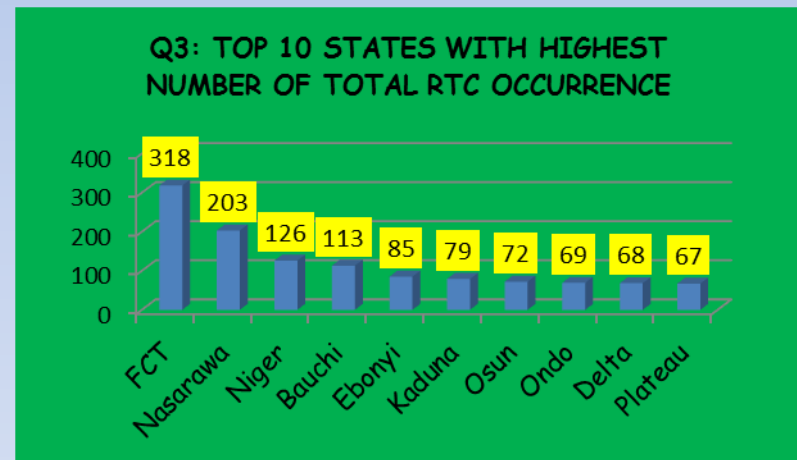

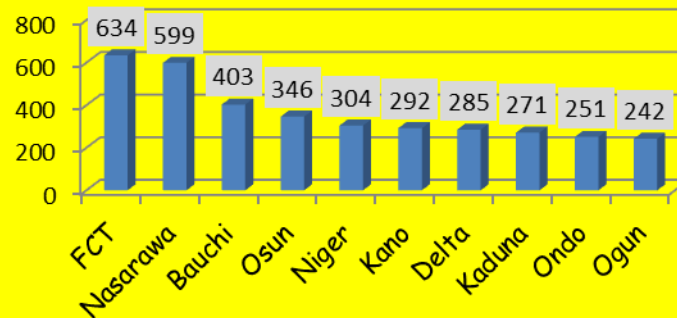

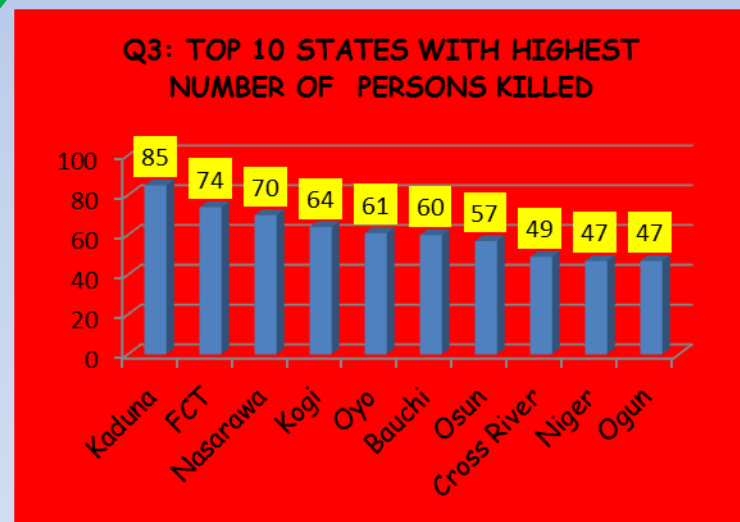
Q3: TOP 10 STATES WITH HIGHEST NUMBER OF PERSONS INJURED





