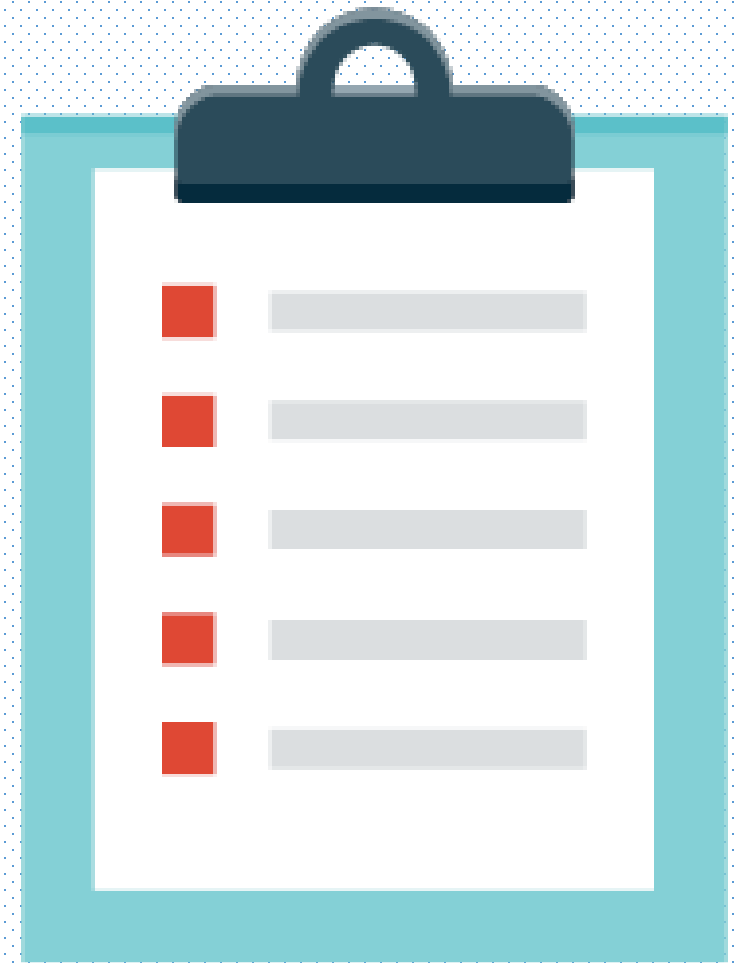

END CORRUPT PRACTICES

#1

Putting a mechanism to effectively tackle corruption is a priority. To this end the following measures will be pursued



END CORRUPT PRACTICES (cont'd)

- a. Commanding Officers to liaise with stakeholders for suitable accommodation for the junior staff and recommend to RSHQ.
- b. All charges of misconduct must be drafted by the Legal Unit – DCM AHR/CLA.
- c. Commanding Officers concealing corrupt practices should be identified and sanctioned including review of appointments - DCM AHR/DCM Ops/CS/CIO.
- d. Commanding Officers who do not adequately fuel and maintain patrol vehicles should be identified and sanctioned – DCM Ops/ACM TSD/CIO.

