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# *Partnering with communities to reduce RTC injury inequalities in Nigeria*

The Federal Road Safety Corps is responsible for implementing Nigeria's road safety plan and seeing that Nigeria achieves road casualty reduction targets.

Despite large and sustained casualty reductions over recent years in Nigeria, not everyone has benefited equally from road safety improvements. People from minority ethnic backgrounds and people living in deprived communities continue to be disproportionately affected by traffic injuries. Current road safety approaches may not be reaching these communities. It is urgent to devise targeted and tailored interventions to reduce road traffic casualties in those areas.

The current FRSC programme, National Community Post Crash Care Initiative (NCPCCI) therefore aims to support road safety professionals in their work to reduce road traffic injury inequalities in Nigeria. It builds upon a considerable body of evidence of good practice in public health and other sectors, which demonstrates that community-based work is often necessary to reach and engage people who do not access mainstream services. It also integrates lessons from, and complements, the work carried out as part of the National Community Post Crash Care Initiative (NCPCCI) to reduce road traffic casualty rates in deprived areas. The NCPCCI main focus was "to develop a holistic approach to road safety in disadvantaged areas by encouraging partnership working to undertake complementary programmes of work that would directly or indirectly improve the safety of all road users in the community". The NCPCCI can therefore be "regarded as a regeneration initiative with a strong road safety component. The current FRSC programme focuses less explicitly on area regeneration, and more directly on working with specific minority ethnic and deprived communities that may be especially hard-to-reach, in order to reduce road traffic injury inequalities.

The focus on communities requires that road safety professionals develop the necessary skills to support this new way of working. Indeed, recent research found that while enthusiasm and commitment are high amongst road safety practitioners, the resources and skills necessary to develop community-based interventions based on multi-agency partnerships are often lacking. The FRSC therefore undertook to fund a number of demonstration projects and to provide them with opportunities to develop their skills and expertise in working with communities. The demonstration projects were supported by new Guidelines on Working with Communities to Reduce Road Traffic Injury Inequalities in Nigeria, and by a dedicated Community Development Specialist who offered one-to-one help and advice to individual projects. They were also evaluated by an independent agency to ensure that road safety professionals received ongoing feedback on their activities throughout the life of the projects, that their activities and experiences were systematically documented, and that the wider road safety community in Nigeria will be able to learn from their experiences.

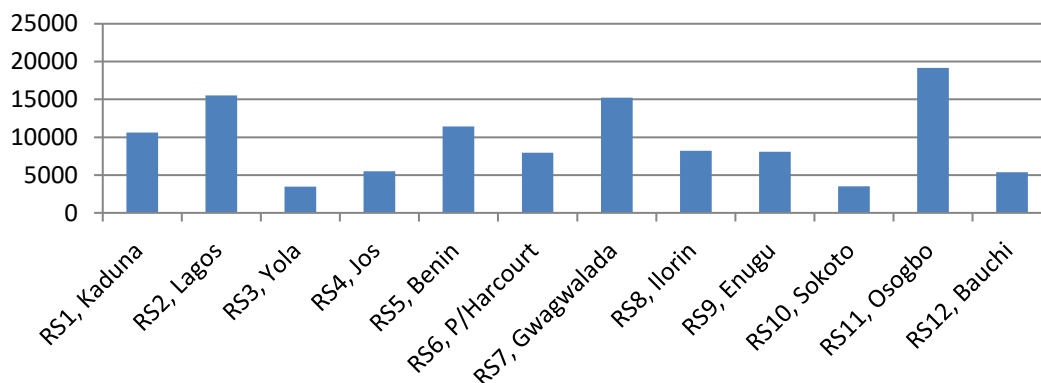

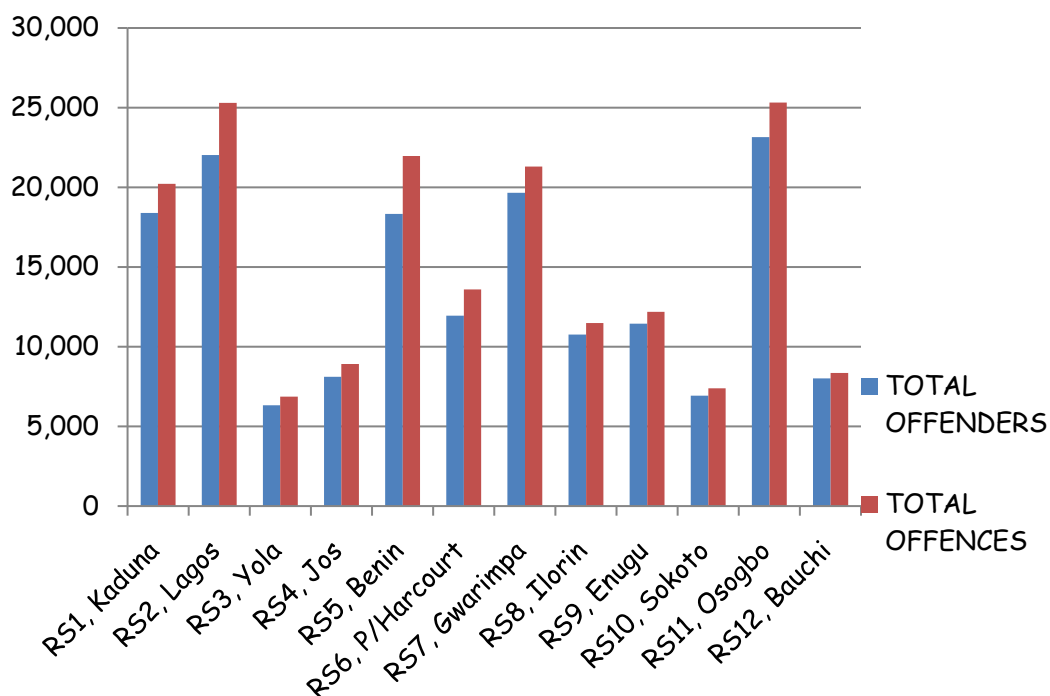
**Chart 1:Chart Illustrating War on Critical Offences**

