The Fifth UN Global Road Safety Week acknowledges that strong leadership is needed to advance road safety in countries and communities and achieve related Sustainable Development Goals and other global targets. When the right to a safe journey is a priority, everybody wins!

Chart 1: Chart Illustrating War on Critical Offences

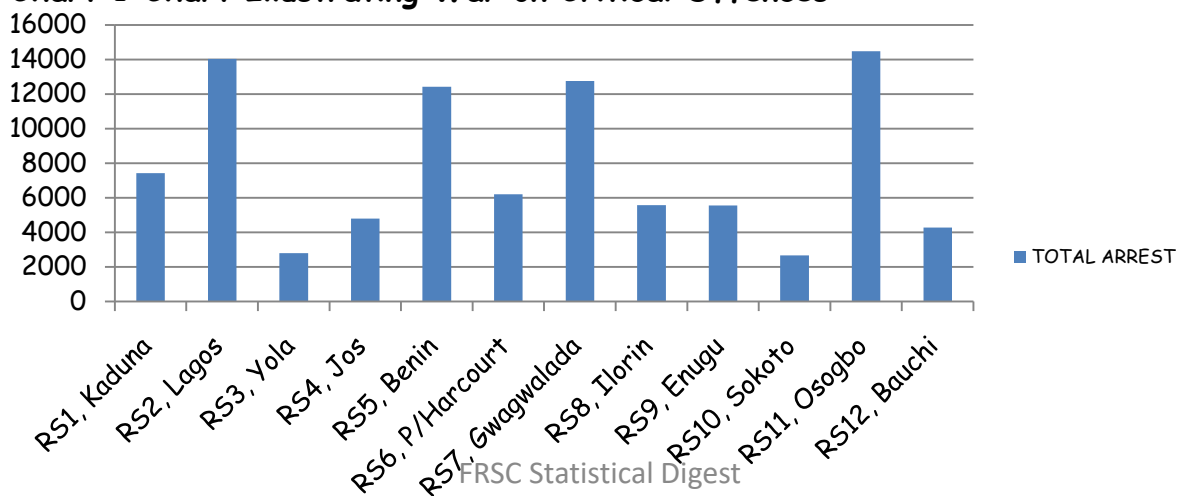
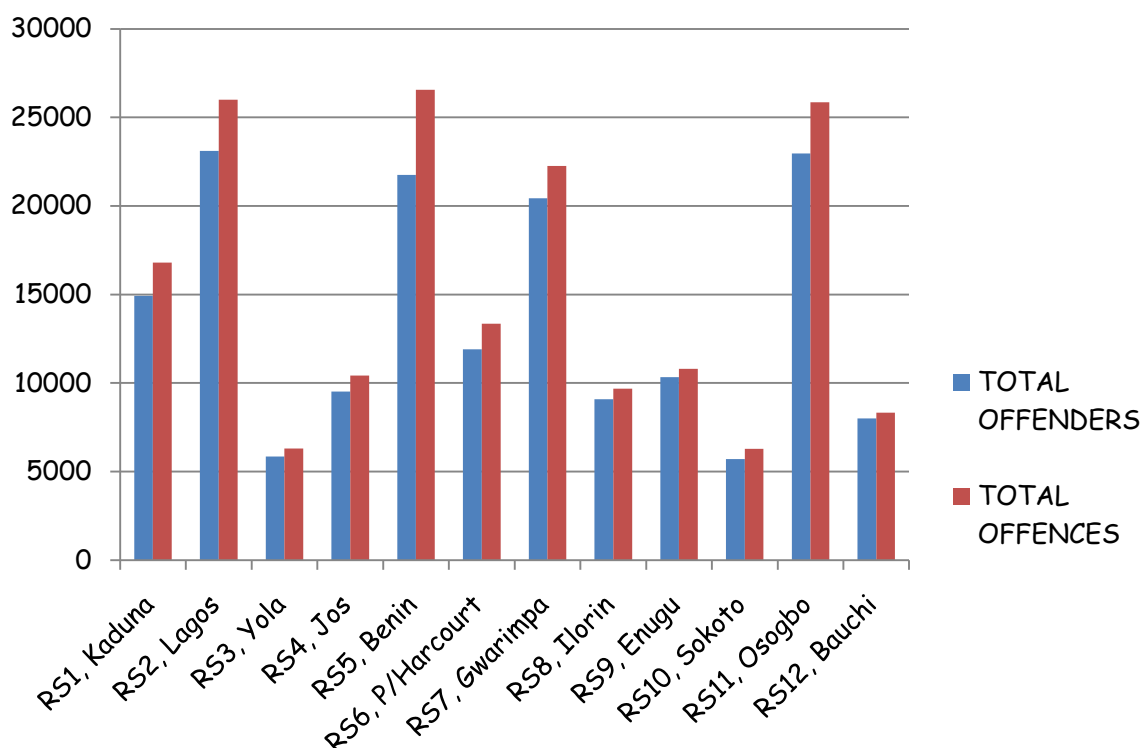

Chart 3: General Admin Activities

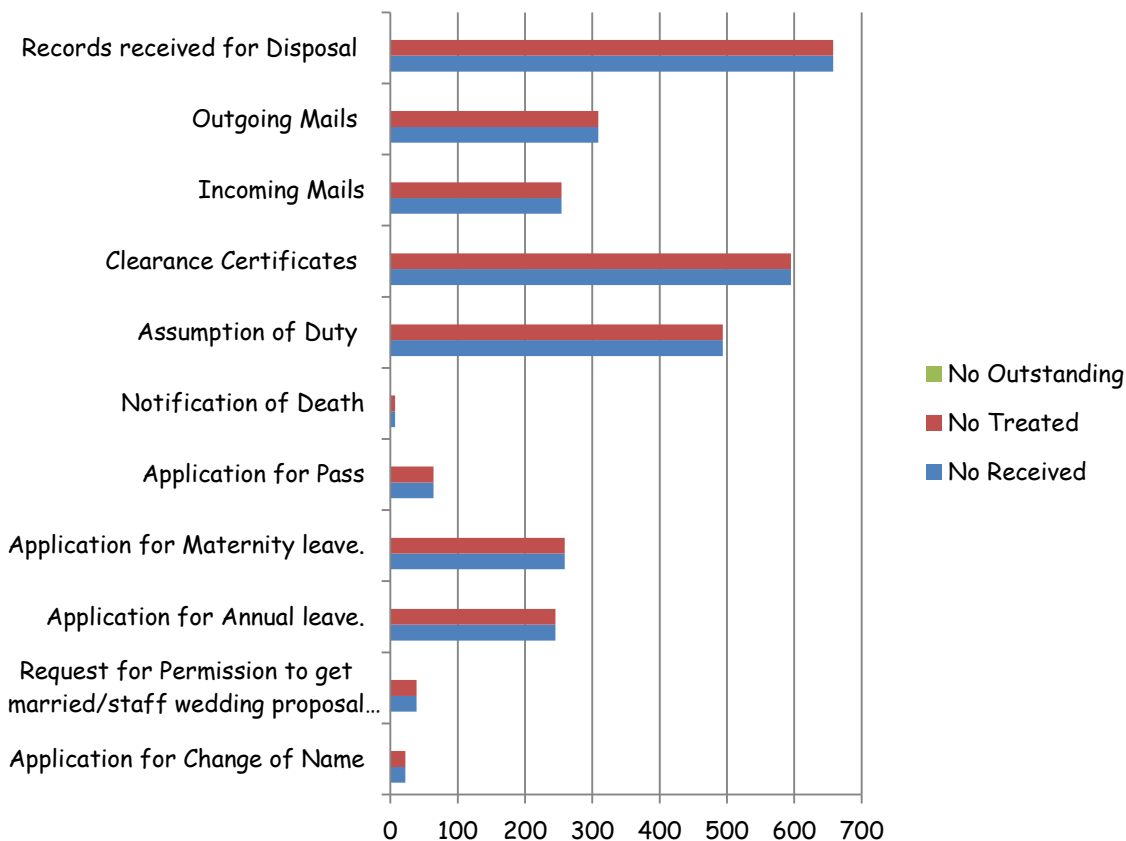
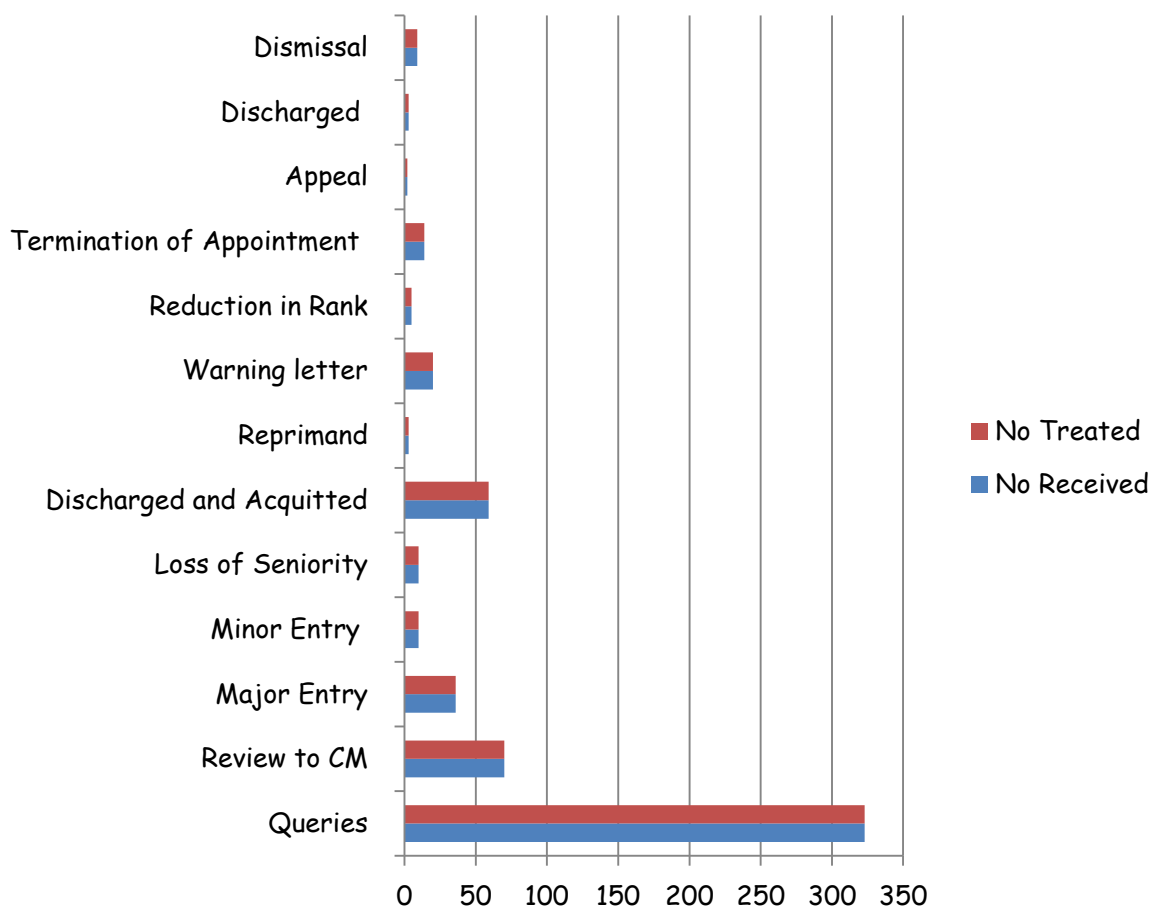

