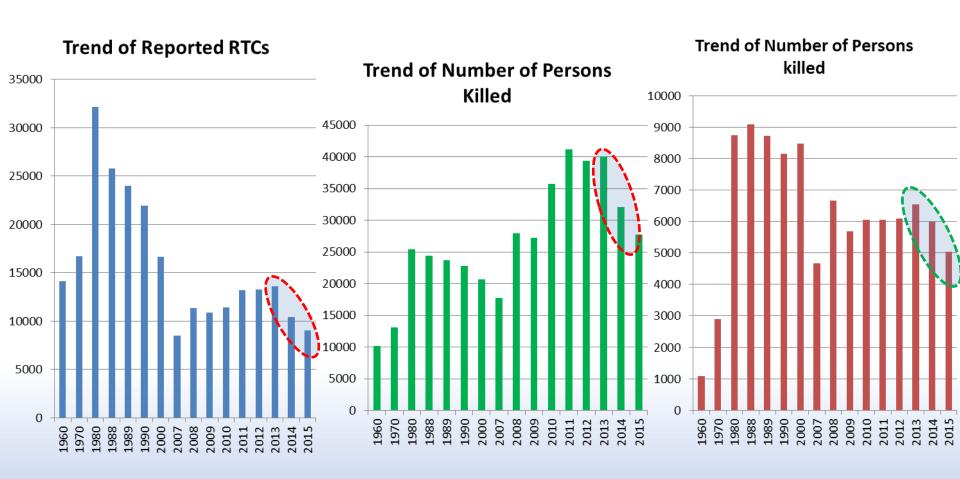

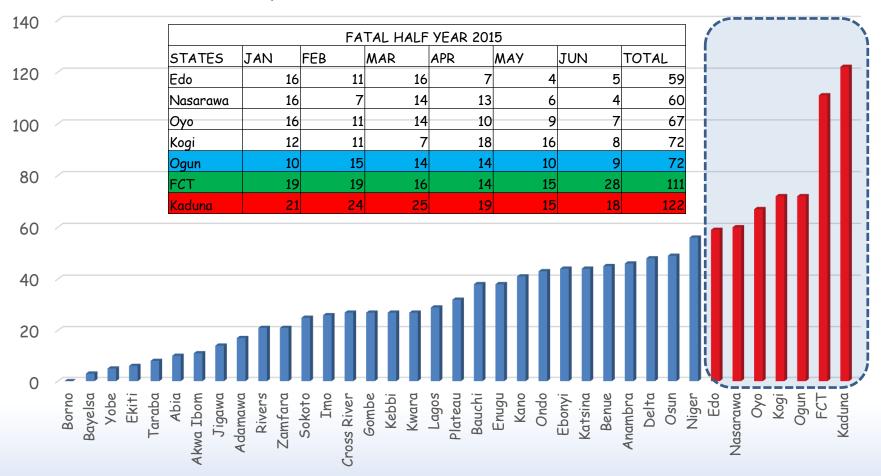

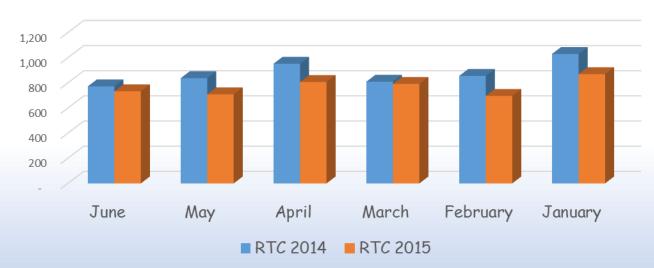
## 2015 Half year fatal cases trend on States Basis

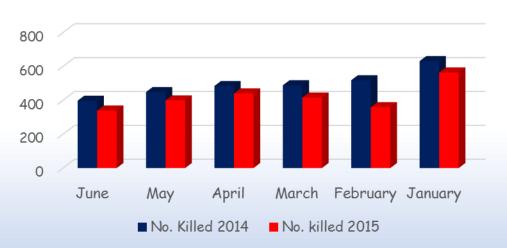
Half Year Monthly trend of Number of Persons Injured (2014 and 2015)

Half Year Monthly trend of Number of Persons killed in RTC (2014 and 2015)