**Chart 2: Chart Illustrating Offenders/Offences**



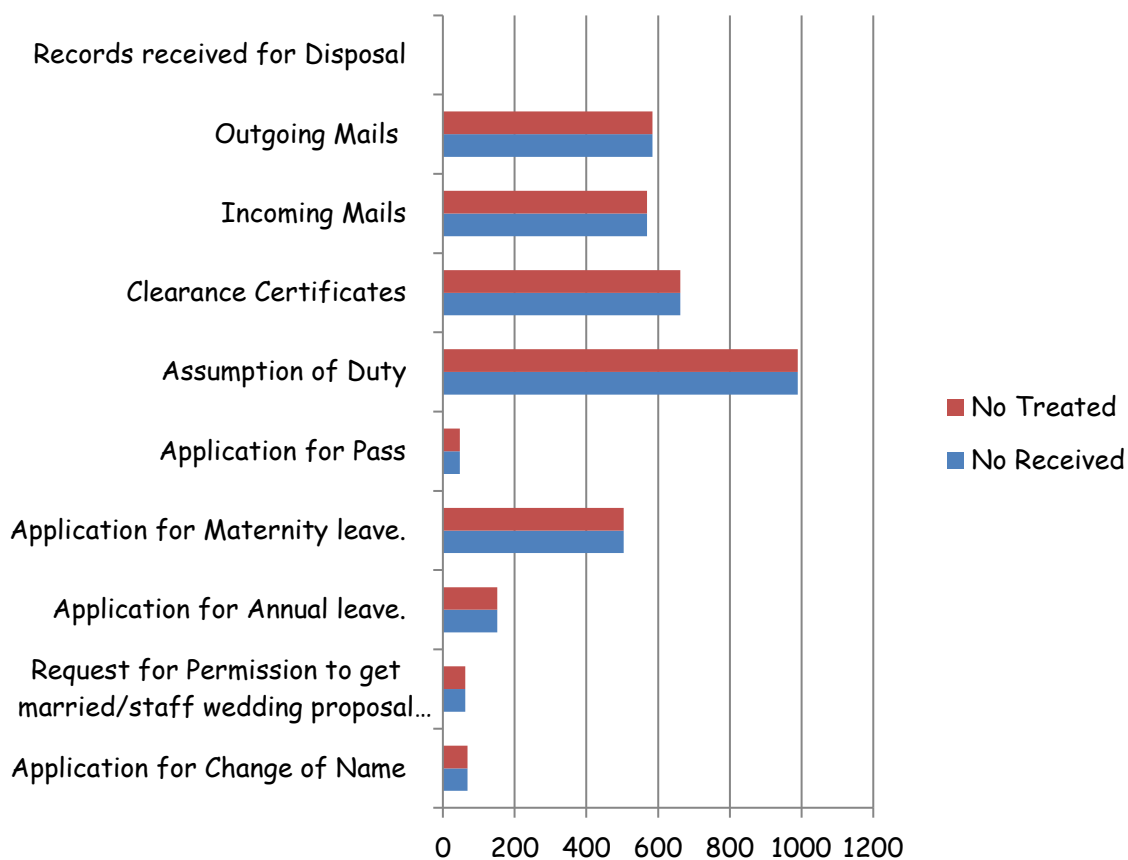

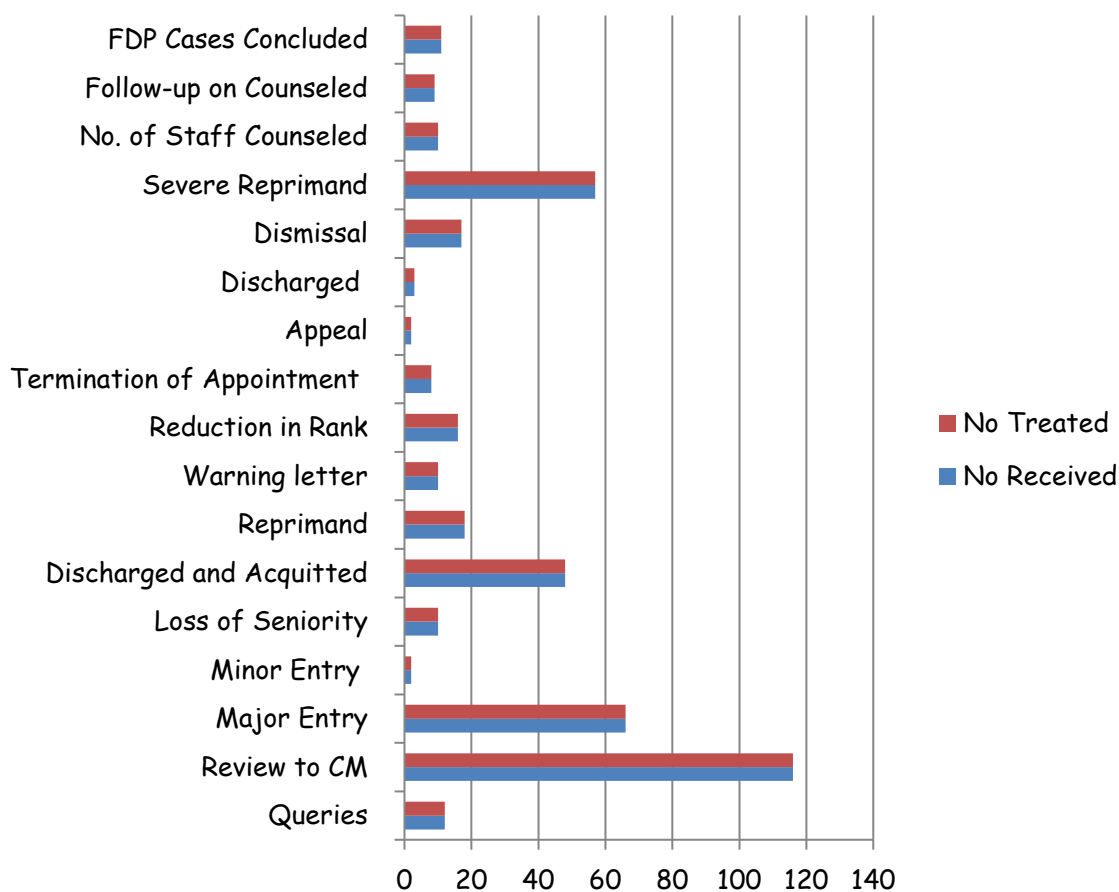

**Chart 4: Chart Illustrating Disciplinary Cases Treated**

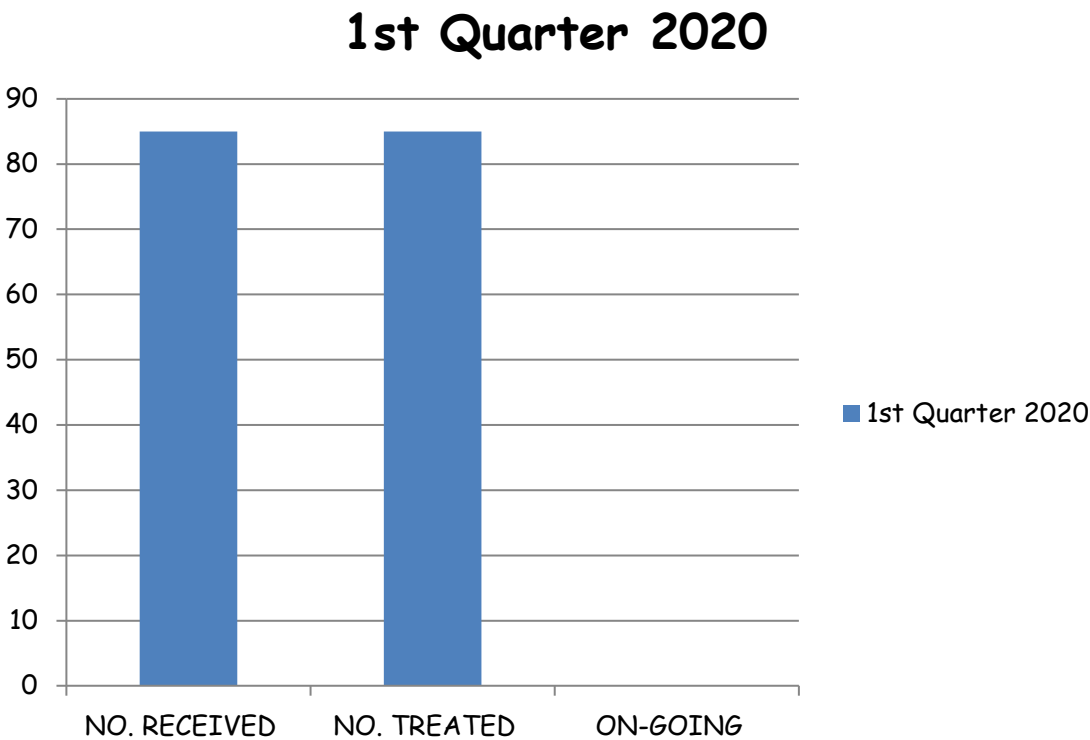

**Chart 5:** Chart Illustrating Requests For Variation Of Staff Salaries (Officers)

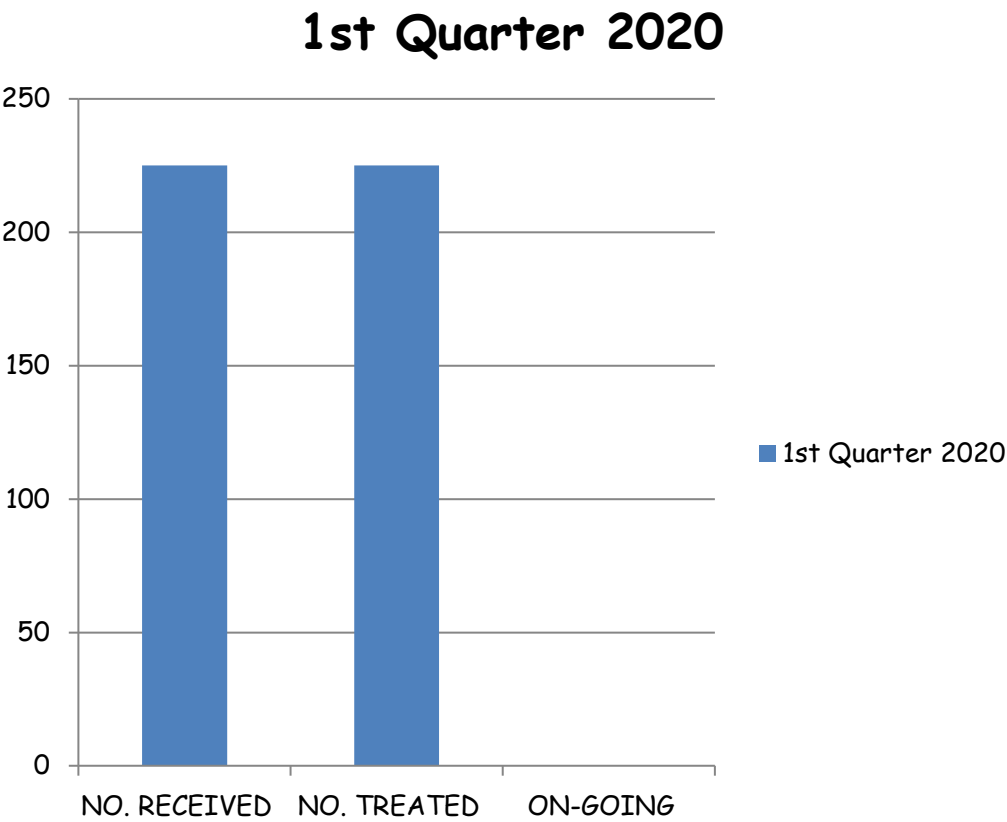