Chart 5: Chart Illustrating Requests For Variation Of Staff Salaries (Officers)

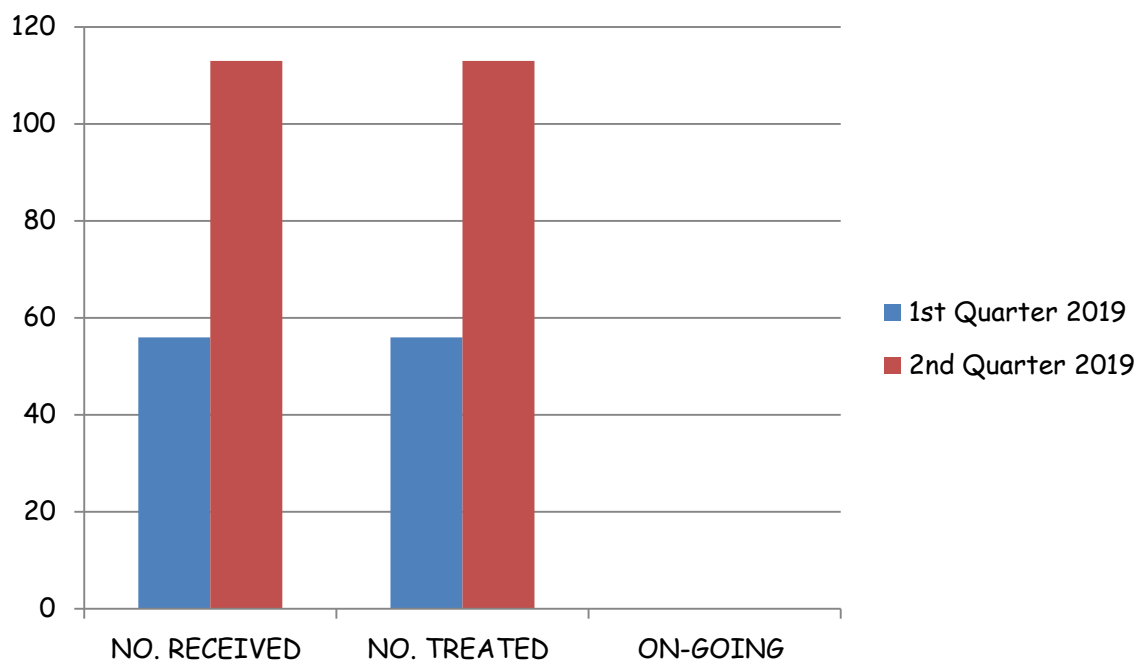

Chart 6: Incoming Requests For Variation Of Staff Salaries (Marshals)

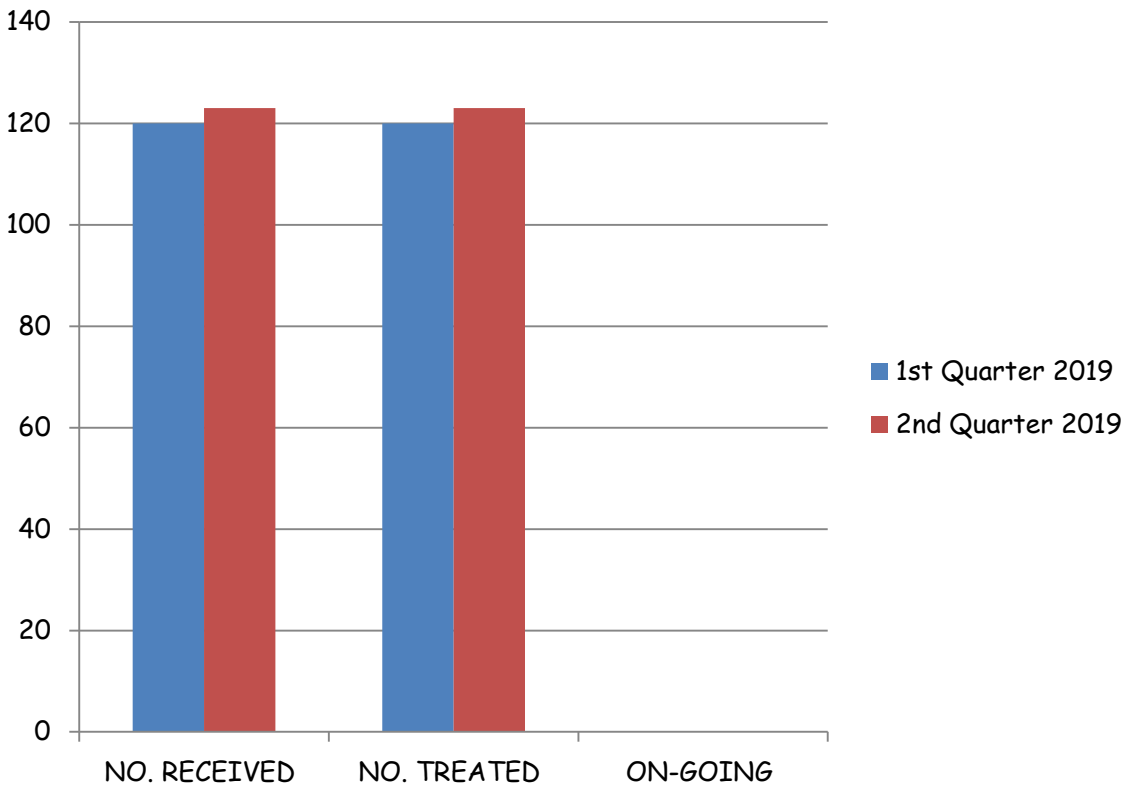
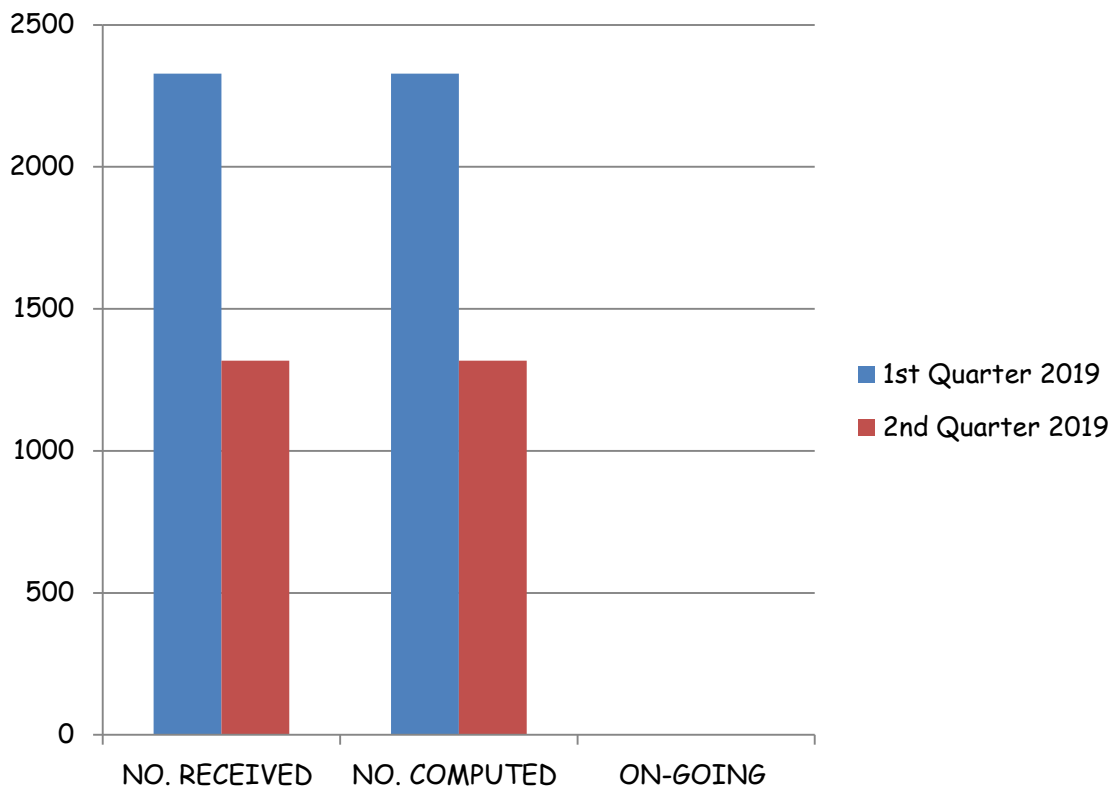