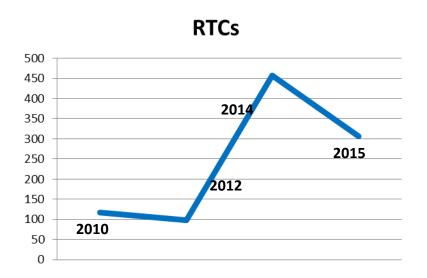
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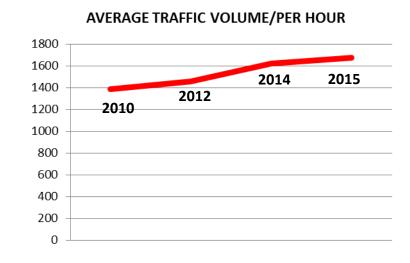

## Abuja-Kaduna-Zaria-Kano CORRIDOR





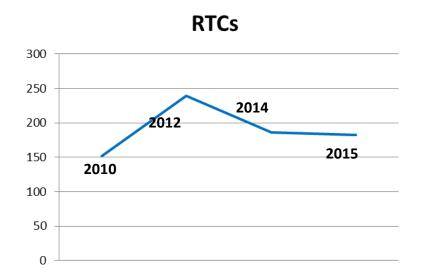


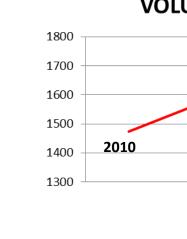

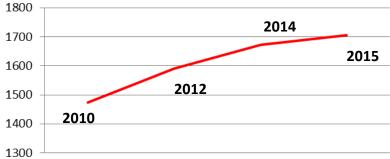
## BENIN-IFON-AKURE-ILESHA CORRIDOR







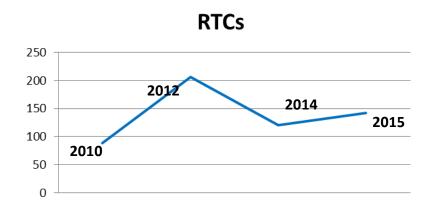
## **AVERAGE TRAFFIC VOLUME/PER HOUR**

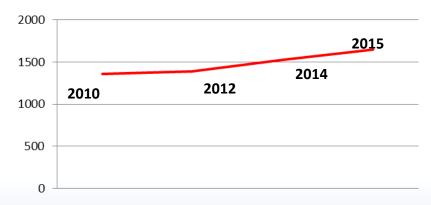

#### MOKWA-BIDA-LAMBATA-SULEJA CORRIDOR





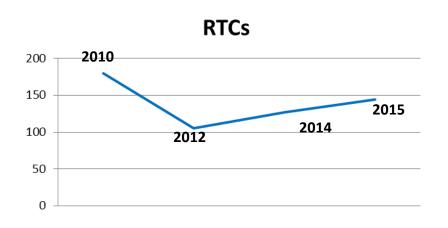
# AVERAGE TRAFFIC VOLUME/PER HOUR



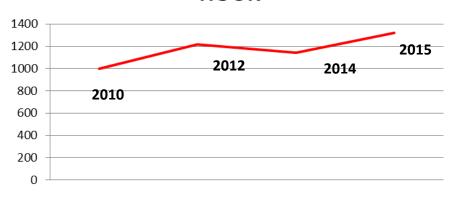

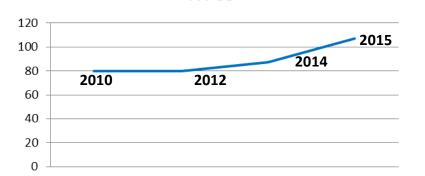

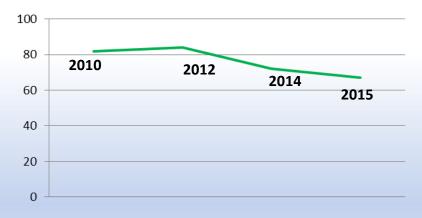

## ENUGU-ABAKALIKI- IKOM—MFUM CORRIDOR

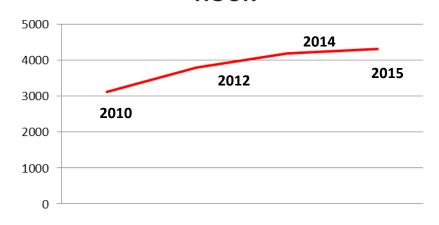

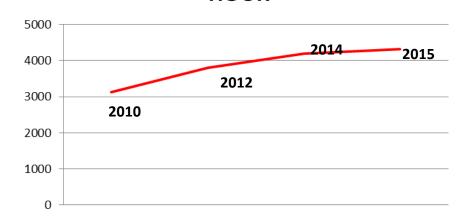

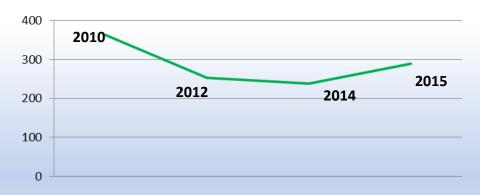

# OTHER LAUDABLE CONRIBUTIONS OF THE WORLD BANK TO ROAD SAFETY IN NIGERIA

# **Logistics and Equipment**

Acquisition of seven(7) Nos. of 70-tonnes capacity heavy duty tow-trucks for removal of major road obstructions and State of the Art Ambulances deployed to all **Emergency Rescue points** have aided the Corps Post Crash initiatives.

Traffic enforcement has also been enhanced through provision of patrol equipment and authority devices.









# OTHER LAUDABLE CONRIBUTIONS OF THE WORLD BANK TO ROAD SAFETY IN NIGERIA II

Trainings, Capacity Building and Manpower development