**Chart 6:** Incoming Requests For Variation Of Staff Salaries (Marshals)

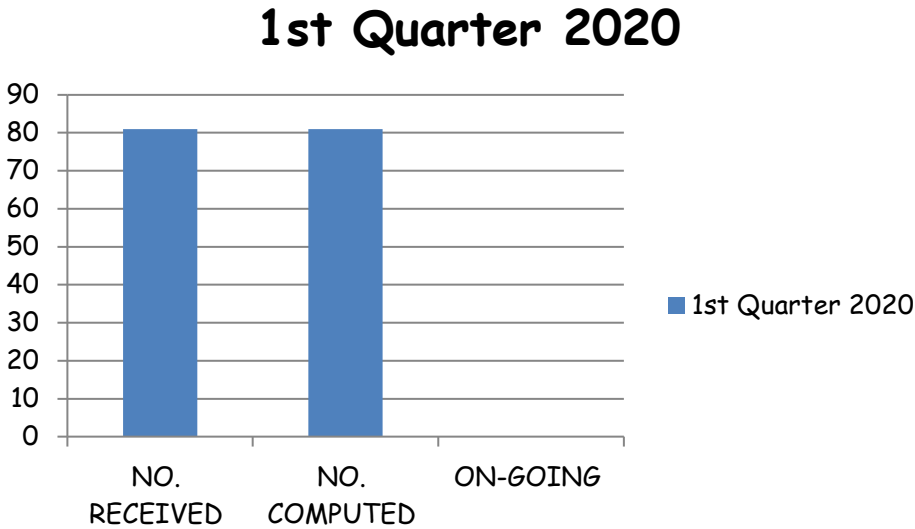

**Chart 7:** Summary of Transfer Allowances Activities





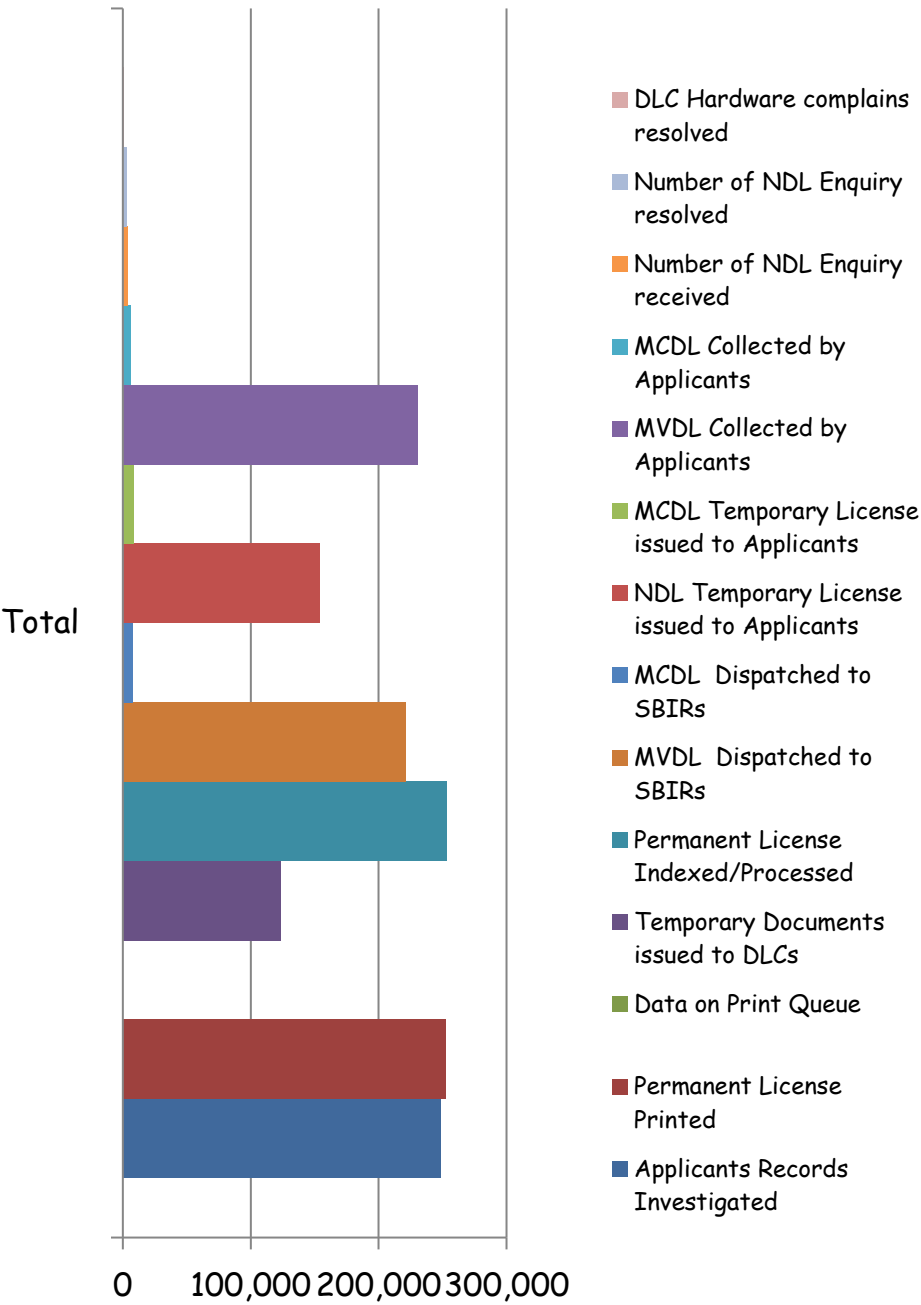

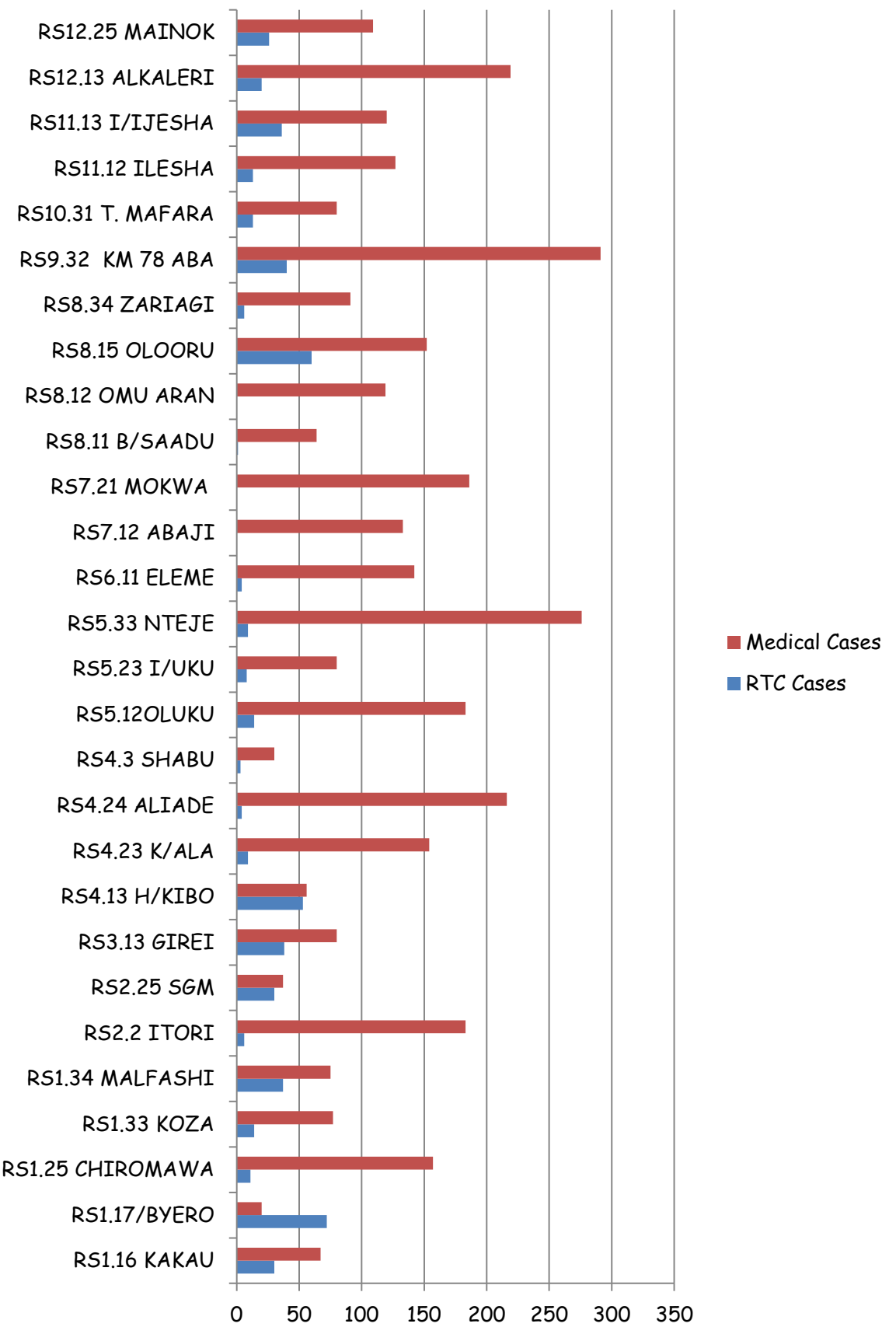

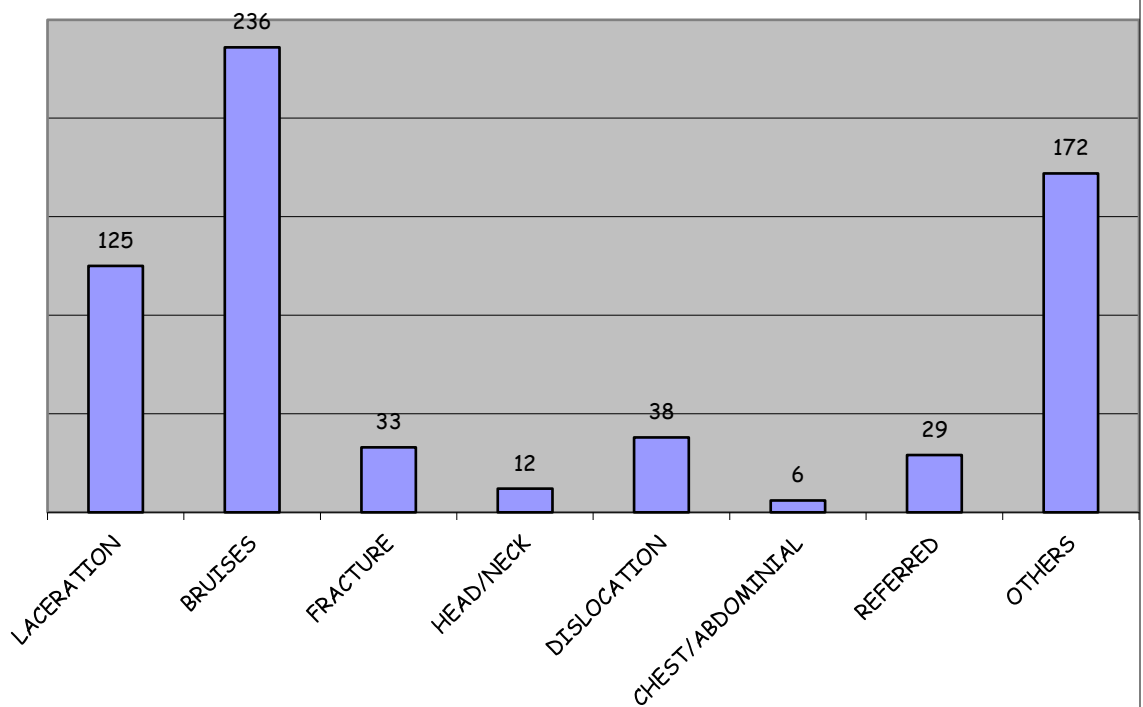
**Chart 9: RTC Cases and Medical Cases Chart illustrating Summary of Patients Attended to**