Chart 8: National Driver License production

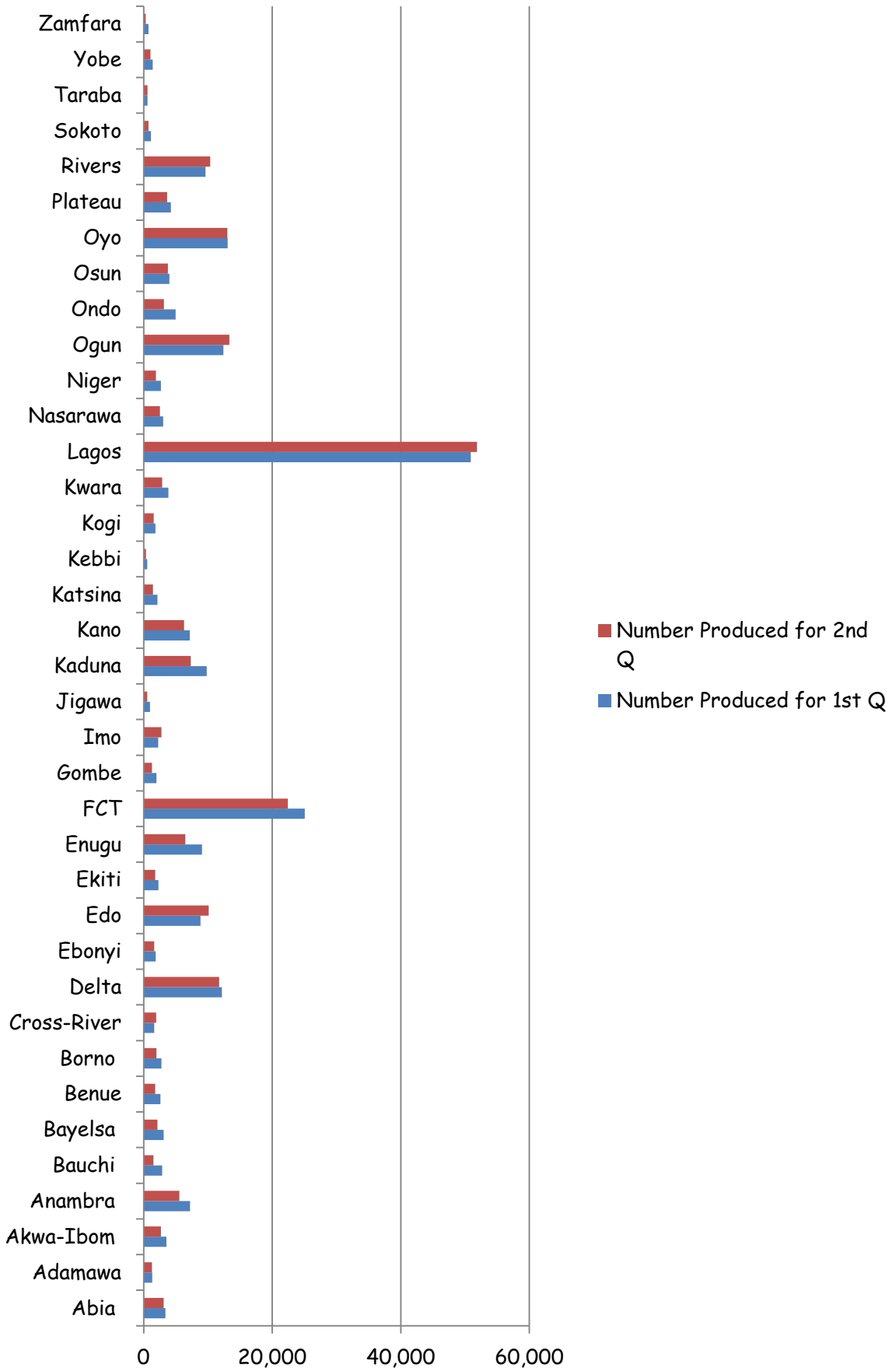




Chart 10: Showing Comparative Analysis of NDL production between 2nd Quarter 2018 and 2nd Quarter 2019

Chart 10: RTC Cases and Medical Cases Chart illustrating Summary of Patients Attended to