a. Effective Patrol Operations

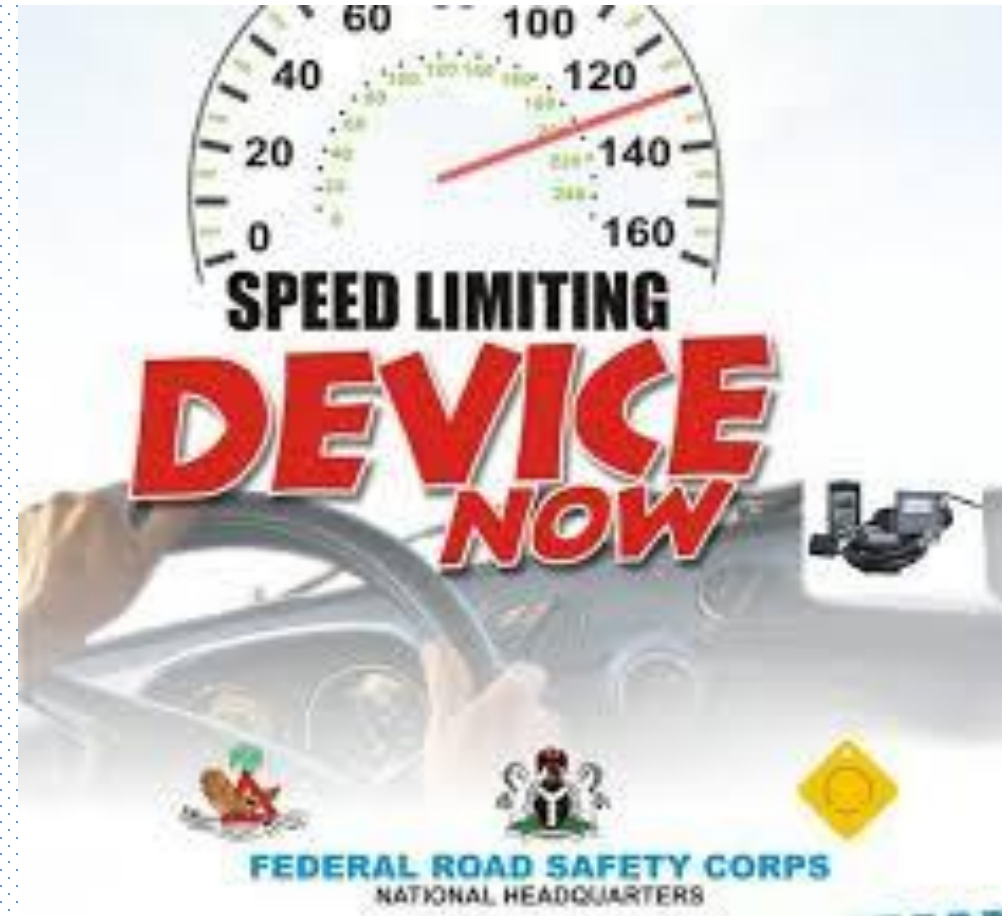
- i. Intensify usage of e-tablets for bookings.
- ii. Effective deployment of tow-trucks to clear obstructions.
- iii. Ensure clearance of traffic gridlock on major corridors.
- iv. Ensure prompt rescue operations.

b. Incivility to Motorists/Assault

- i. Intensify impactful daily pre-patrol brief and weekly in-house lectures so as to address contemporary and prevailing issues.
- ii. Improve and sustain synergy with other security agencies for back-up.
- iii. All Commanding Officers should have directory of all uniform organizations within their purview and forward to DCM Ops.
- iv. Commanding Officers to establish cordial relationship with local security outfits.

c. Enforcement Of Speed Limiting Device (SLD)

- i. Training of all operatives to be able to identify, read and enforce SLD violation. Renewal to be 2 Years
- ii. Periodic mobile court operations on SLD violations.



d. Enforcement Of COVID-19 Protocol

- Sustain participation in the Task Force and special intervention patrol on the enforcement of COVID-19 protocol.



e. Unroadworthy Vehicles

- i. Enforcement on unroadworthy vehicles.
- ii. Prosecution of un-roadworthy vehicles during mobile court.

TRAINING

#3

- a. Cadets and trainees to be deployed as Provost and Intelligence operatives, should be selected by the training institutions in liaison with relevant Corps Offices during the basic courses for specialized training thereafter.



TRAINING (Cont'd)

- b. Conduct sensitization of FRSC staff on the need to imbibe the tenets of service delivery and protection of fundamental human rights under a democratic dispensation.
- c. Training of all operatives to be able to identify, read and enforce SLD violation.
- d. Liaise with the Commands to certify all Staff to be deployed for Train-the-Trainers Scheme.

ADMIN AND HUMAN RESOURCES DEPARTMENT

#4

- a. All disciplinary cases should be dispensed with dispatch
- b. Expansion of Officers and Marshals' Mess to field commands.



FINANCE AND ACCOUNTS DEPARTMENT

#5

- a. Expand the usage of POS in Field Commands.



TECHNICAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT

#6

- a. Ensure proper maintenance of all Corps' assets to facilitate smooth operations.
- b. Retracing of technicians and identifying them with special prefix in their PINs.



- c. Maintenance of all Corps' assets within the purview of the Commanding Officers should be properly monitored and sanctions meted out to Commanding Officers who fail to adhere to acceptable standards.

MOTOR VEHICLE ADMINISTRATION

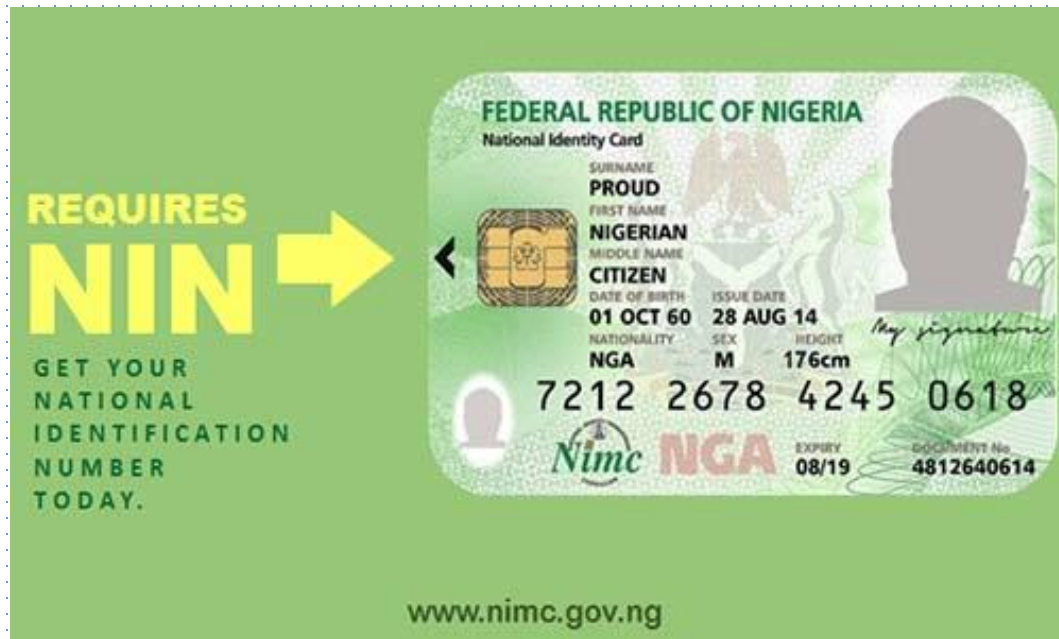
#7

- a. Integration of NVIS, NDL, DRIMS (Offender's data) and NIA database.
- b. Roll out of digital and mobile licensing.
- c. Code should be introduced for retrieval of drivers licence number as obtainable with the NIN.



Driving School Standardization Scheme (DSSP)

The DSSP Section should complete the National Identity Number (NIN) harmonization relating to the Driving Schools.



SPECIAL DUTIES AND EXTERNAL RELATIONS DEPARTMENT

#8

- a. Make motivation and recognition high priorities to engender improved productivity.
- b. Staff should be enlightened on the volunteer status of the Special Marshals to disabuse any ambiguity.



POLICY, RESEARCH AND STATISTICS

#9

- a. Embark on research on road safety management
- b. Improve data collation and harmonization



#10

- a. Improve the capacity of the CTSO Staff to effectively conduct Fleet Operators' inspection and certification.
- b. CSTO should do full examination of vehicles during Certification.
- c. Staff of CTSO should be trained to increase vehicle Inspection.



CORPS TRANSPORT STANDARDIZATION OFFICE (Cont'd)

- d. Ensure that list of erring fleet operators is forwarded to CLA within seven (7) days after re-certification inspection.
- e. Prompt notification of CLA about fleet operators involved in a road traffic crash for prosecution.

CORPS PUBLIC EDUCATION OFFICE

#12

- a. All FRSC programmes with direct impact on the motoring public should be given slots on the National Traffic Radio e.g. DSSP, RTSSS, etc.