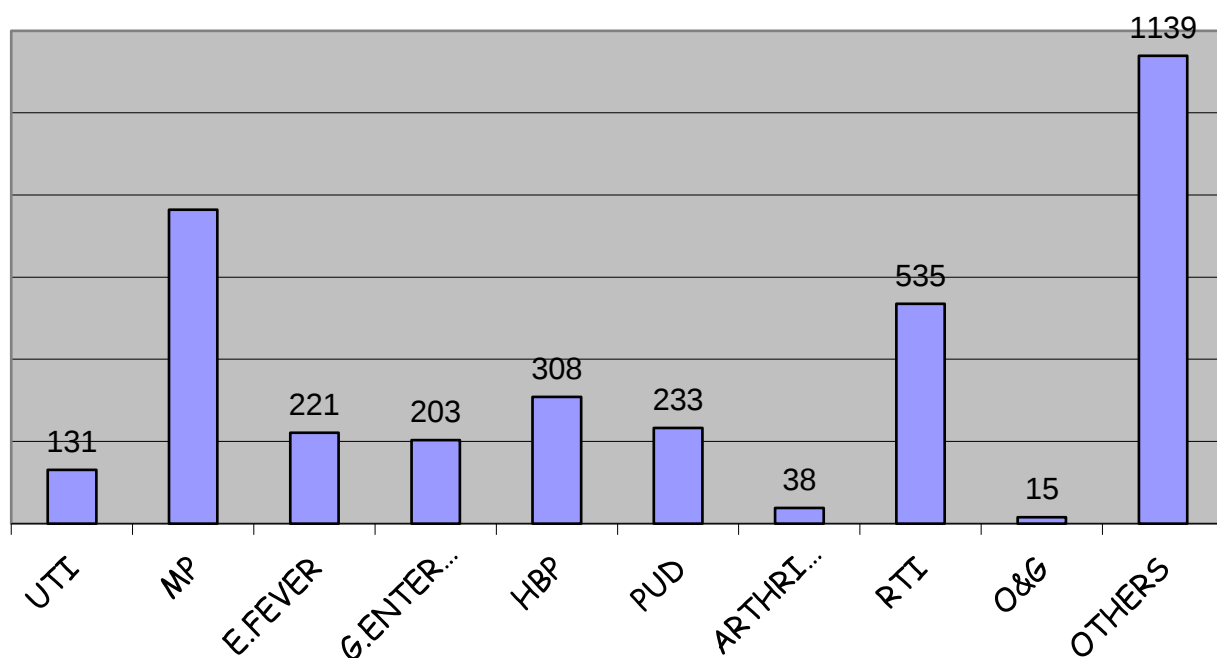

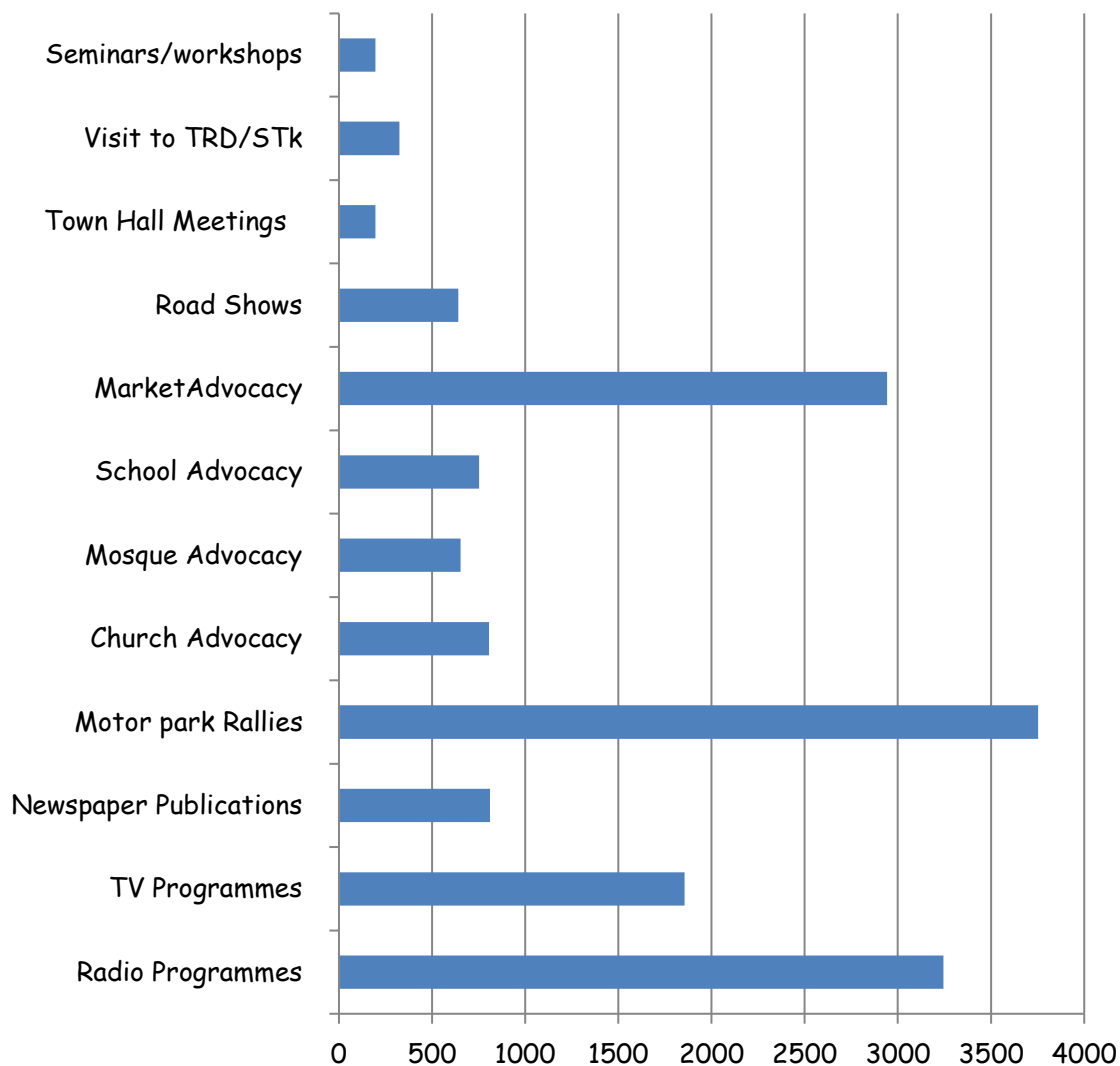

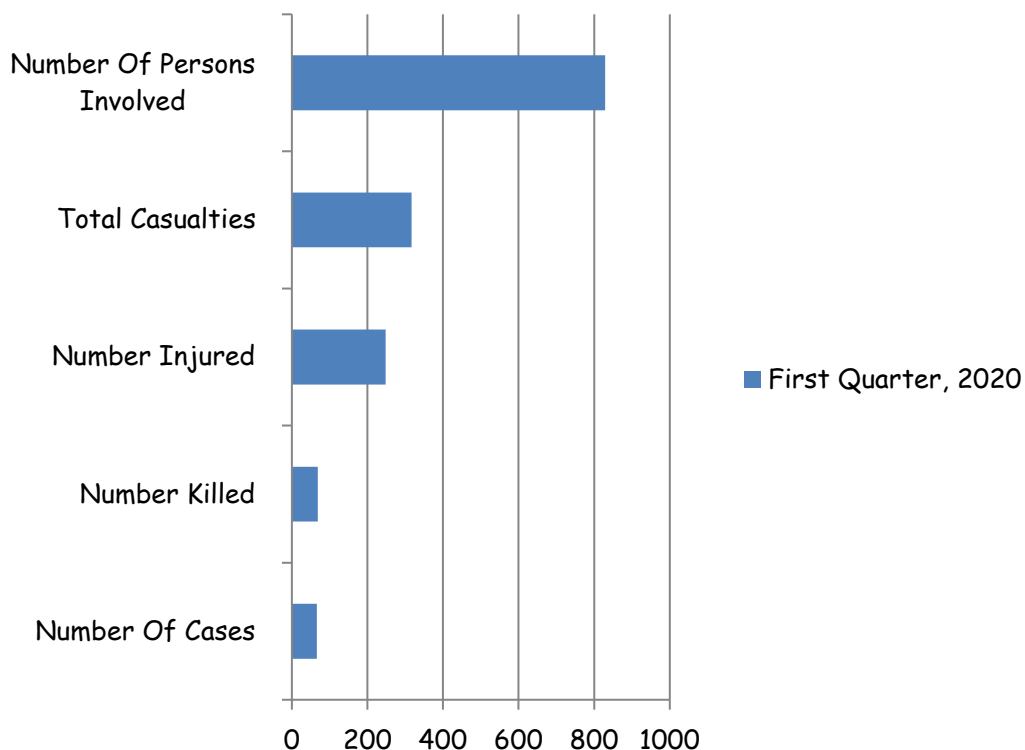

Chart 14: Summary Of RTC Involving Fleet Operators