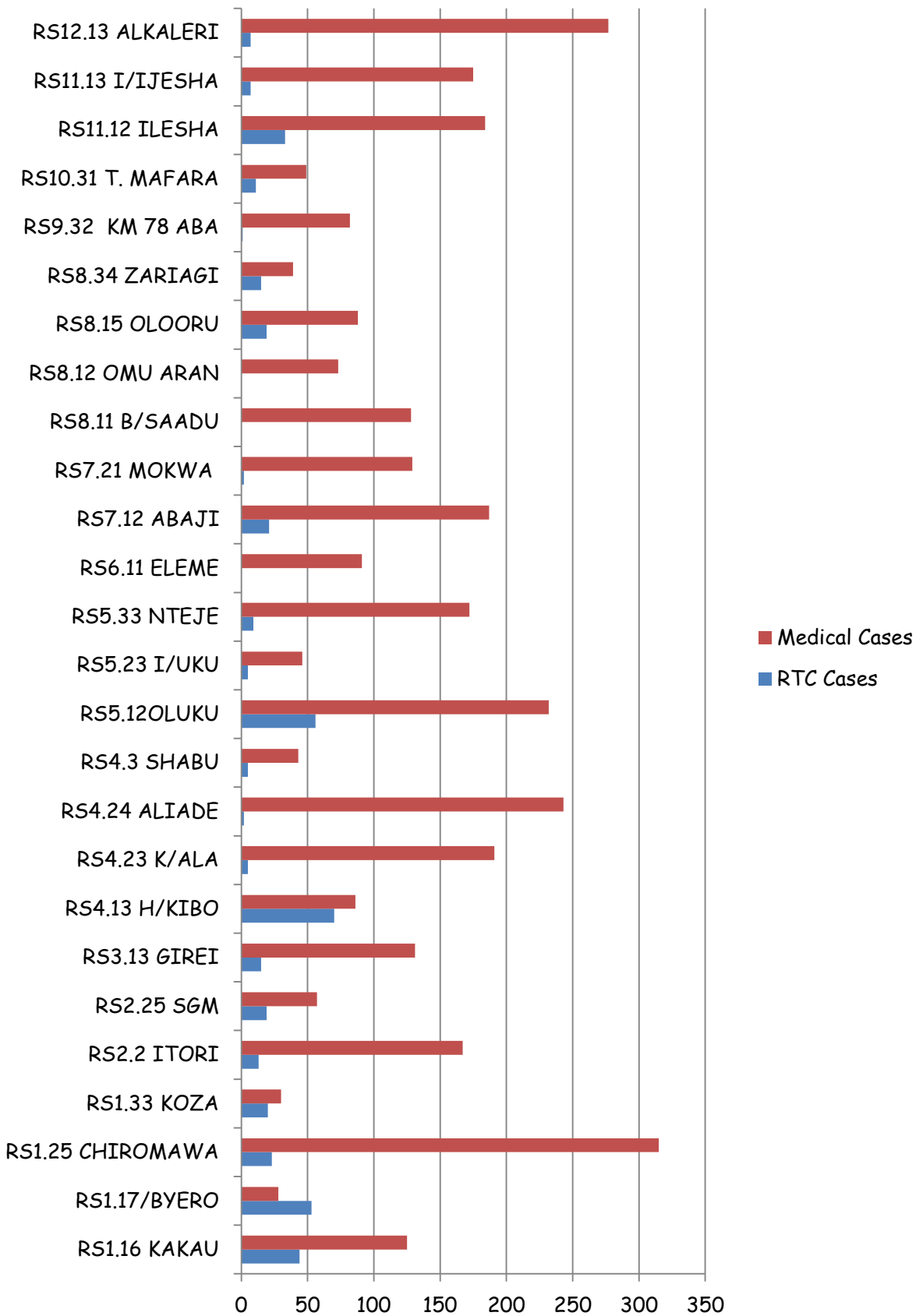

Chart 11: RTC Cases

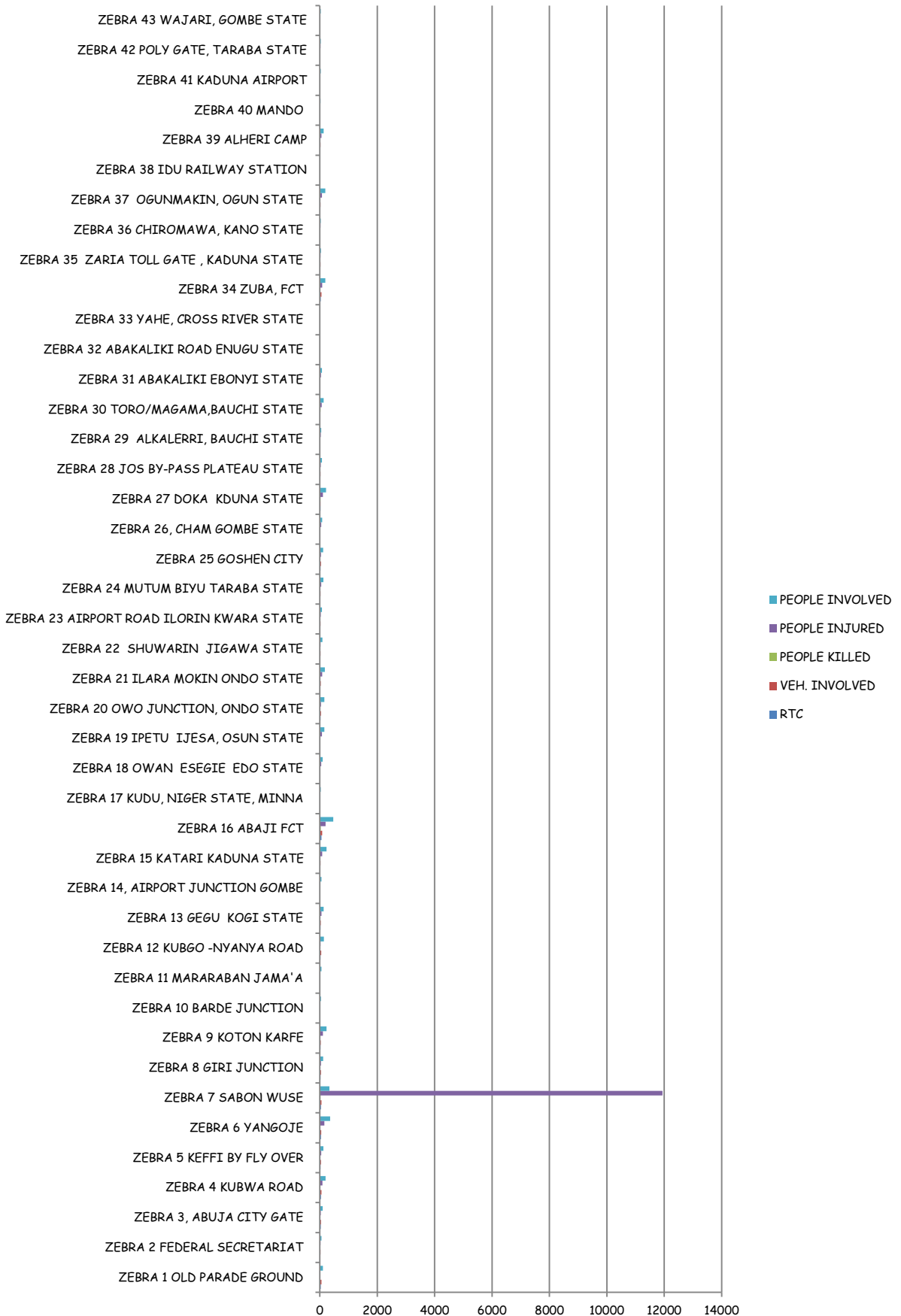

Chart 12: Illustration of Comparative analysis of Public Education Activities