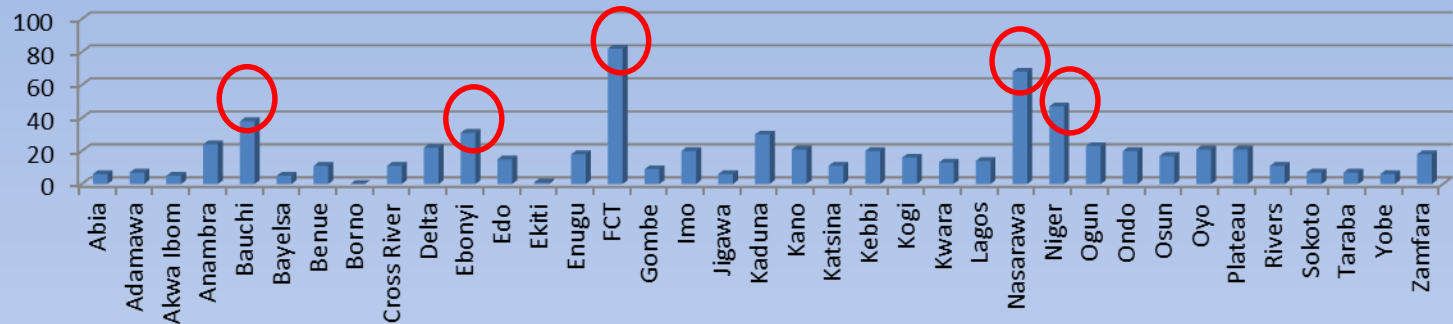

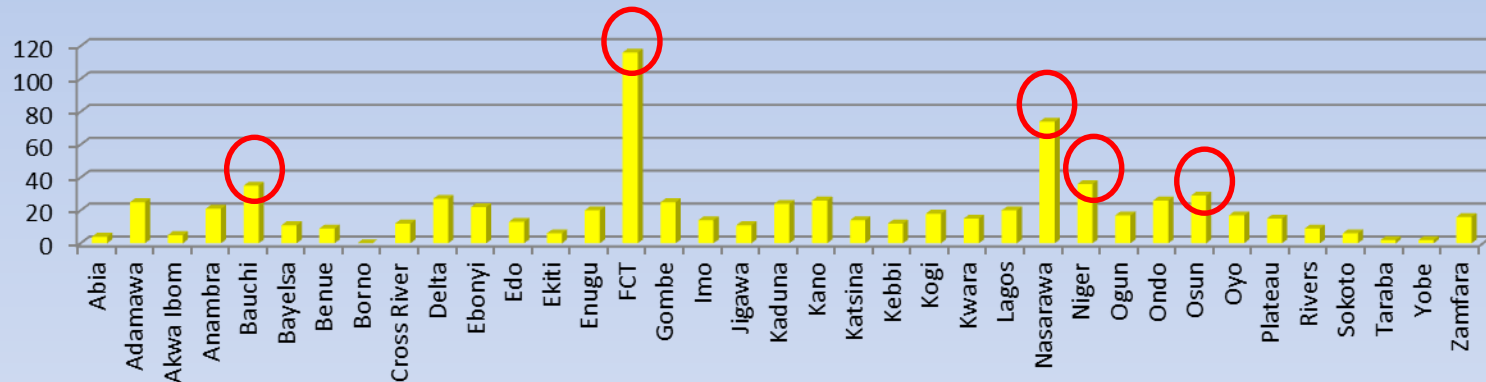

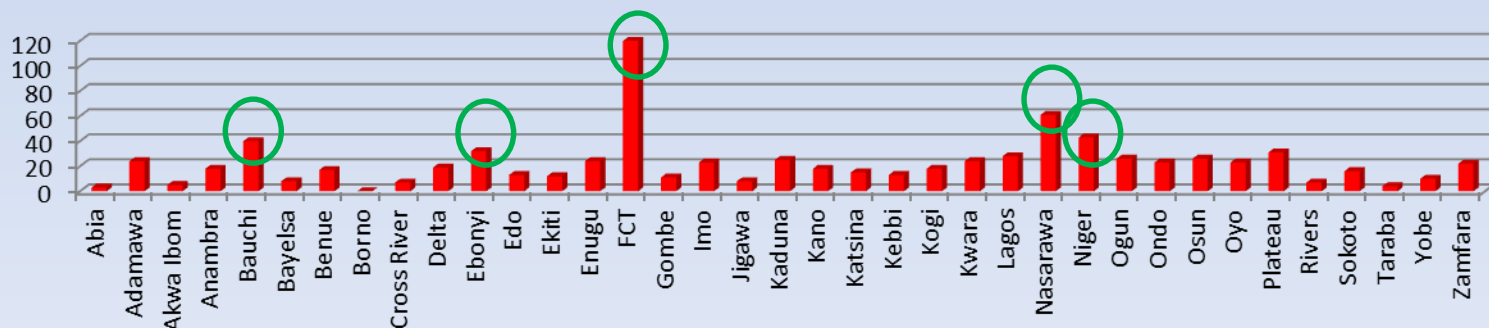
Total cases: July, 2014



Total cases: August, 2014

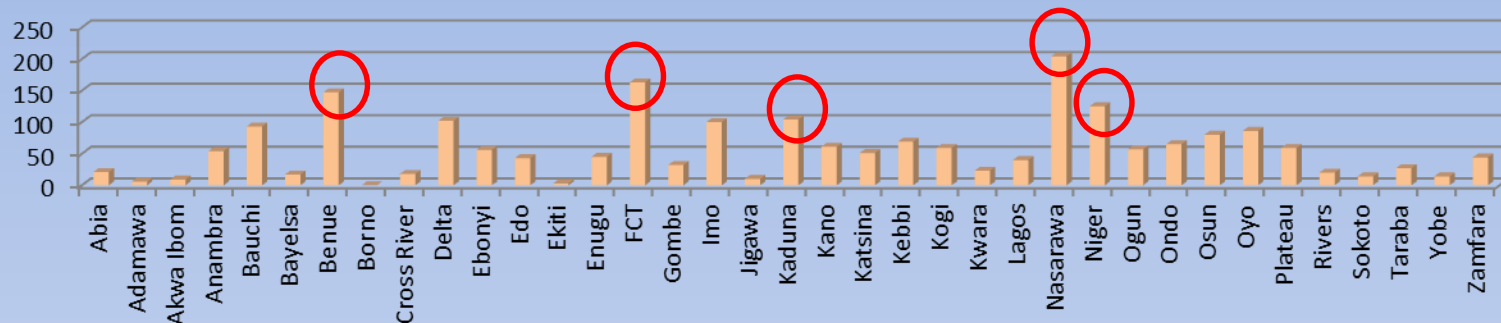


Total cases: September, 2014

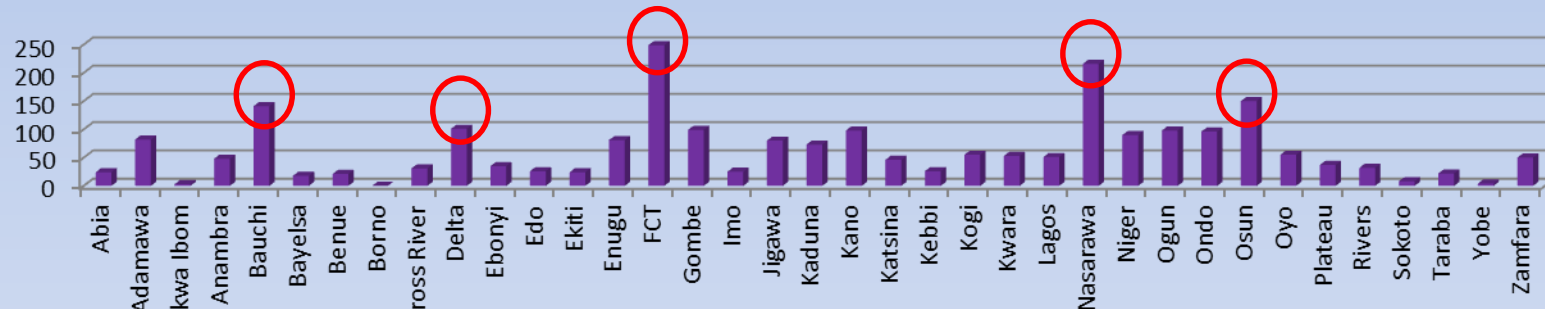


No. of Persons Injured: July, August & September

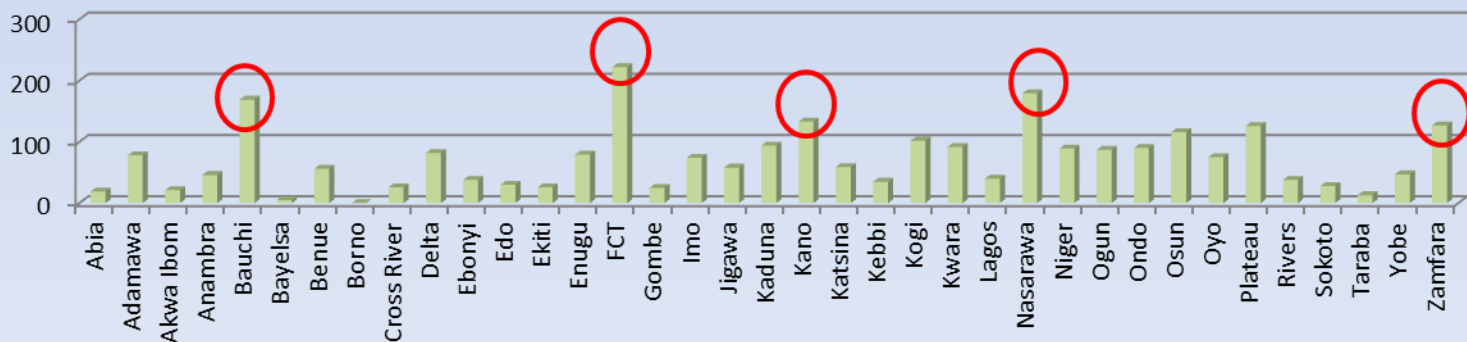
Total Injured: July, 2014

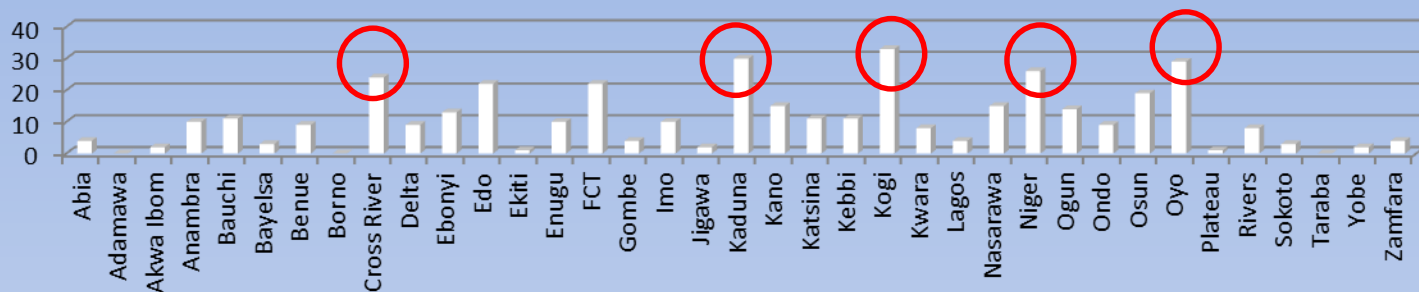


Total Injured: September, 2014

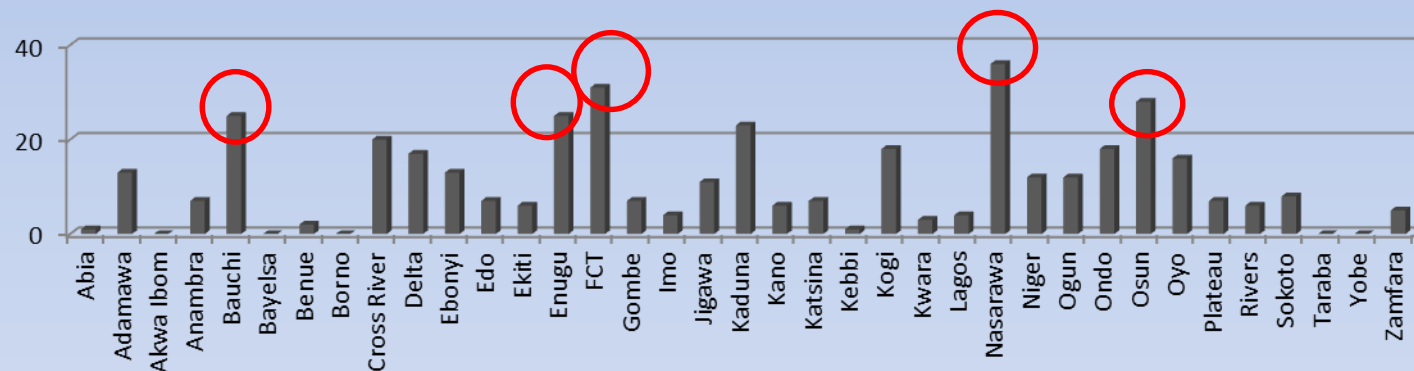


