In Nigeria, the challenge is also enormous











Establishment of 'Zebras'


Recognizing the implications of 'golden rule' in life saving, the Corps stepped up efforts at saving more people involved in road crash






From a pilot scheme in the FCT in 2009, Zebras have inundated thirty seven locations in Nigeria..... But not everywhere is covered......






There is need to strengthen the Ministry of Health for provision of accurate vital statistics on Nigeria Work with the FRSC team to adequately reconcile data before release to the world