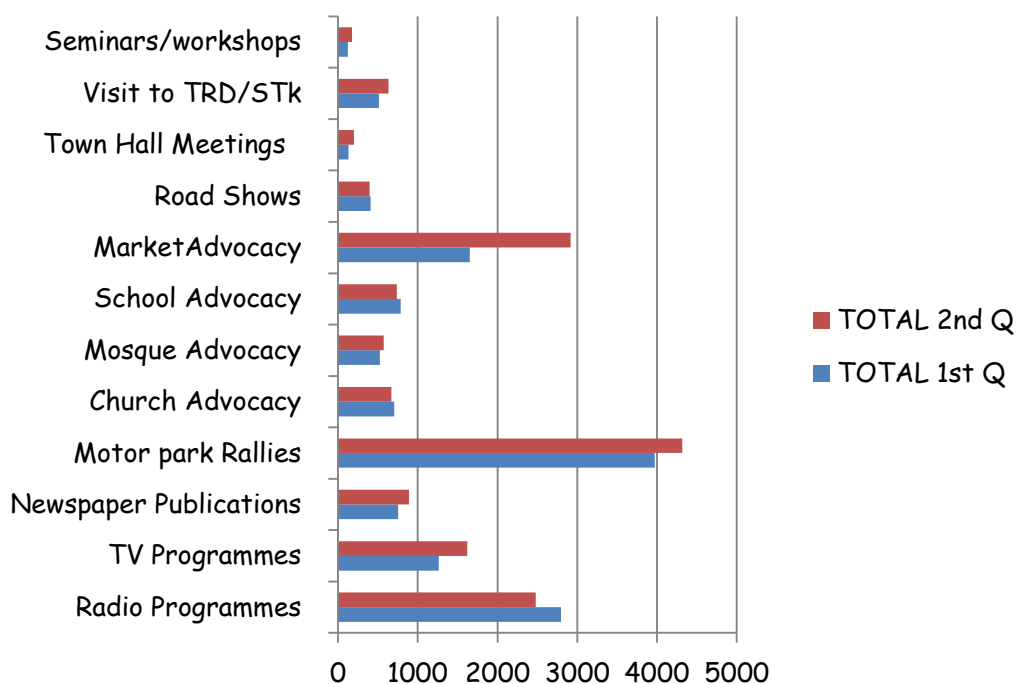

Chart 13: Summary Of RTC Involving Fleet Operators

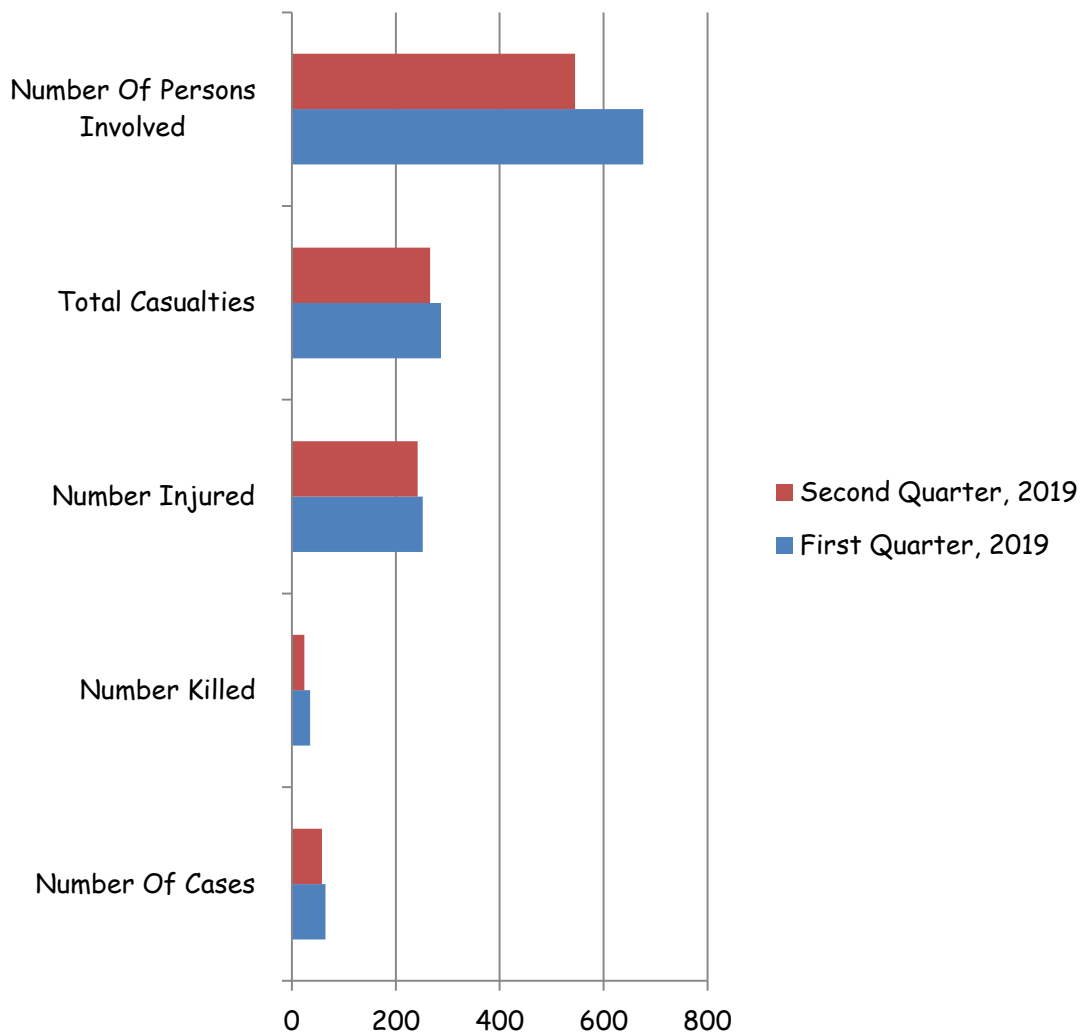

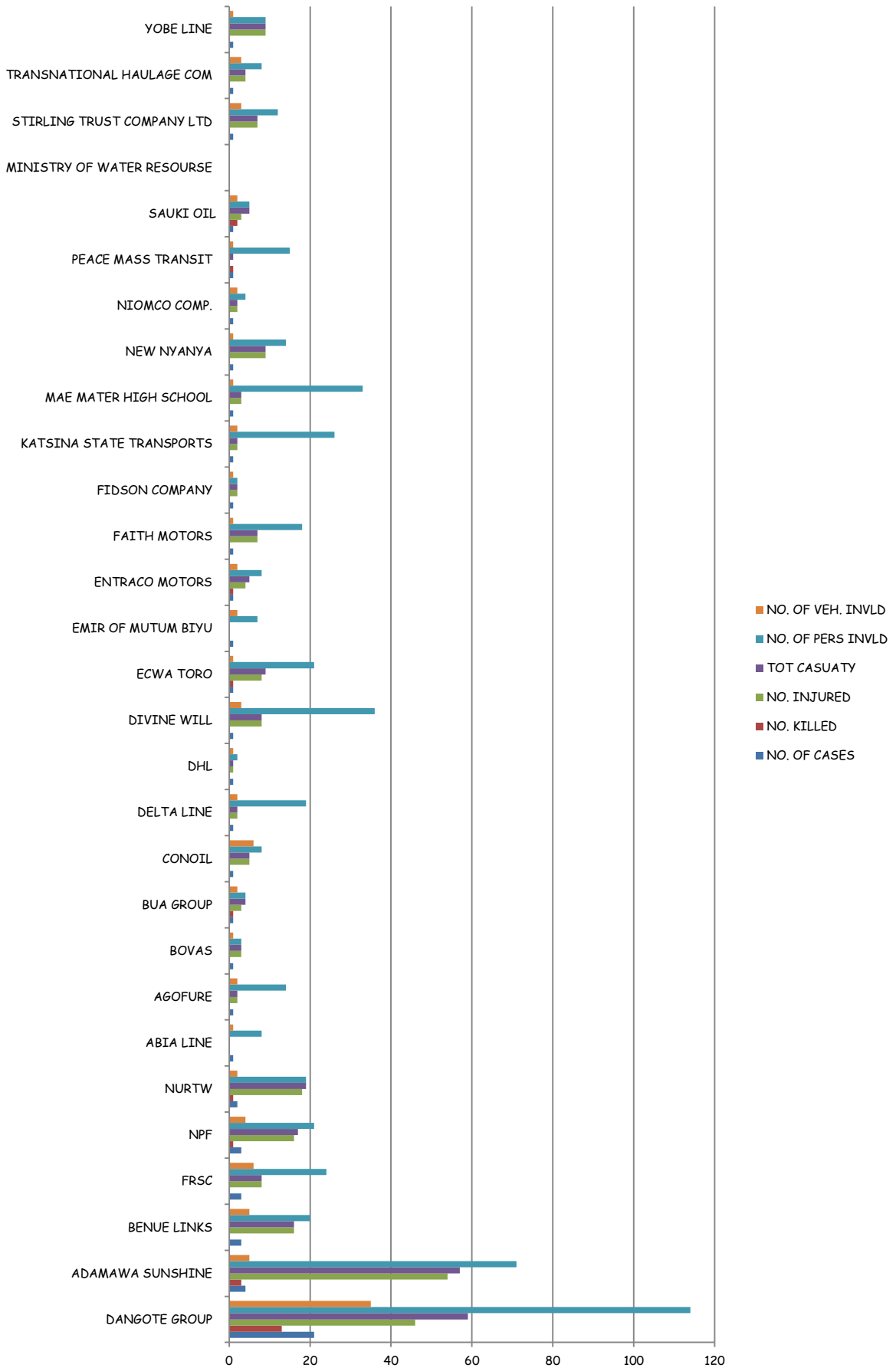