No. of Persons Killed: July, August & September

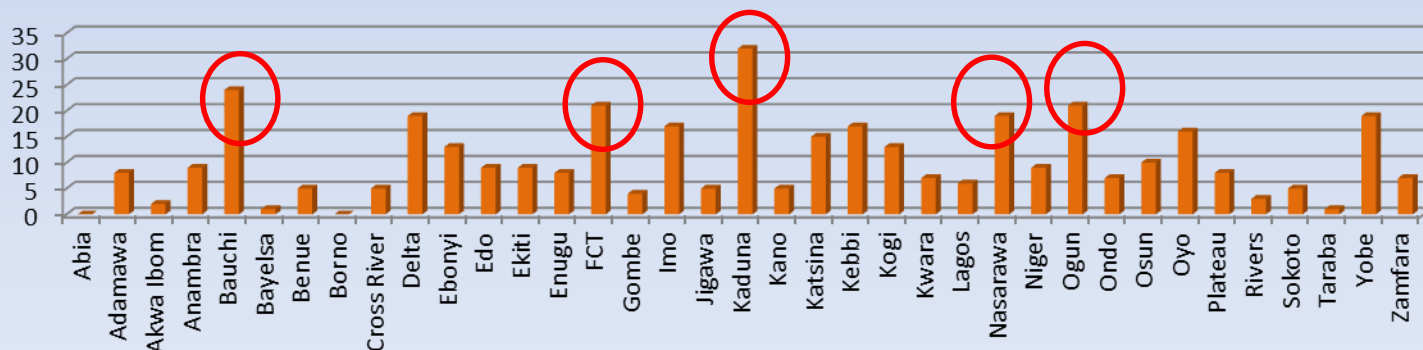
Total Killed: July, 2014

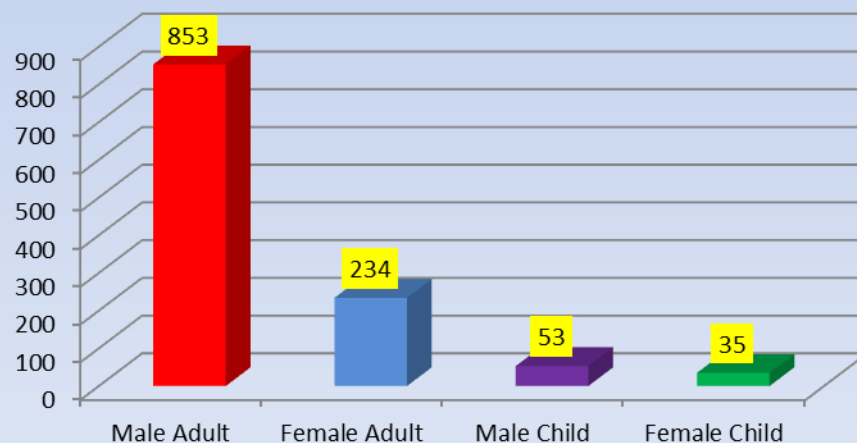




Q3: Month by Month Sex Distribution of Persons Killed

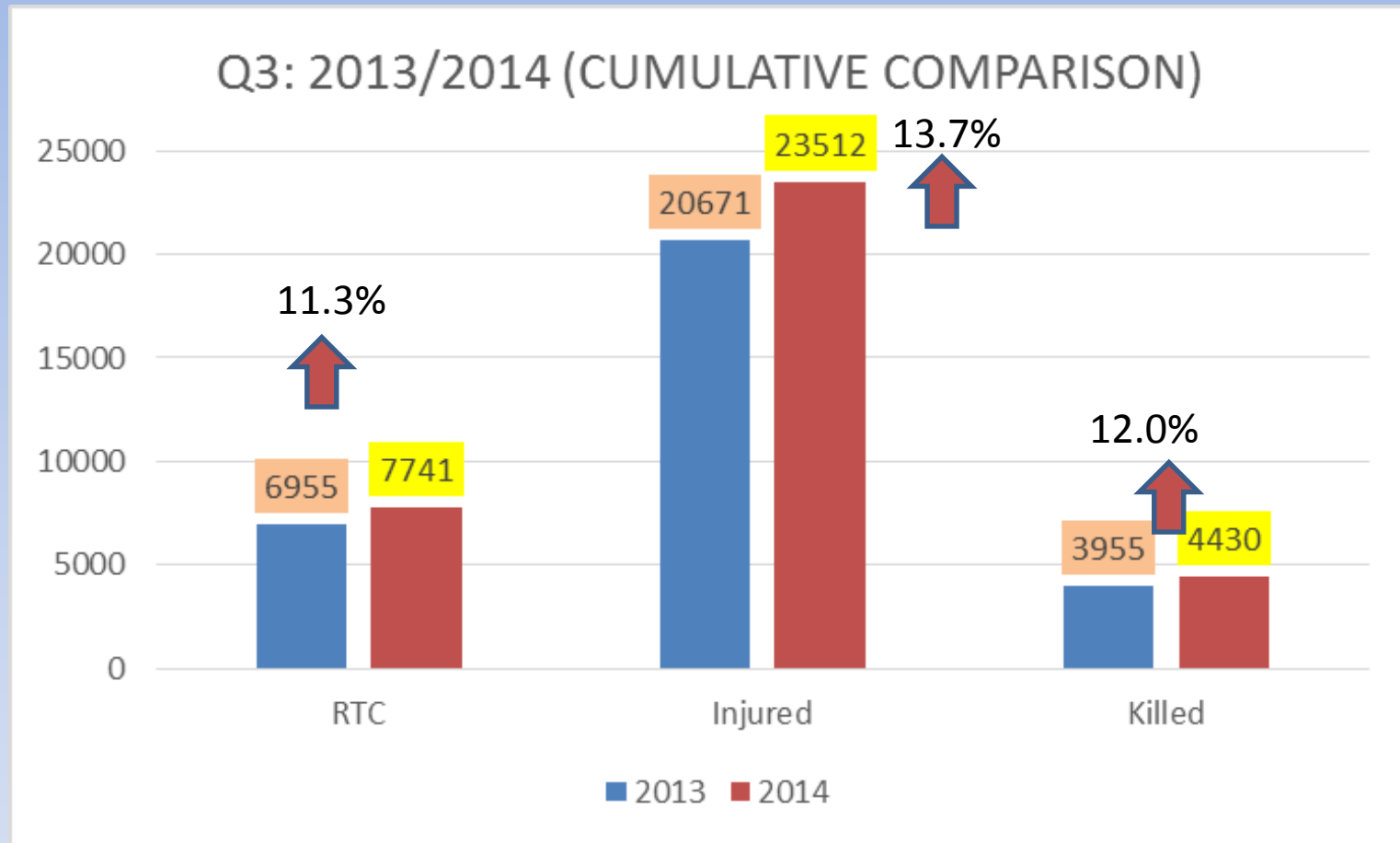

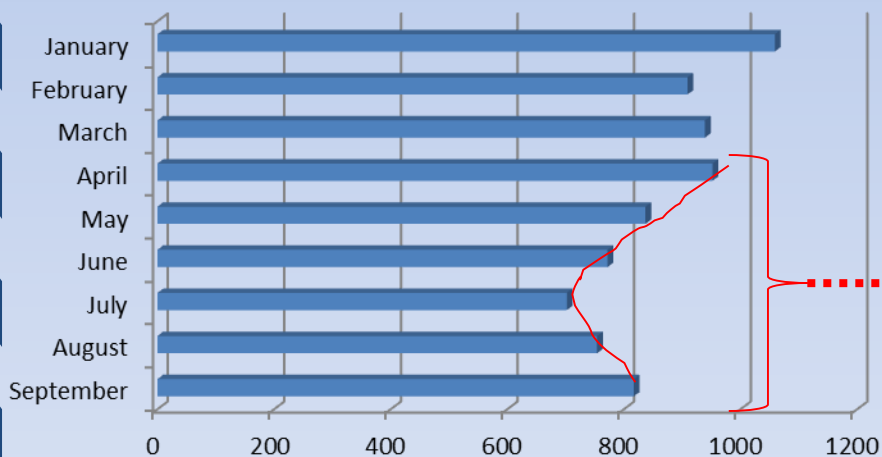

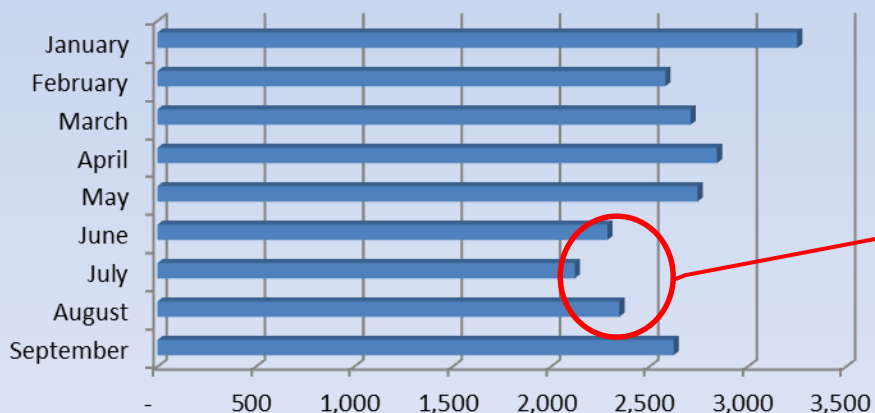

2014 Number of Persons Injured according to Months

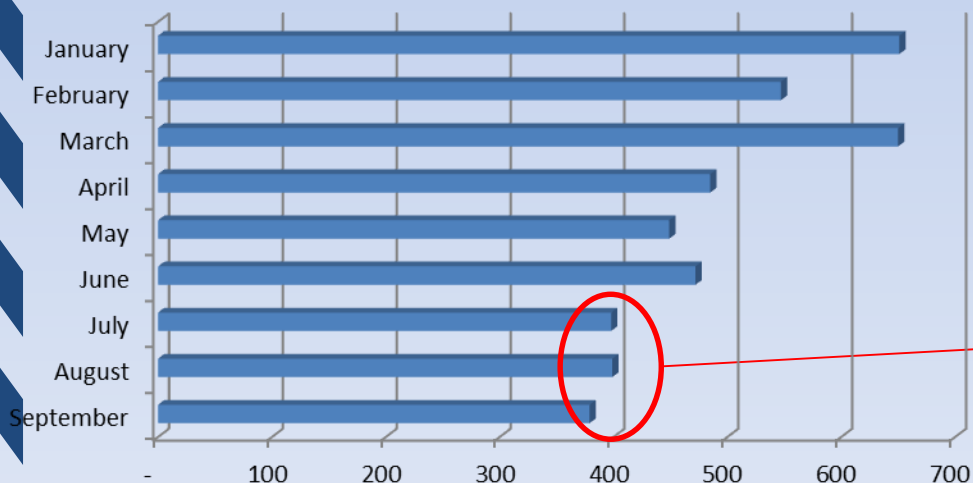

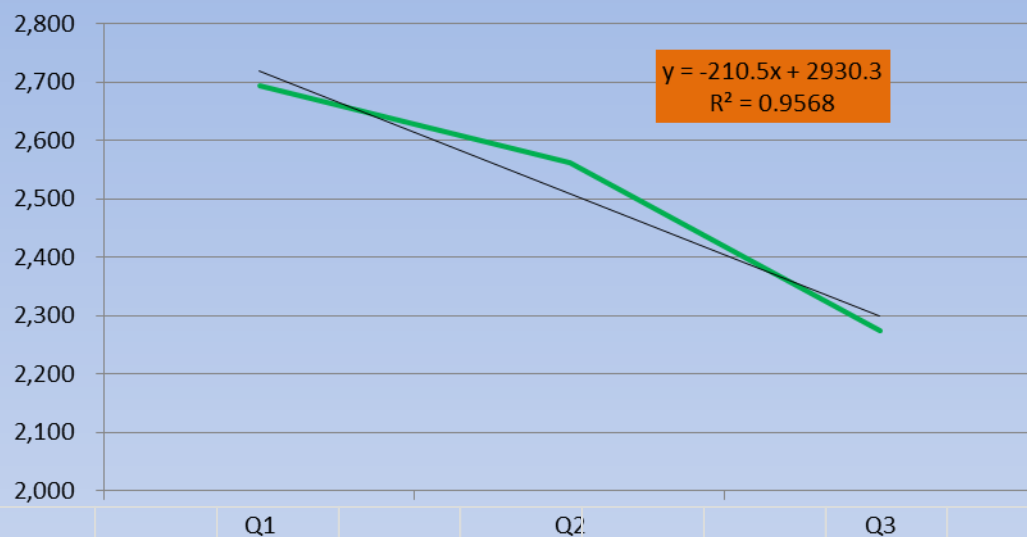

2014 Number of Persons Killed according to Month