The various exchange programmes in APTH-France and Sacramento-California (USA) have significantly impacted on administration and management of road safety in Nigeria.

Implementation of the Safe-To-Load Programme commenced last year (2015) and is still on course.







## WEST AFRICAN ROAD SAFETY ORGANISATION (WARSO)

The West African Road Safety Organisation (WARSO) comprises of road safety organisations amongst West African countries aimed at the promotion and reinforcement of road safety activities and practices in West Africa

Nigeria currently chairs the West African Road Safety Organisation.

Part of the current focus is to encourage entrenching virile road safety lead agency in the sub region, implement common licensing regime, promote safe fleet management, combat overloading and implement community post crash project





# NIGERIA'S SUPPORTS TO ROAD SAFETY MANAGEMENT IN SIERRA LEONE

In addition to realising the WARSO imitative of entrenching virile lead road safety agency in West Africa, Nigeria is supporting Sierra Leone in promoting road safety management in that country

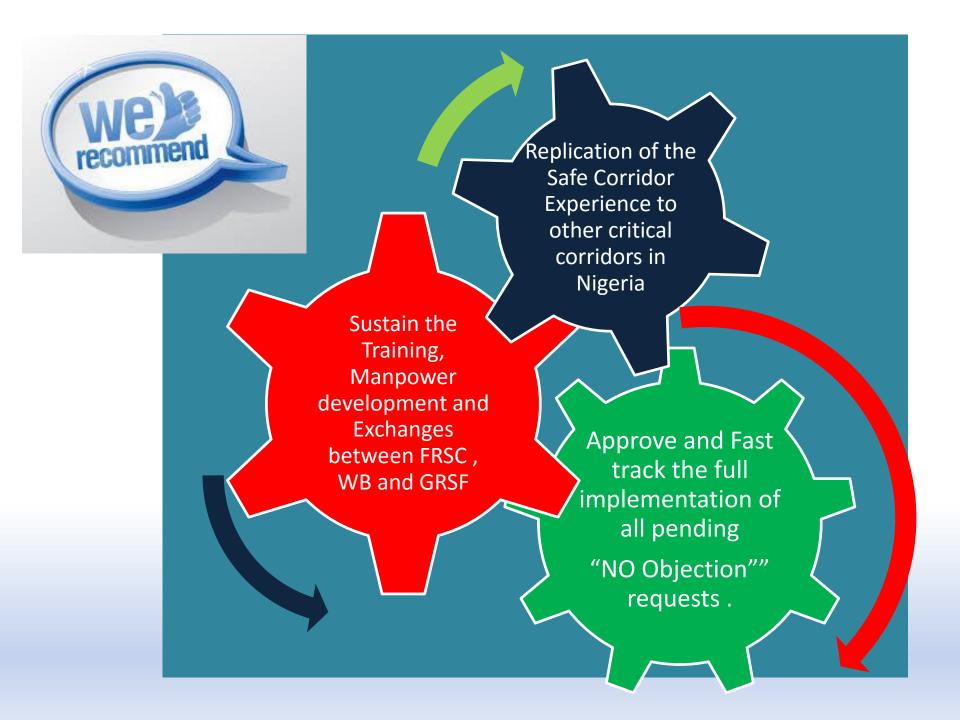
A team of road safety experts from the FRSC has been approved by Nigeria's President on a 2 year deployment to Sierra Leone

The team would depot for Sierra Leon as soon as the final nod is obtained from WHO in respect of the recent health challenged

Similar initiative have also commenced for replication in other countries, including Liberia