Chart 14: Summary Of RTC Involving Fleet Operators



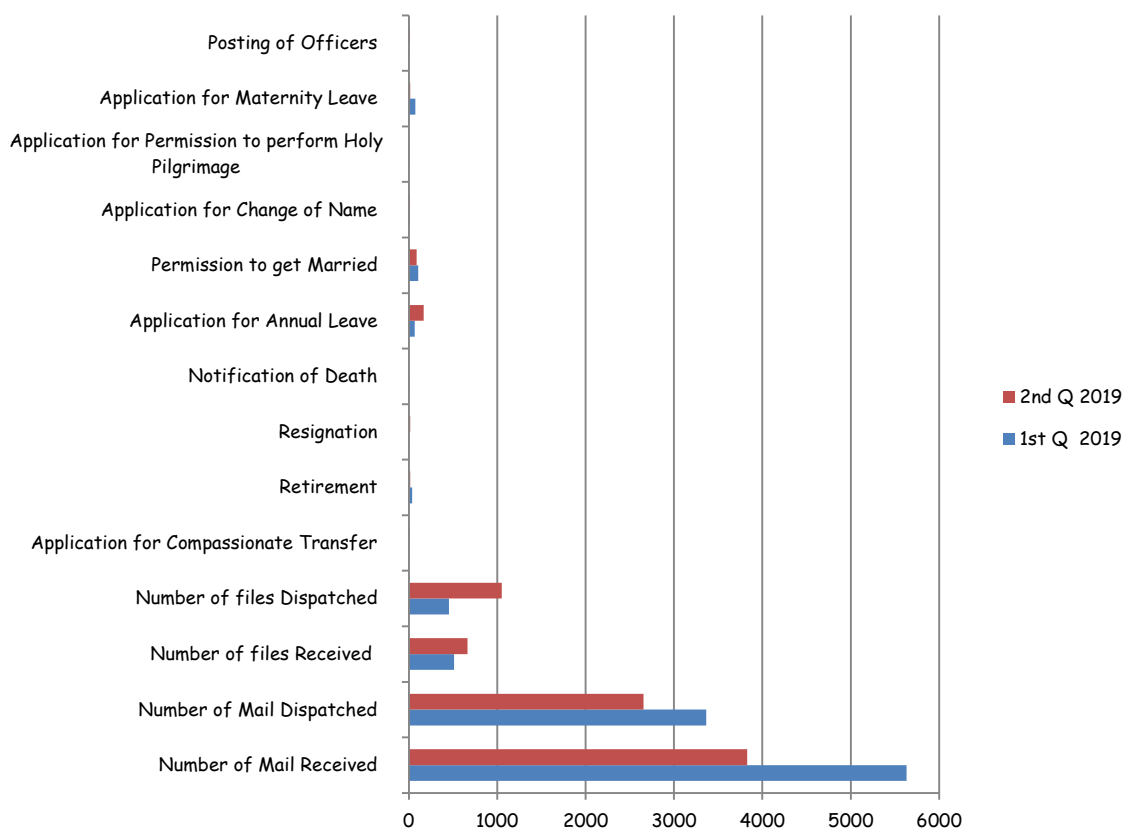

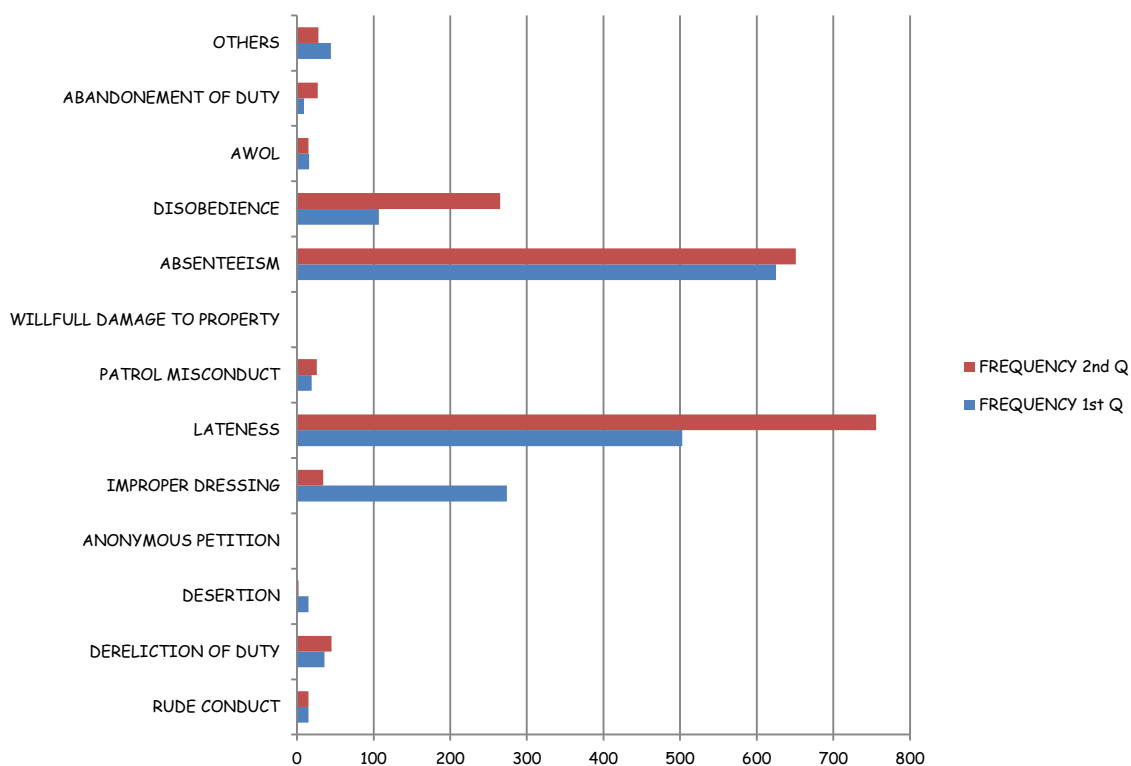
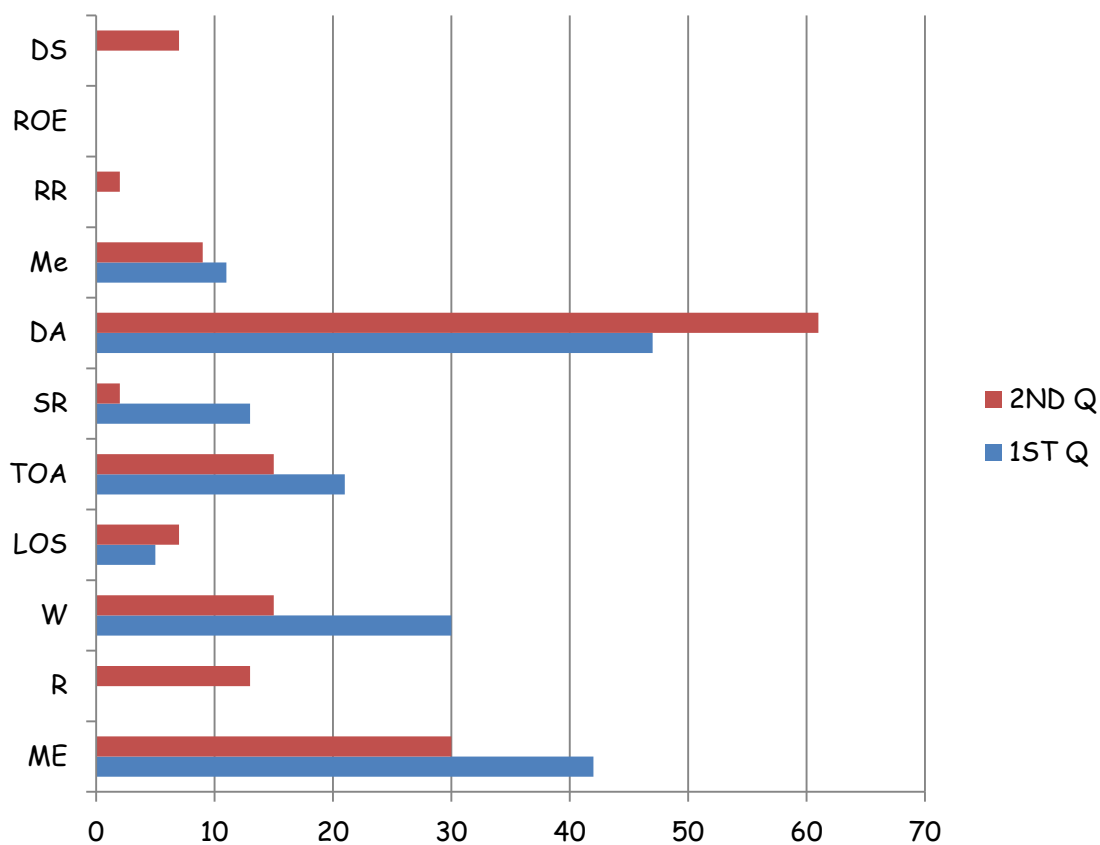