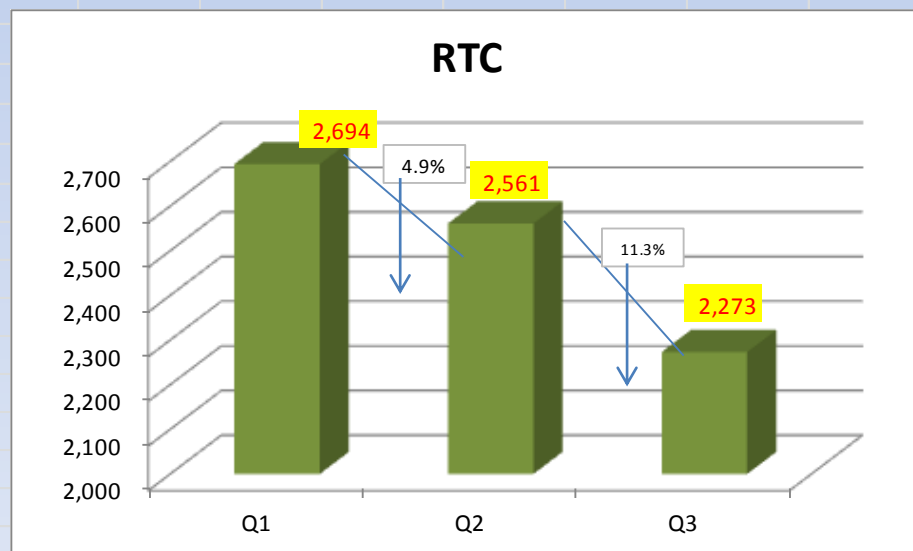




RTC: Q1;Q2 & Q3 TREND ANALYSIS

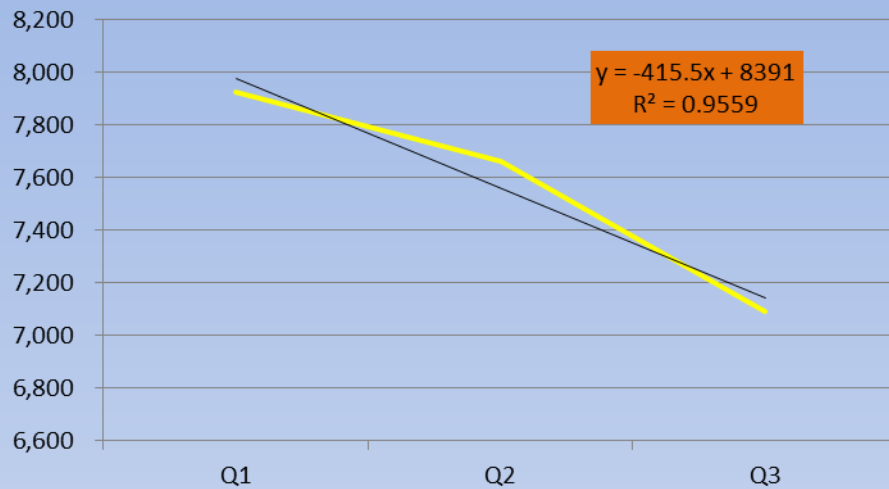

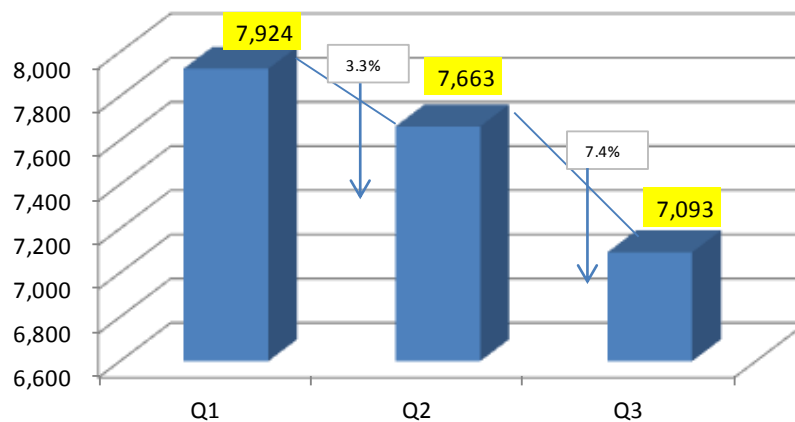


INJURIES:Q1;Q2 & Q3 TREND ANALYSIS



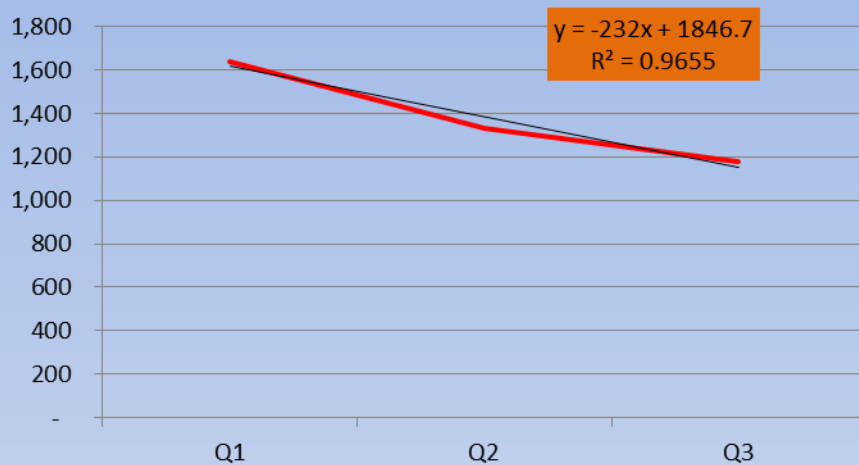

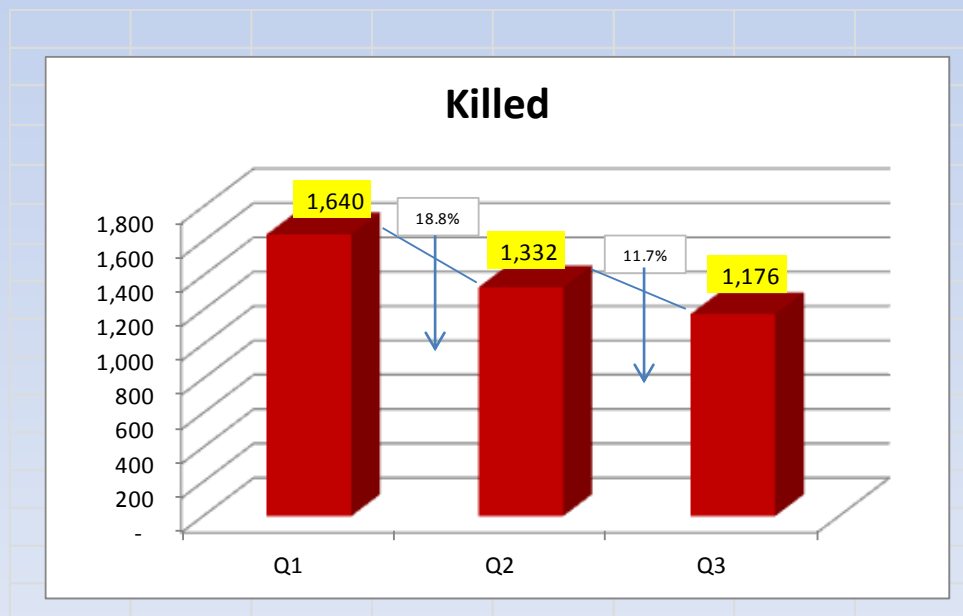




KILLED:Q1;Q2 & Q3 TREND ANALYSIS



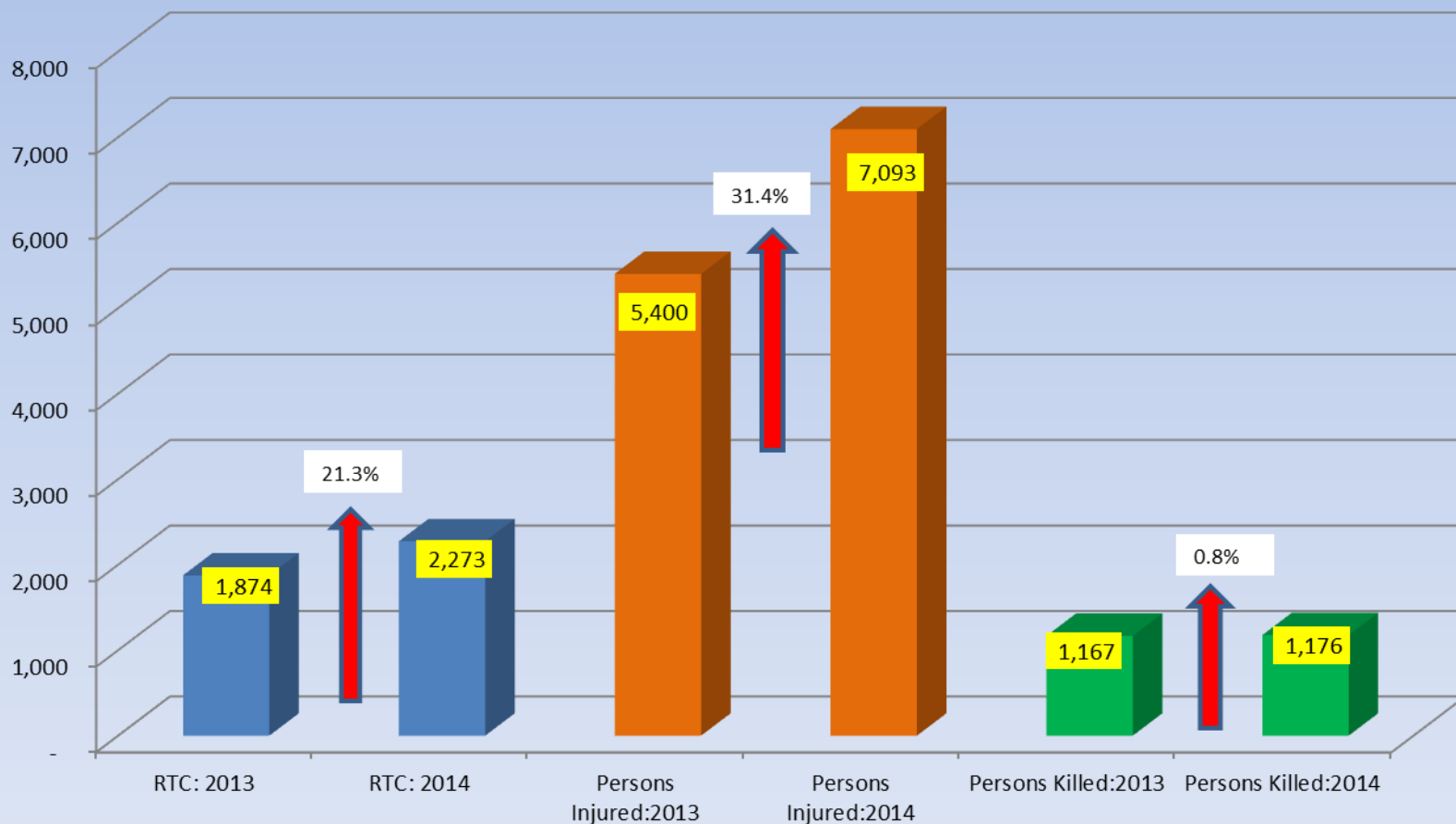

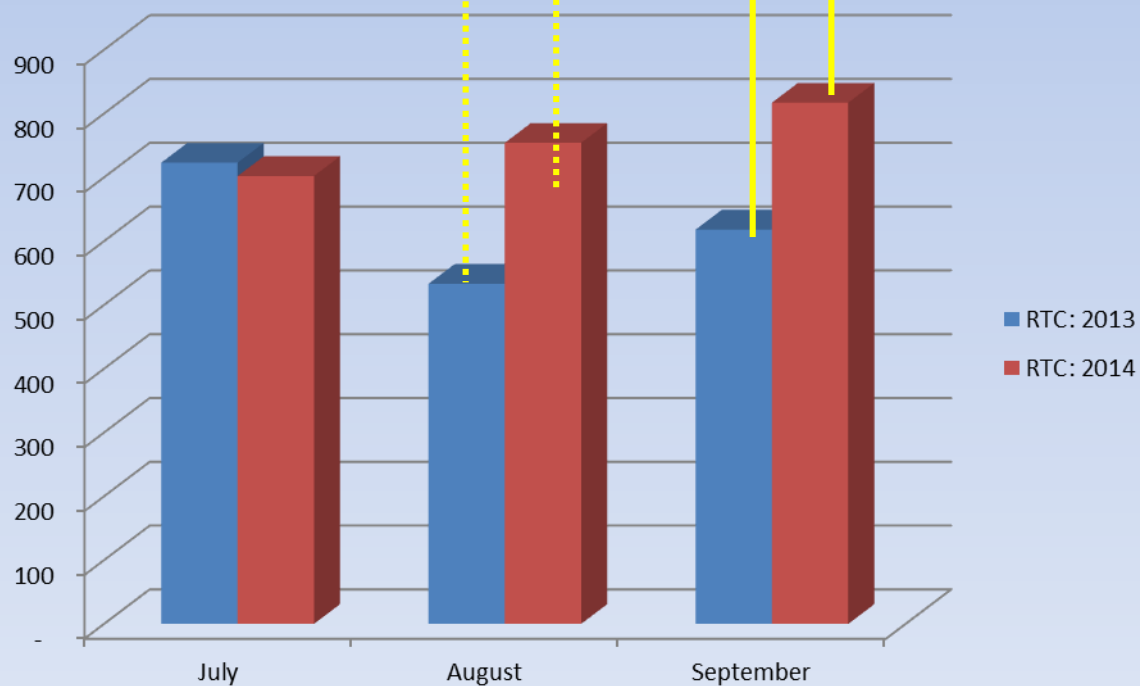

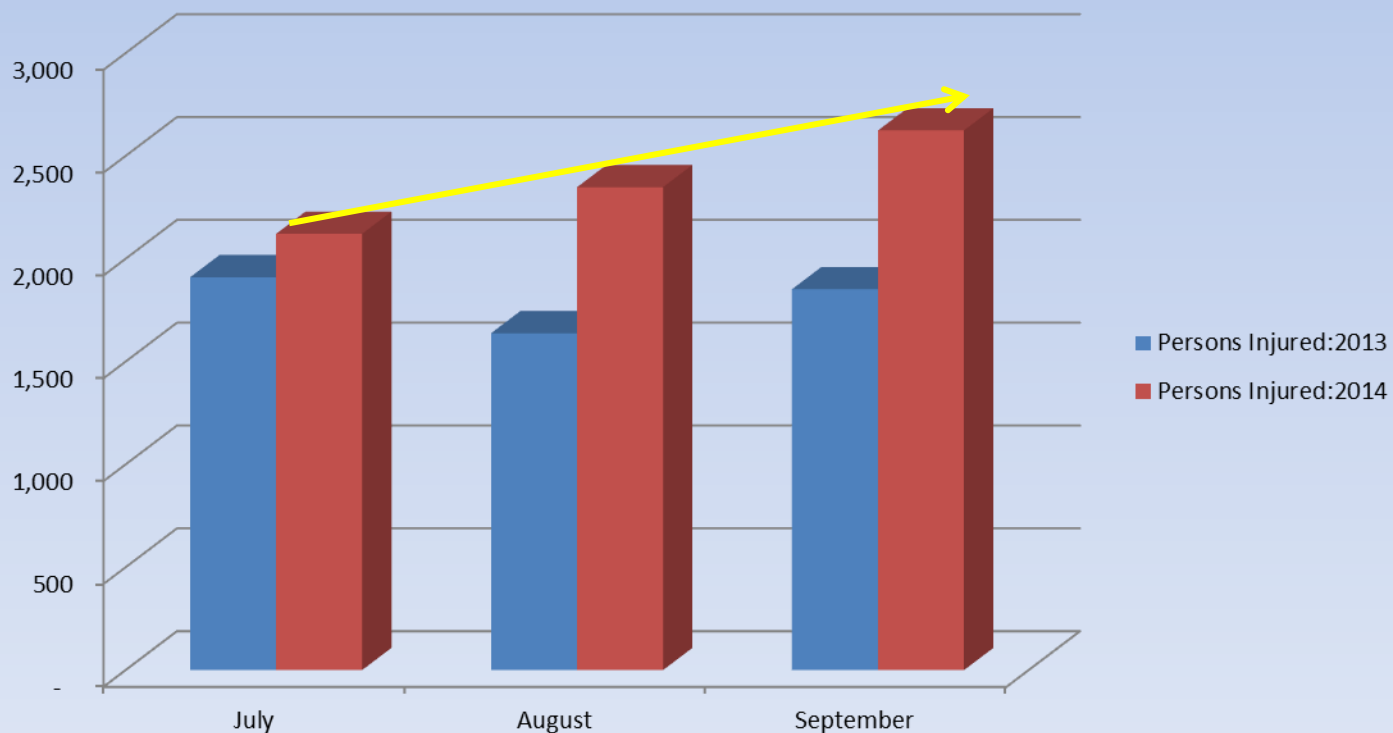

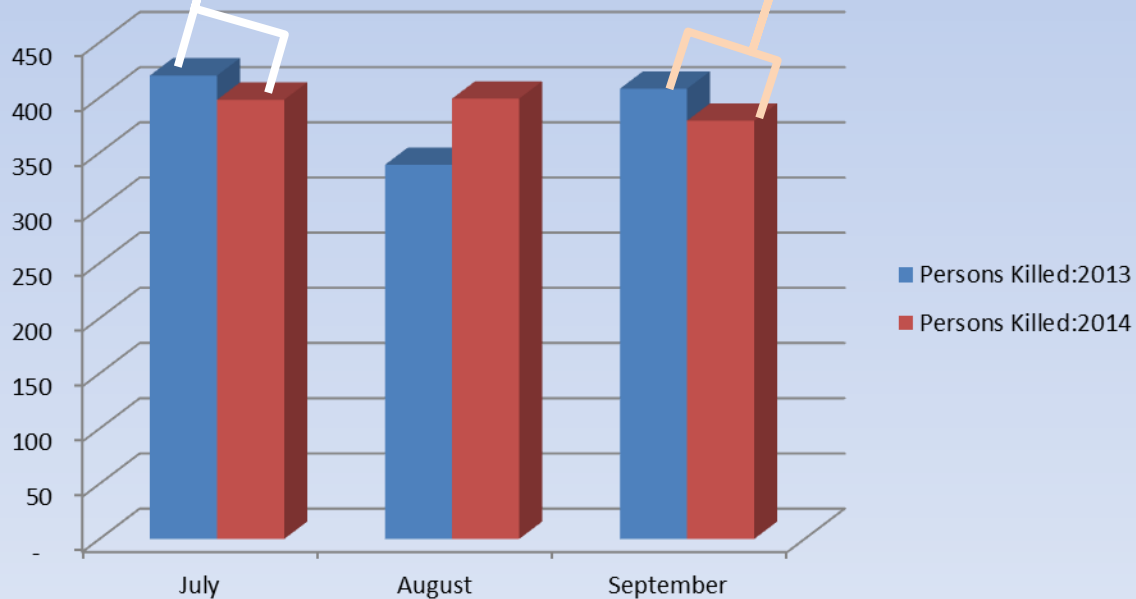