- b. Introduce innovative programmes e.g. School Quiz and debate competition on Road Safety related topics.
- c. Ensure review of social media guidelines to eliminate abuse.
- d. Sustain public enlightenment on Overloading, Speeding, compliance to COVID-19 protocols and Use of Phone While Driving (UPWD).
- e. Conduct public education on the need for the motoring public to be receptive to FRSC staff on duty.

CORPS PUBLIC EDUCATION OFFICE (Cont'd)

- g. Sustain prompt response to clashes between operatives on duty and members of the public.
- h. Publicity on SLD convictions.
- i. Convictions or assault cases by members of the public should be publicized.
- j. Encourage all staff to download the NTR App.
- k. To sensitize all other Security Agencies, especially the Police on the activation of e-ticketing, when the new system comes on-stream so as to be acceptable as standard evidence of enforcement encounter with the FRSC.

CORPS SAFETY ENGINEERING OFFICE

#13

- a. Training of more crash investigators and re-training of existing ones.
- b. Ensure investigation of all fatal crashes.



- c. Compilation of critical intersections and junctions in all the urban centres for road safety management purposes.
- d. All staff trained as crash investigators should be retained within the unit and deployed as appropriate.

CORPS MEDICAL AND RESCUE

#14

- a. Encourage annual comprehensive medical check-up by staff.
- b. Periodically carry out analysis of staff medical status and advice Management accordingly.
- c. Sustain sensitization of staff on how to manage their health.



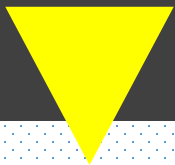
CORPS MEDICAL AND RESCUE (Cont'd)

- d. Ensure COVID-19 protocols are observed in all FRSC formations.
- e. Escalate the EMS training with regards to Train-the-Trainers on para-medics.



#15

- a. Ensure prompt prosecution of recalcitrant traffic offenders.
- b. Draft all charges relating to misconducts.
- c. E-ticketing should be incorporated in the NRTR

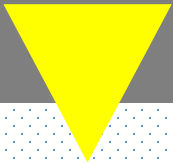


- d. Cases of assault on members of the Corps should be adequately prosecuted.
- e. Periodic mobile court operations on SLD violations.
- f. Prosecution of un-roadworthy vehicles during mobile court.

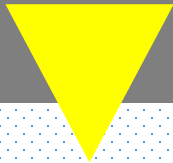
CORPS INTELLIGENCE OFFICE

#16

- a. Comprehensive training and re-training of Int. operatives.
- b. Ensure improvement in internal and external intelligence gathering.



STRATEGY SESSION



STRATEGY SESSION (Cont'd)

- i. Institute a feedback mechanism for participants during strategy session to ascertain level of assimilation of resolutions reached.
- iii. Generate template for submission of presentations by the Commanding Officers during strategy sessions.
- iii. Commanding Officers to submit their presentations a week before the strategy session highlighting the implementation of directives arising from previous strategy sessions and their future plans.

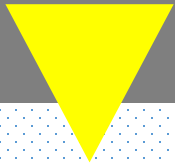
STRATEGY SESSION (Cont'd)

- iv. Head of Departments and Corps Officers to make genuine input into CM's talking point before the strategy session.
- v. Head of Departments and Corps Officers be invited as participants to enrich the forum.
- vi. Monitor implementation of CM's orders and directives and send feedback on status to CM before the next strategy session.
- vii. Change venue of the strategy session to a more interactive friendly environment.

SERVICOM UNIT

#17

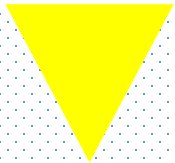
- a. Timely response to complaints from the public (including the Flag'IT APP), in line with the SERVICOM charter and providing feedback.
- b. Training and re-training of the SERVICOM desk Officers.

- a. Encourage members of the Corps to increase their subscription to the Scheme to enable its end benefits.



Housing

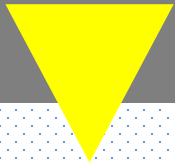
Houses are still available for allocation into interested members of the Corps.