Chart 18: RTC Cases on State Basis

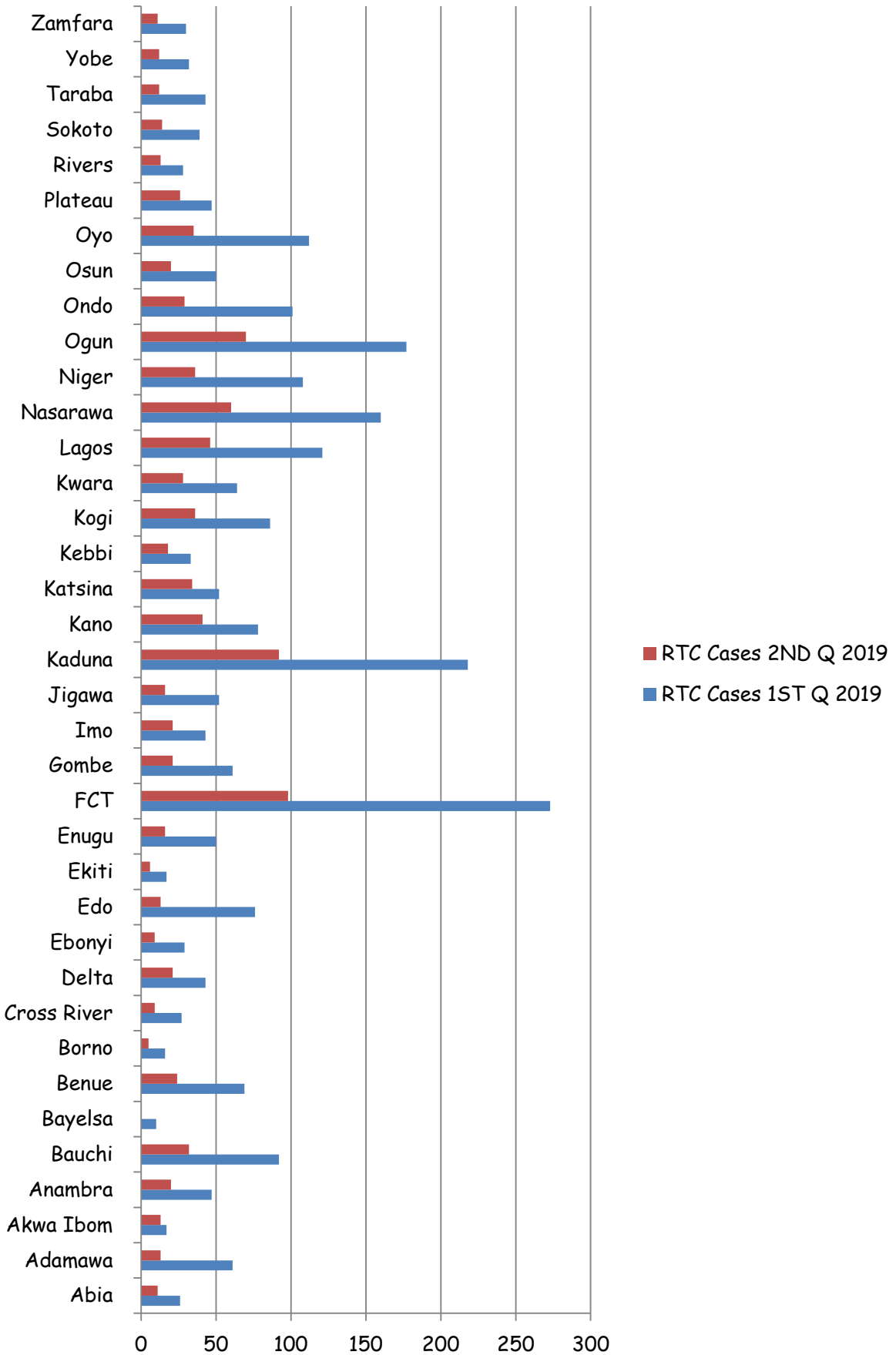

Chart 19: Number Injured

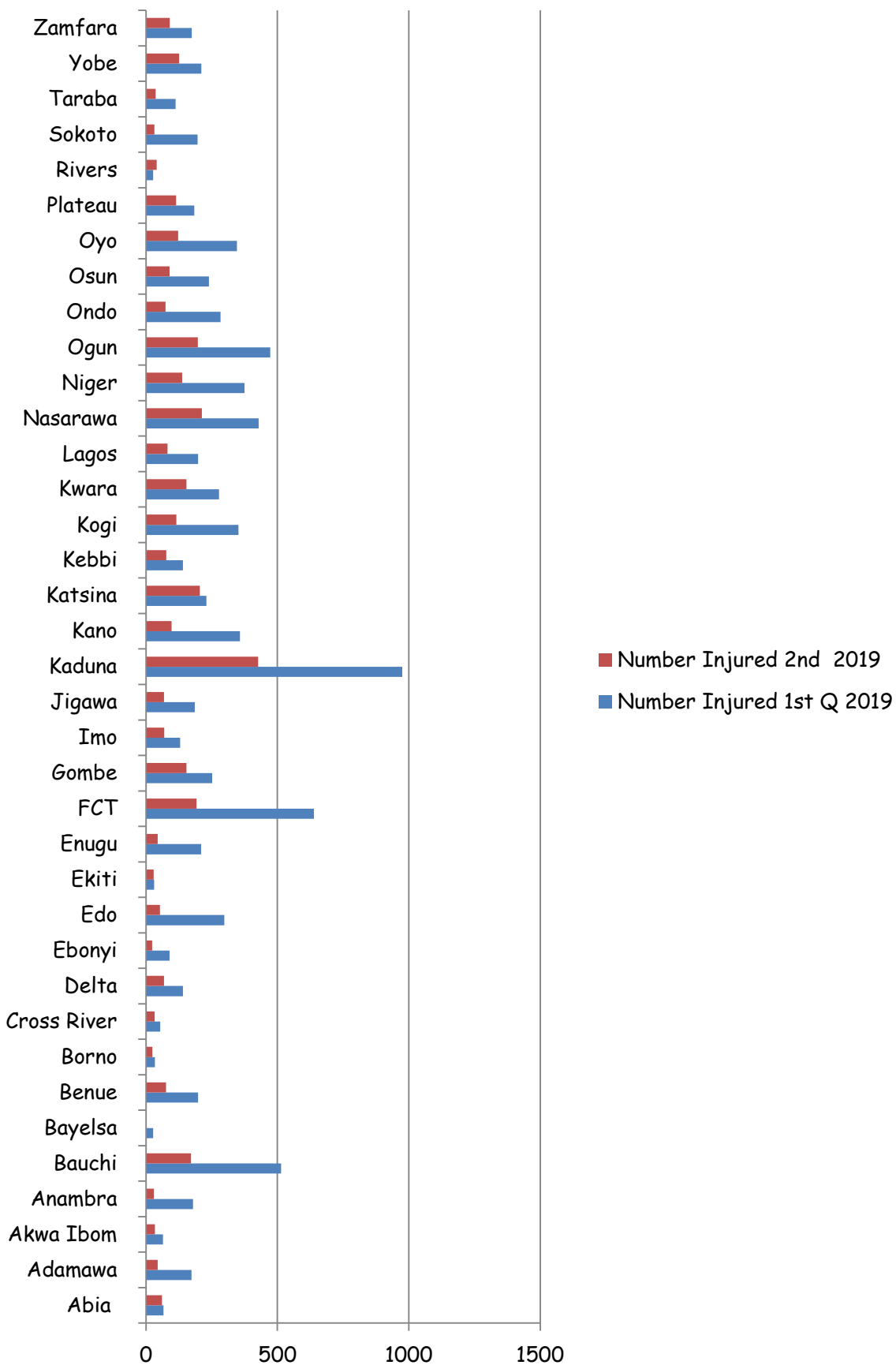

Chart 20: Number Killed on State Basis

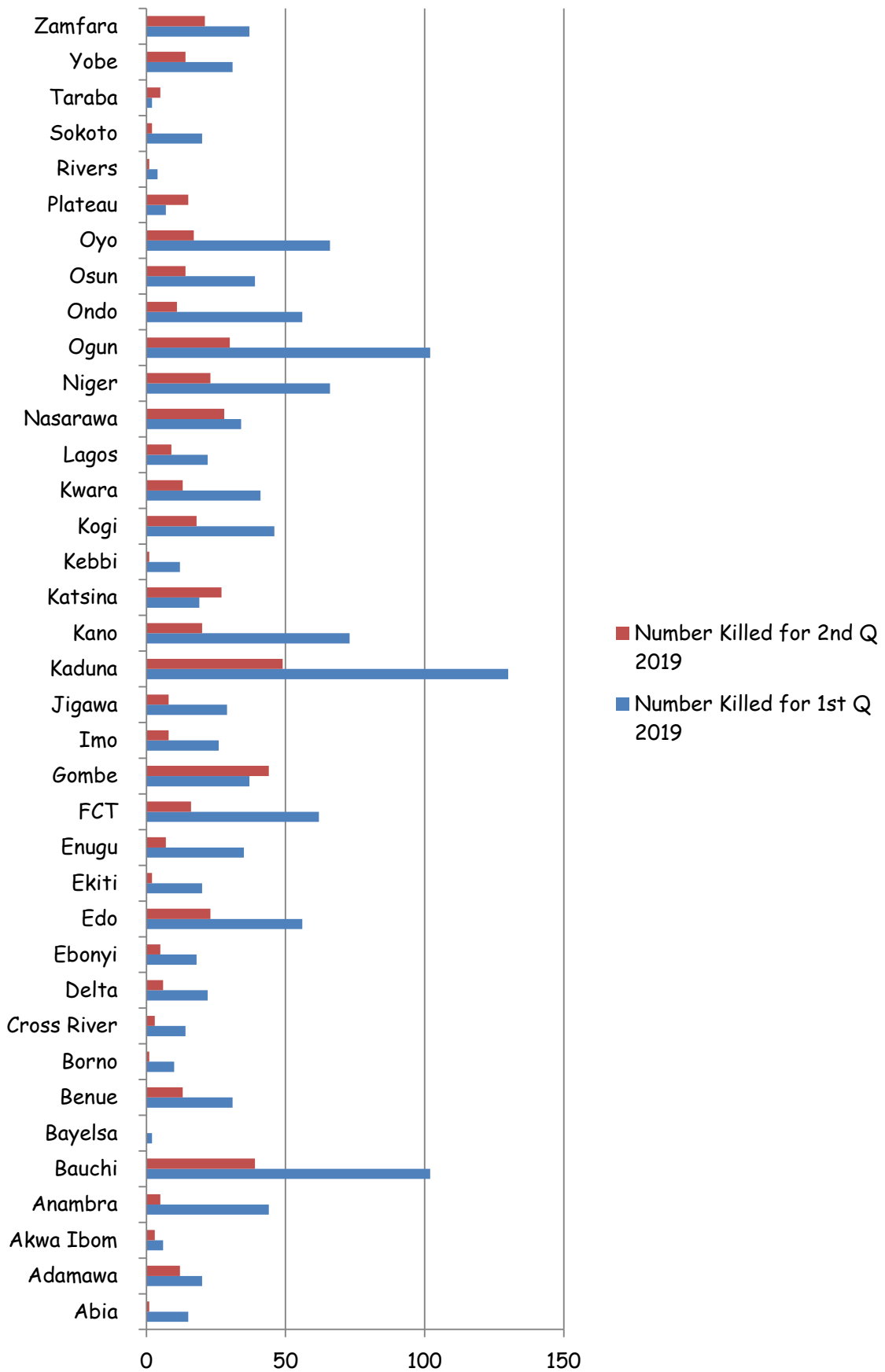