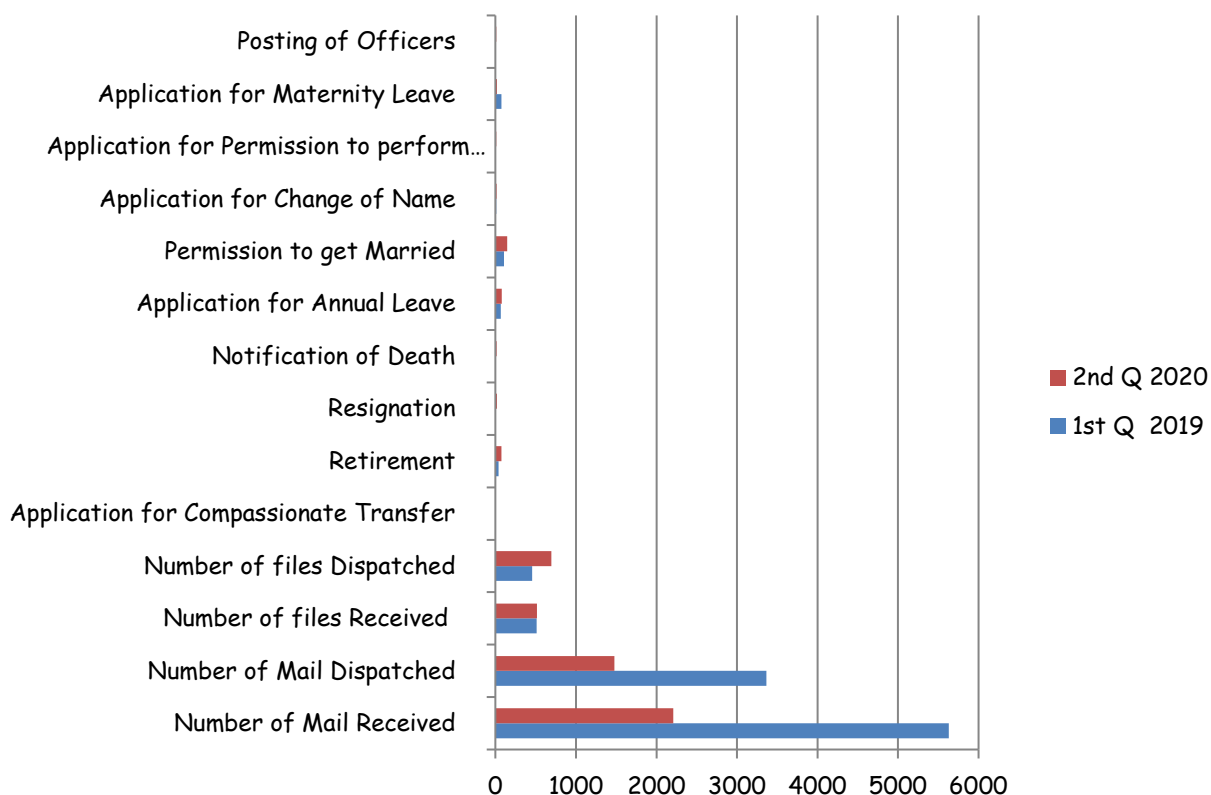

**Chart 15: Corps Secretary Activities**

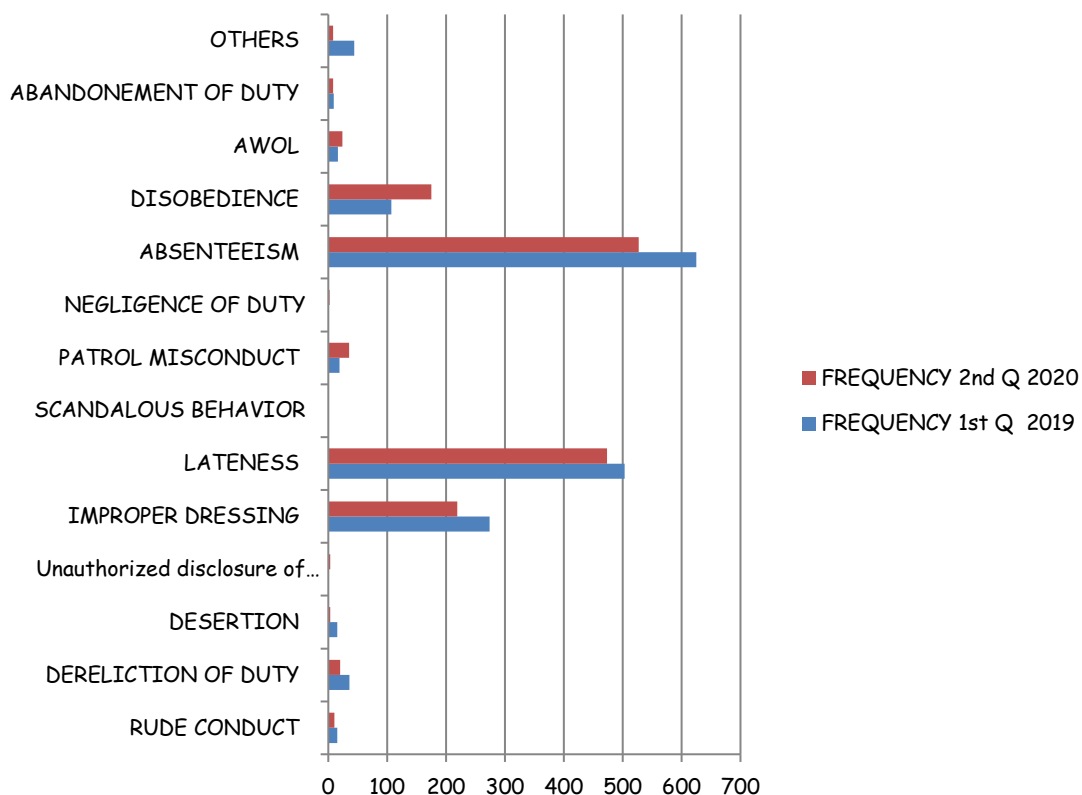