- 15% reduction of 2013 Crash Records amount to 11,546 Crashes by the end of 2014

2014 STRATEGIC GOAL

- 25% reduction of 2013 Fatality Records amount to 4,838 Fatalities by the end of 2014

THE CURRENT SITUATION: JANUARY-SEPTEMBER, 2014

ROAD TRAFFIC CRASHES	7,741	As at September 2014, data shows that 67.05% of set target in 2014 is attained.
PERSONS KILLED	4,430	As at September 2014, the figure has already accounted for 91.57% of set target in 2014



Task for the Fourth Quarter (Q4)

The Corps must intensify efforts on its operations and public enlightenment campaigns in the fourth quarter of 2014 to sustain the downward trend of RTCs and Number of Persons killed already recorded.



Recommendations

- The Corps should specially focus on Crash prone routes in FCT, Nasarawa and Bauchi States to stem the high fatalities and RTC occurrences identified.
- Specific road audits and research should be conducted to provide clear insight to unravel the root cause of crashes in the following States.
 - FCT
 - Nasarawa
 - Kaduna
 - Bauchi
 - Niger
- A special mobile patrol operations should be conducted on crash prone corridors in the country to check excesses of road users resulting in serious injuries which may eventually lead to death.



Recommendations (II)

- The Corps should increase mobile court sittings especially in the identified top ten States where RTCs, Injuries and Fatalities were high in the quarter under review.
- The Corps should restore “Roll of Shame” strategy to be applied to registered Fleet Operators and Freight Transporters who are on FRSC database to curtail driver behaviour and road use excesses among these group.
- The Corps to ensure that TV and Radio commercials on safe driving and proper road use are aired on both private and government electronic media at peak periods to educate the Nigerian populace on road safety.



Recommendations (III)

- The Corps should commence the implementation of the “Flying Ticket” initiative.
- The e-ticketing Apps should be made available to all Officers so as to be able to book any traffic offender at any point in time.