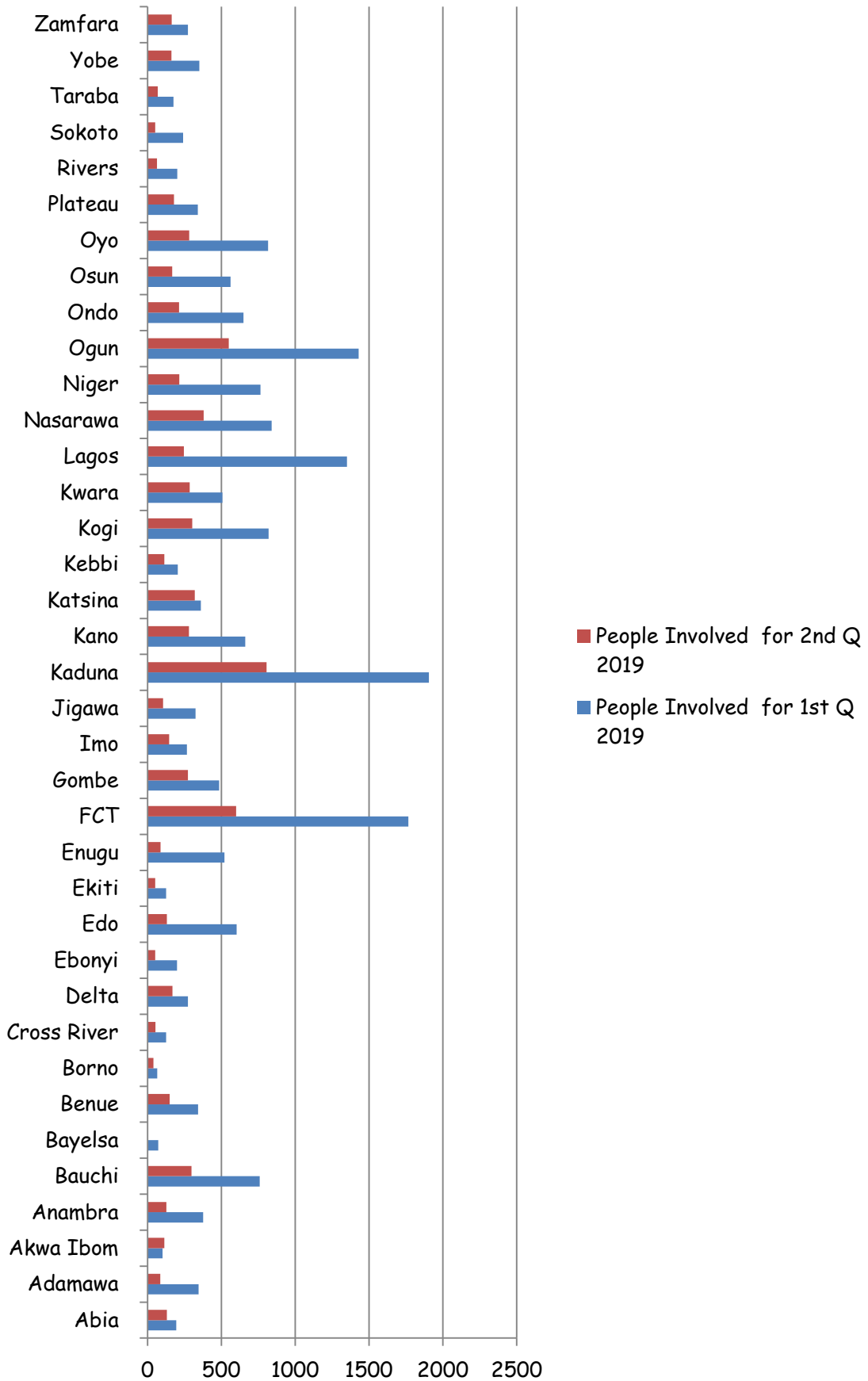

Chart 22: Partnership Analysis of Government Agencies and NGO

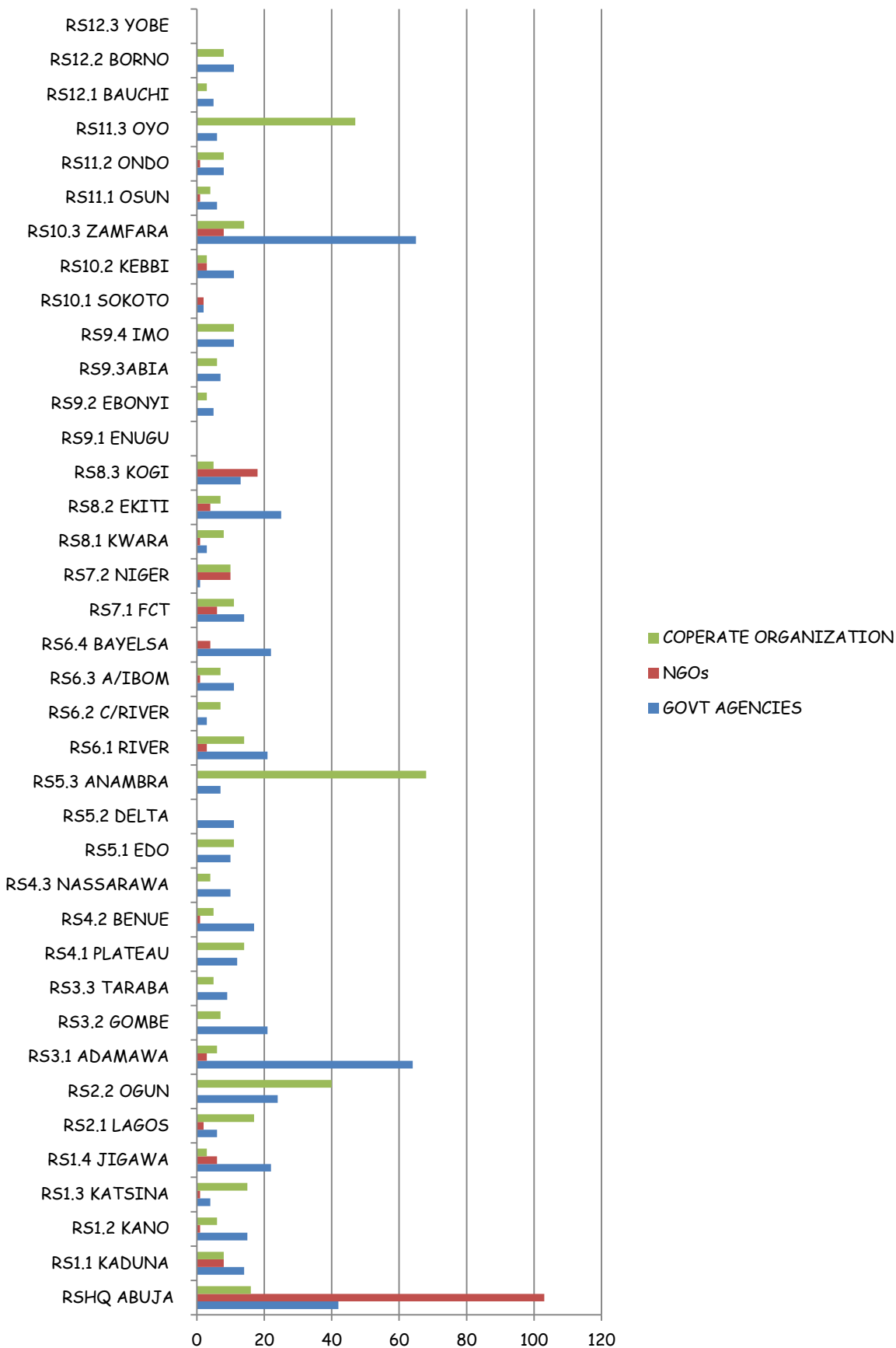

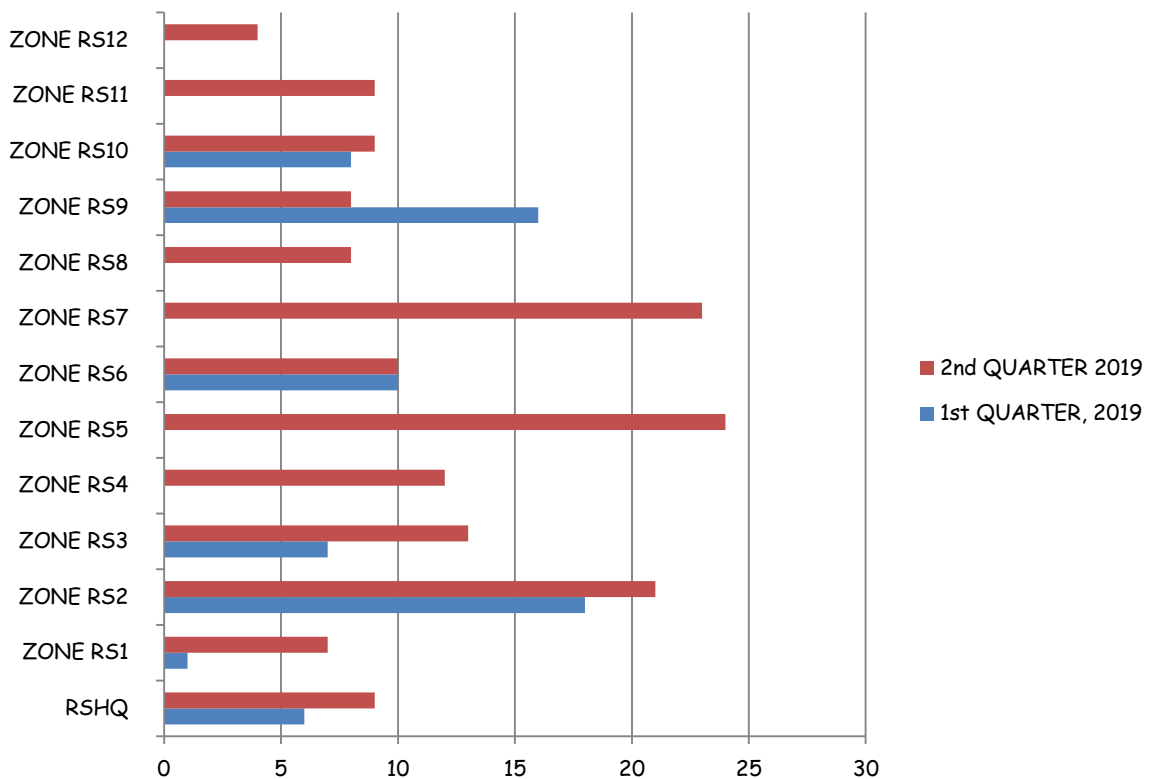

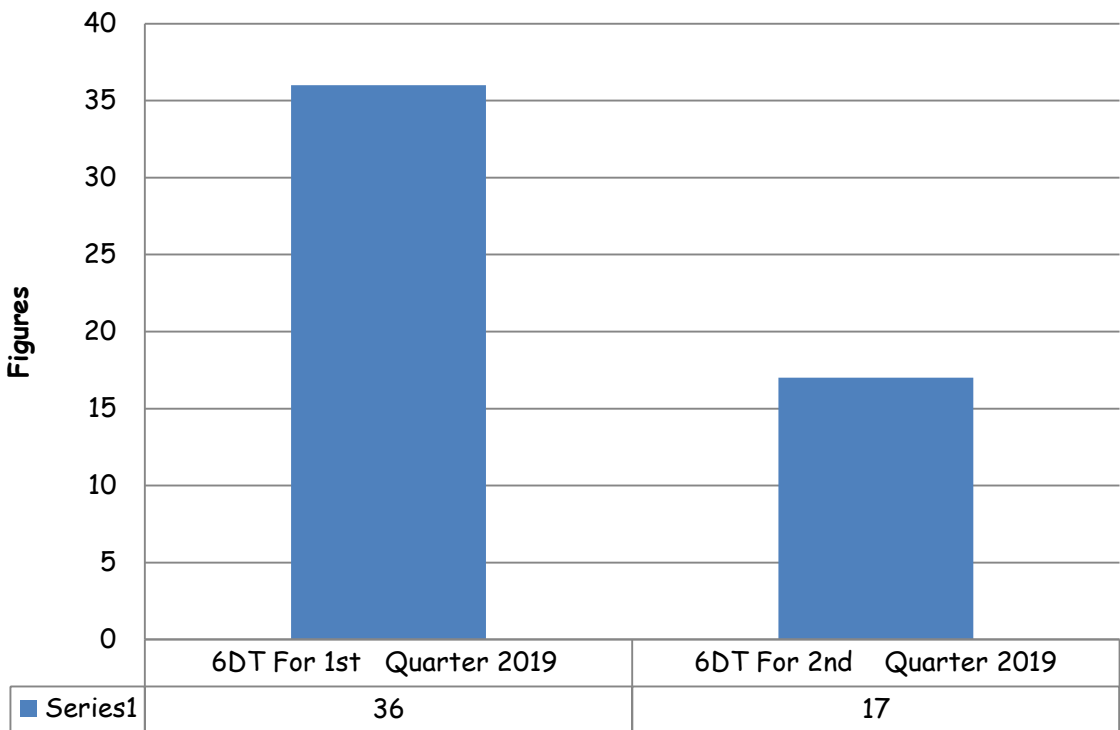