**Chart 16: Misconduct**

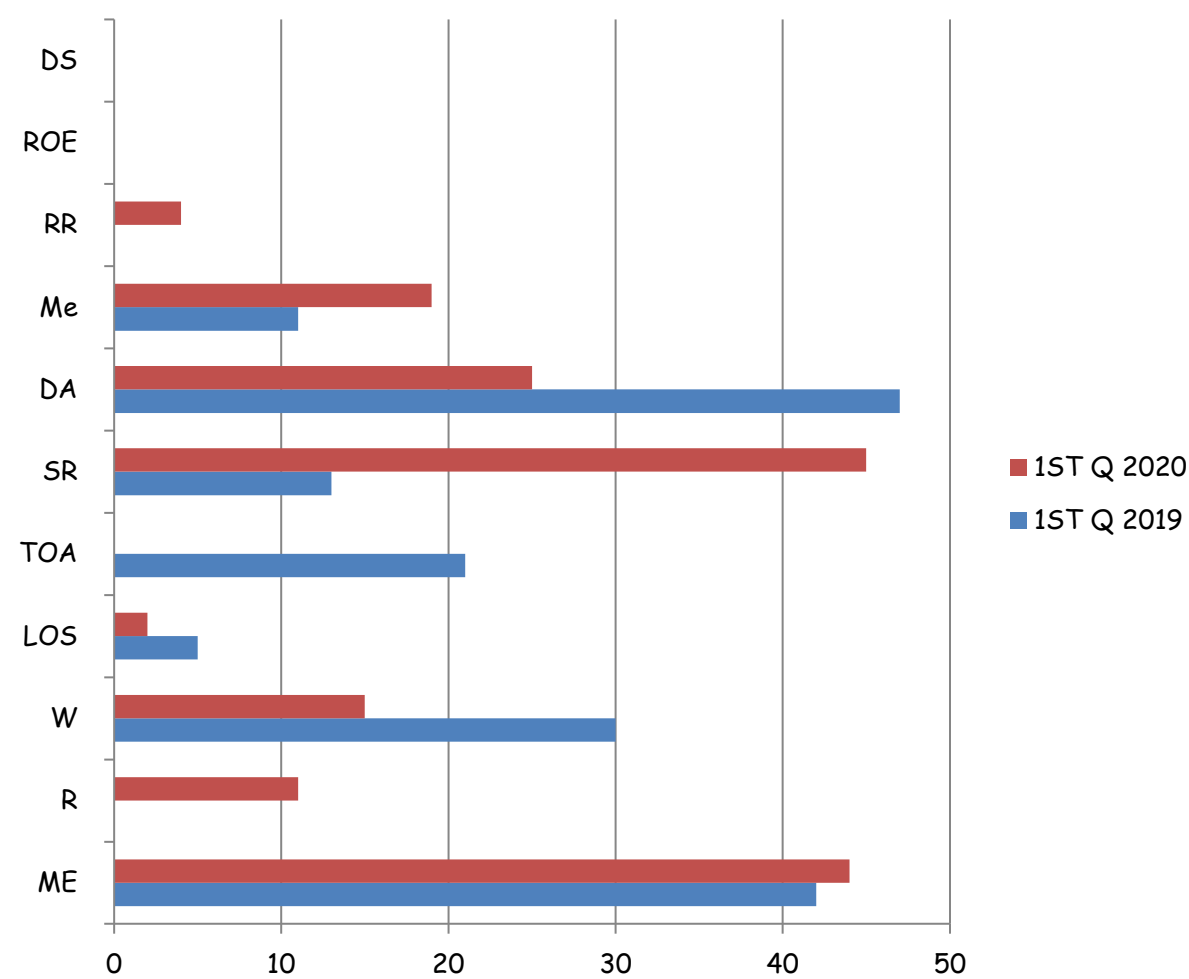

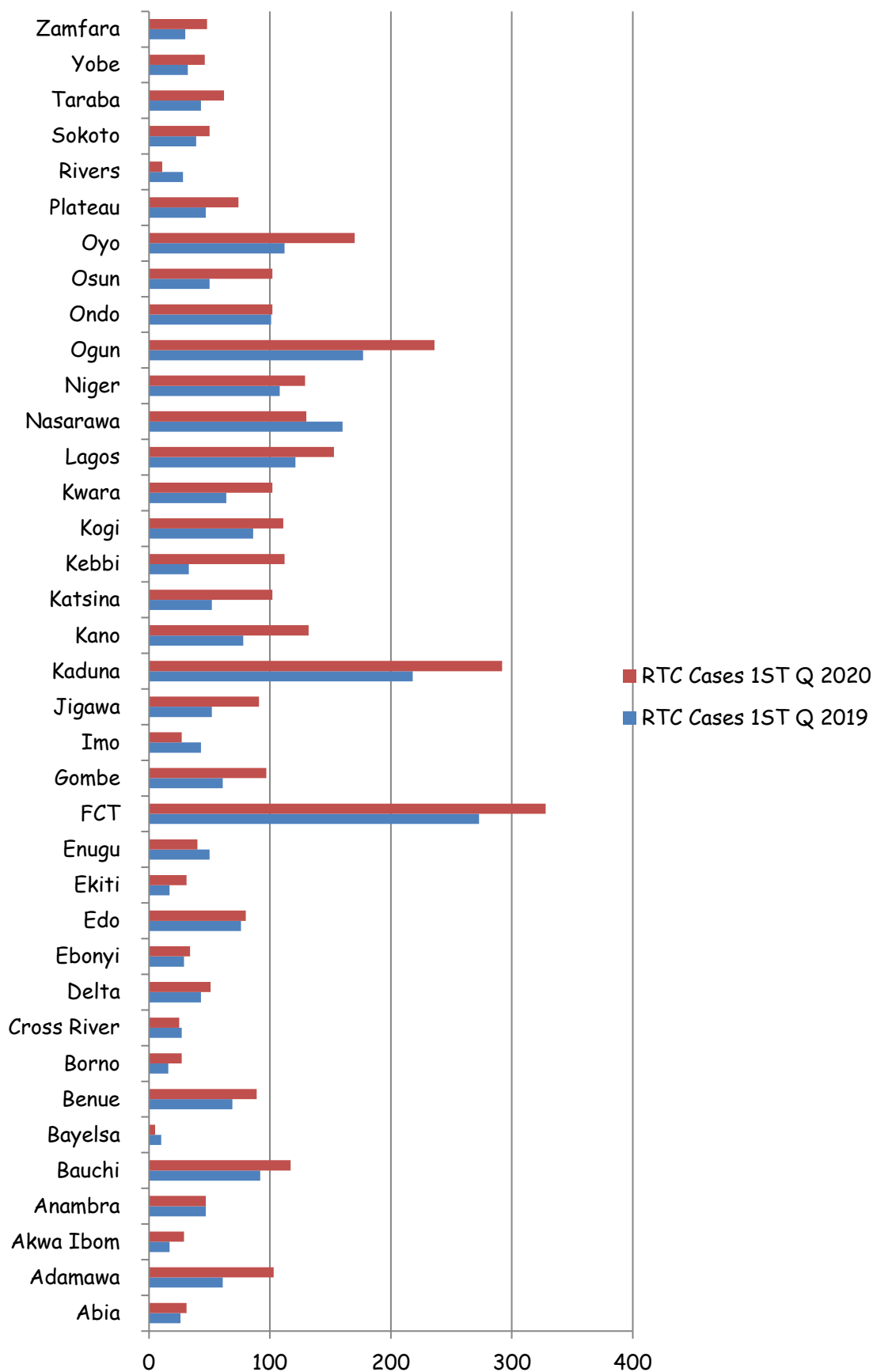

**Chart 18: RTC Cases on State Basis**

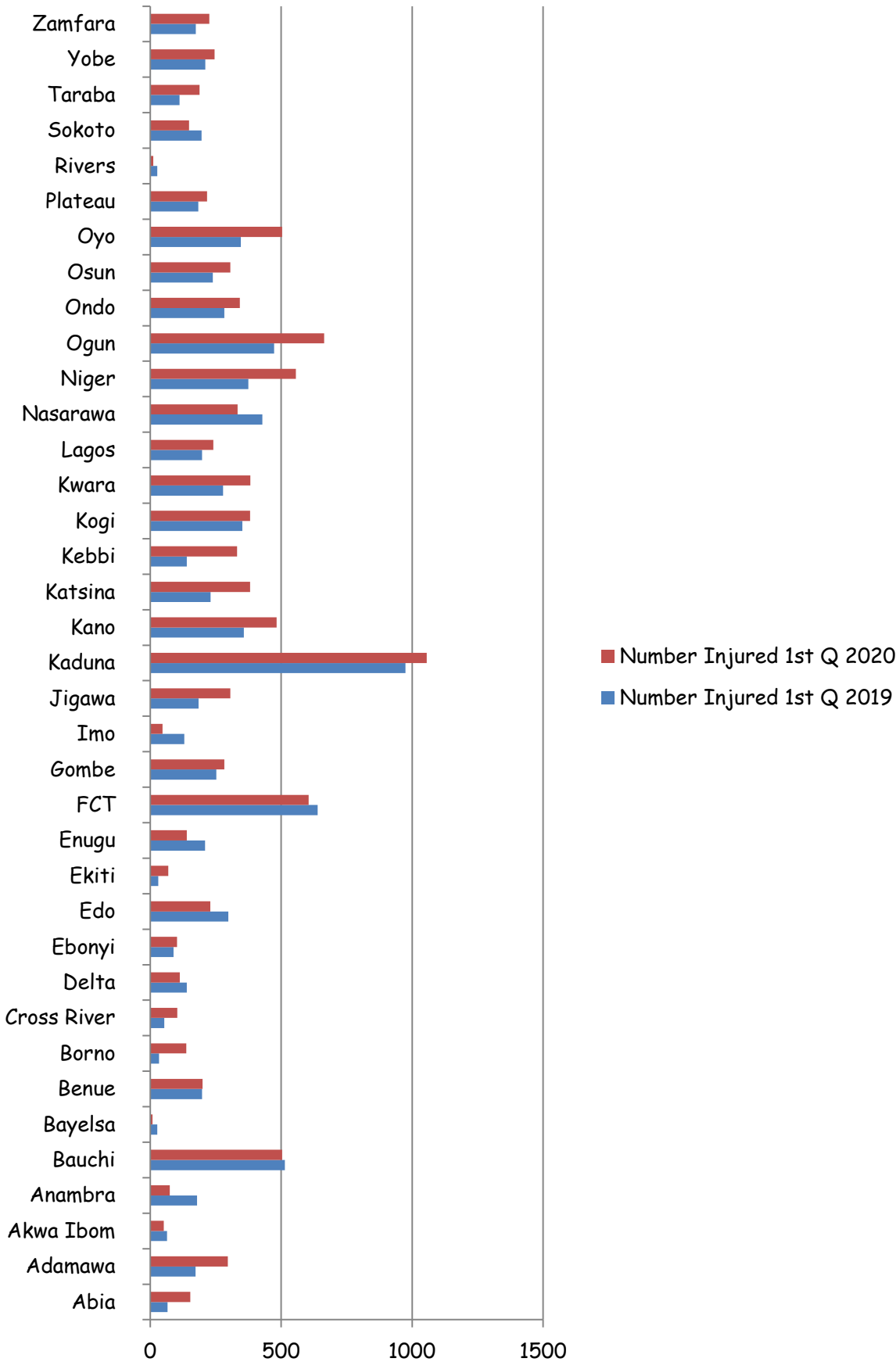

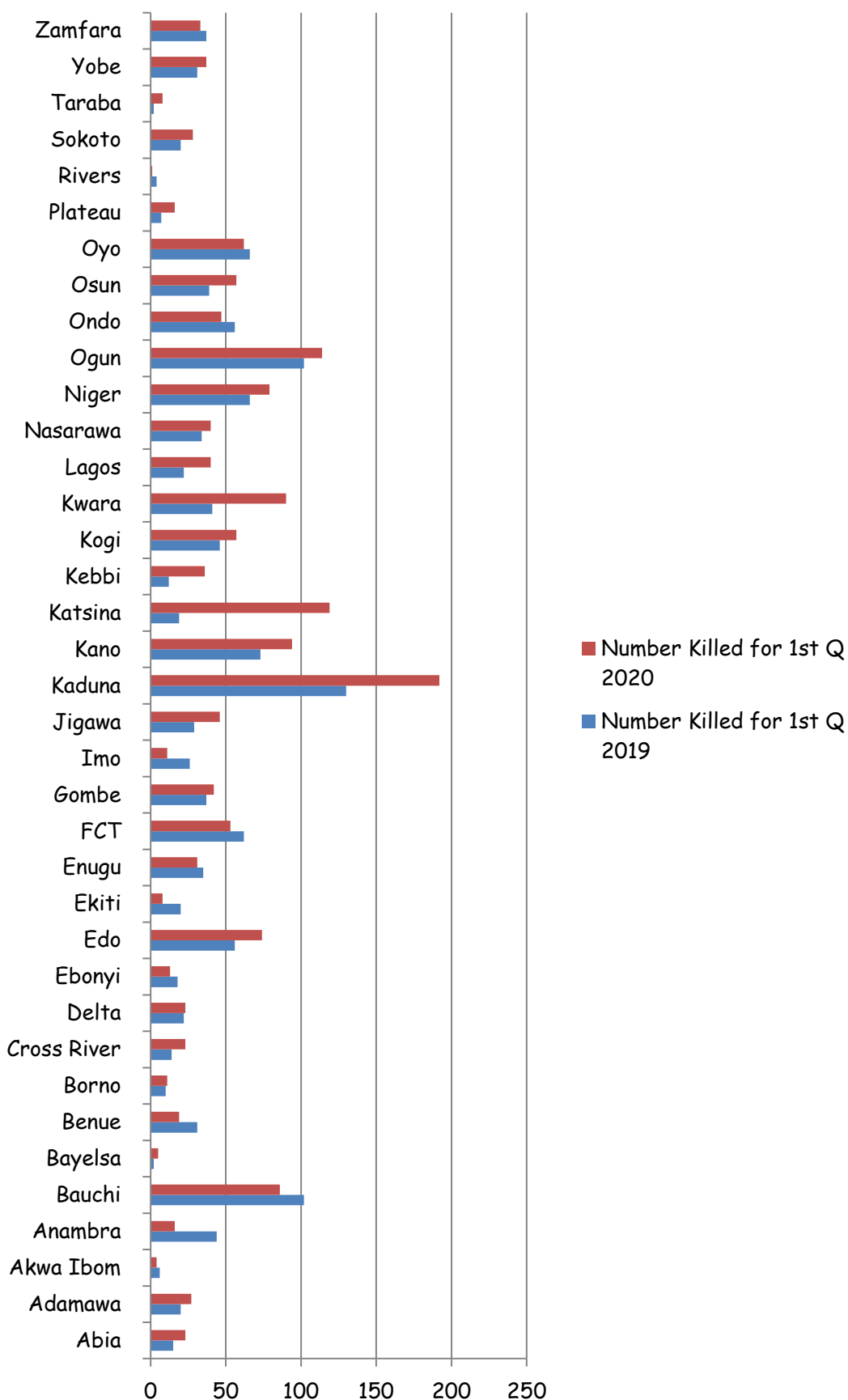
Chart 19: Number Injured

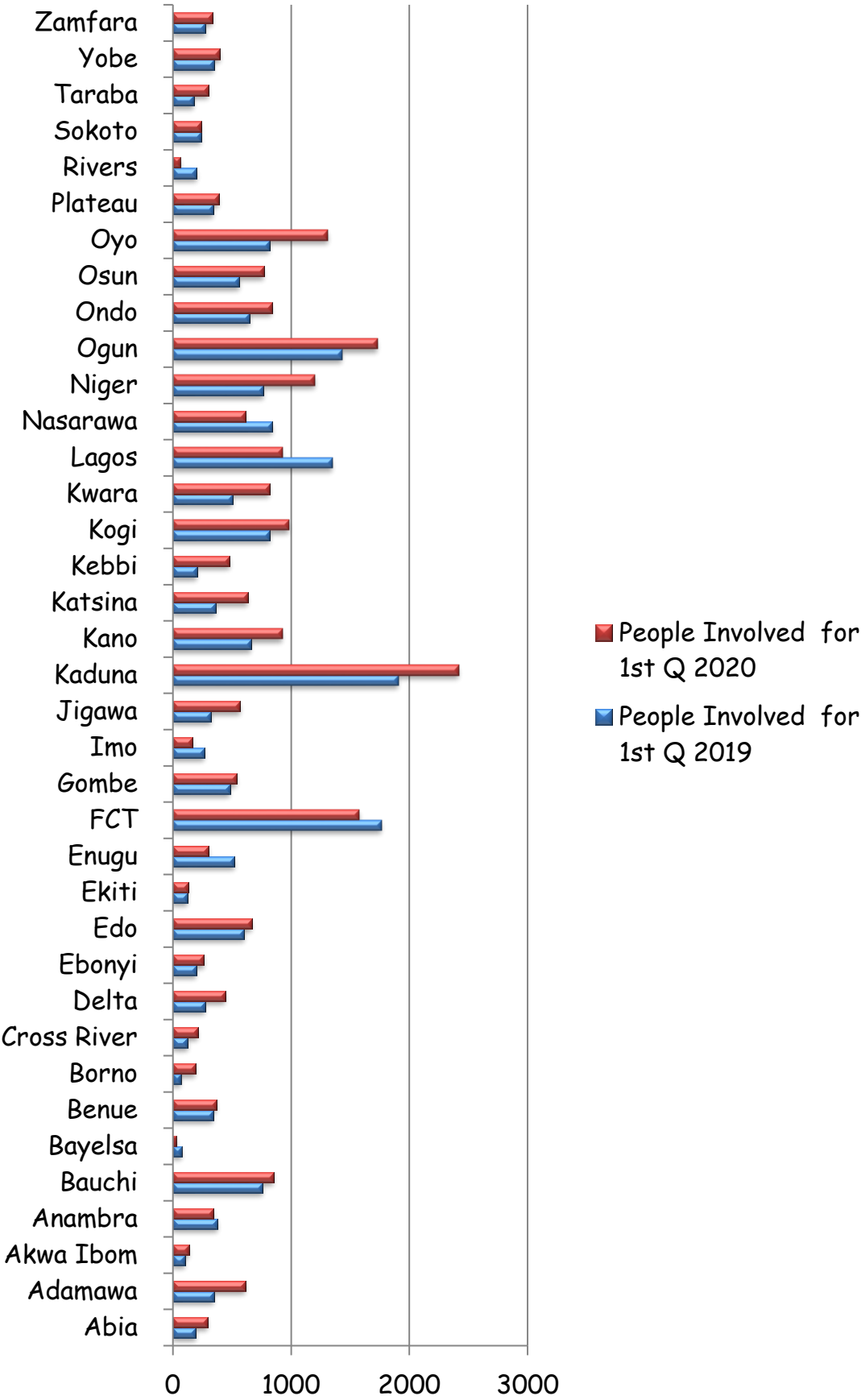
**Chart 20: Number Killed on State Basis**

**Chart 21: People Involved on State Basis**

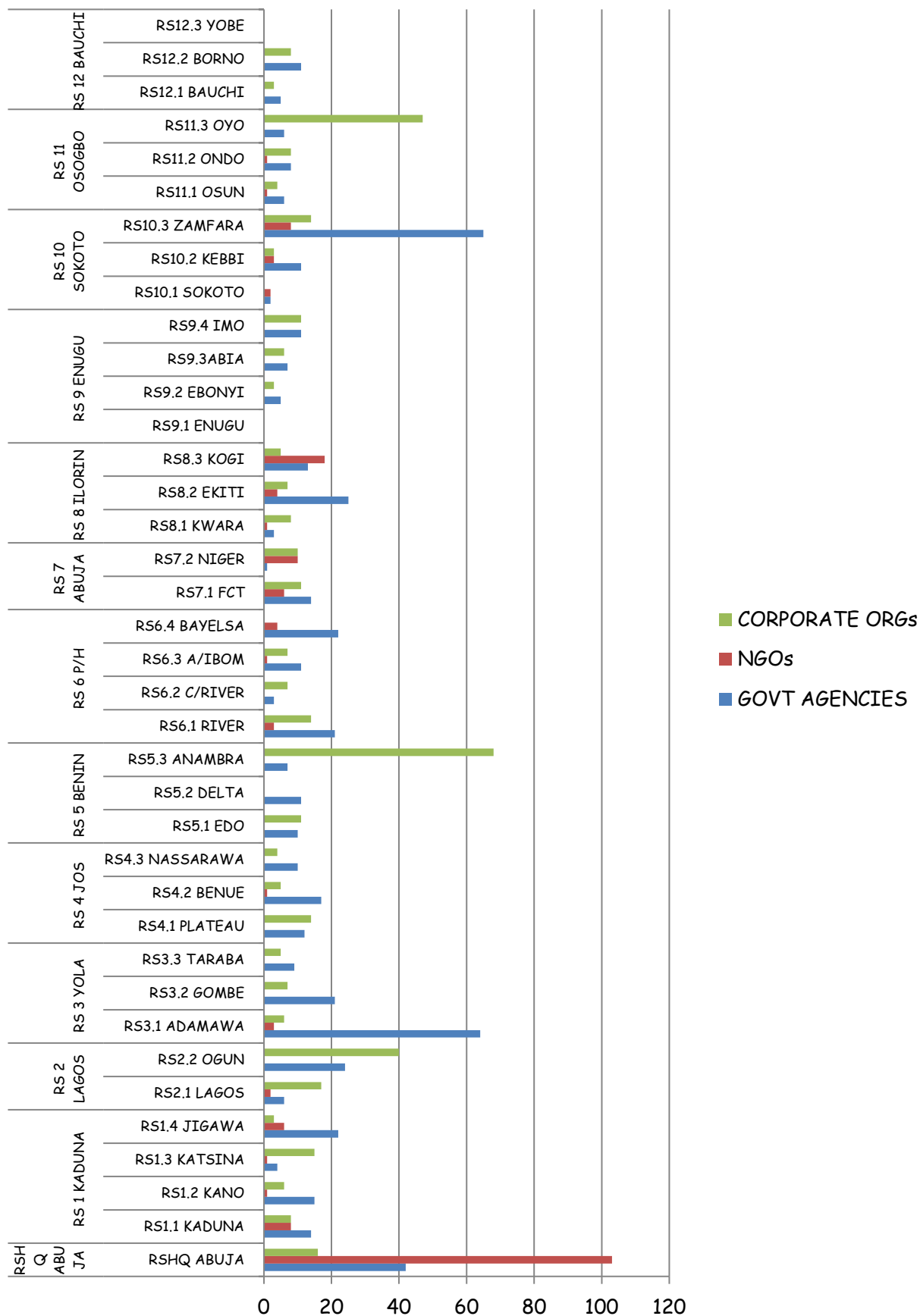

**Chart 22: Partnership Analysis of Government Agencies and NGO**

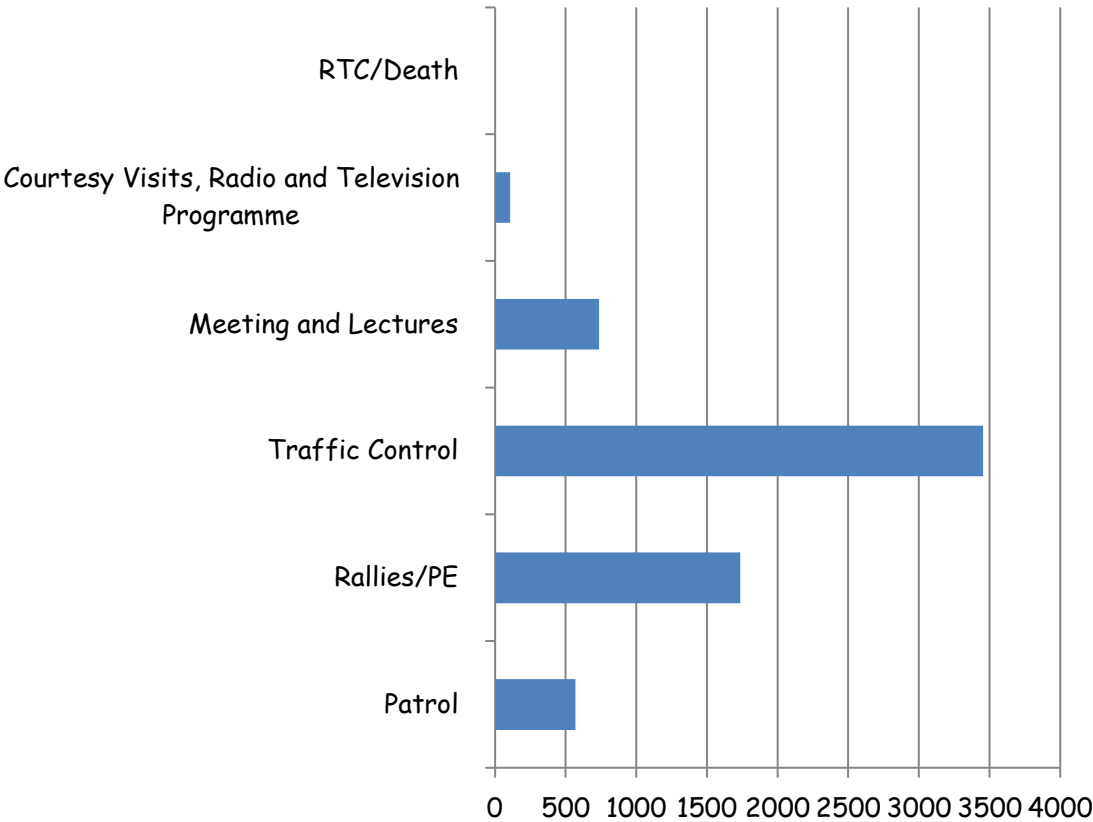

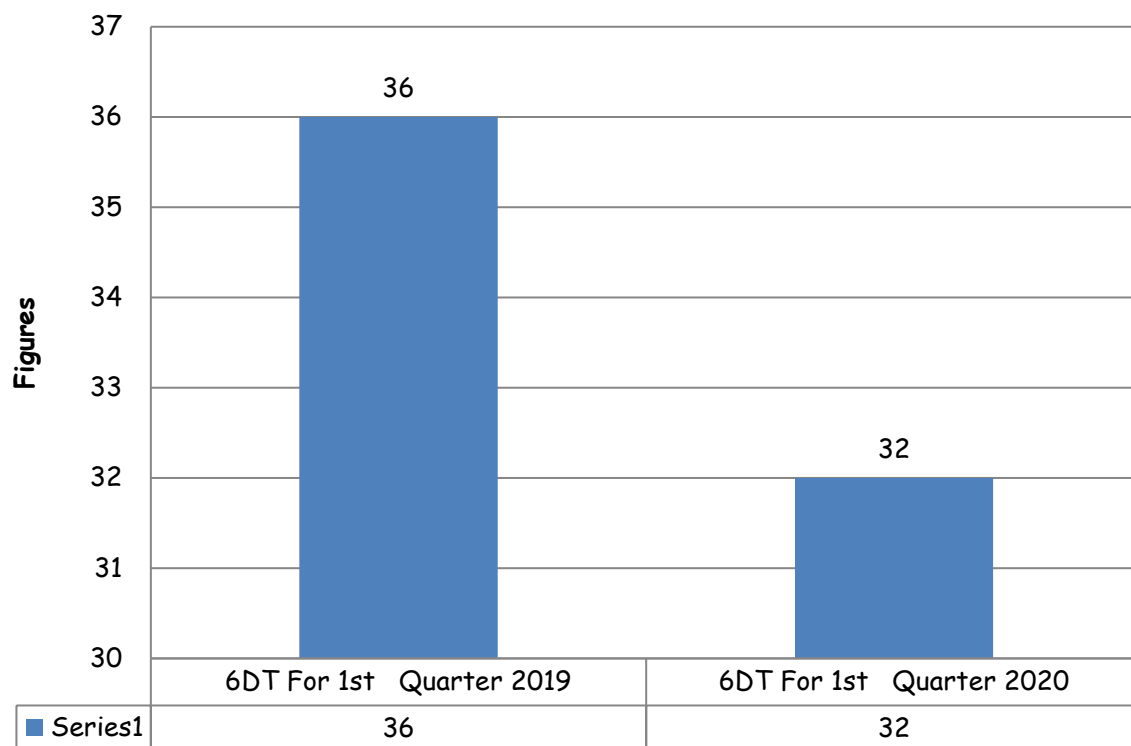
