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ROAD TRAFFIC CRASH CASES RESCUED BY FRSC RESCUE TEAM: EXPERIENCES AND CHALLENGES

Road Traffic Crash (RTCs) cases rescued by FRSC rescue team across the country in line with Section 10(k) of FRSC (Establishment) Act 2007, the work is a laudable and in current interest. Road traffic injuries rank second to HIV/AIDS as the leading cause of ill-health and premature death for adult men aged 15-44 years.

FRSC rescue personnel in their administrative capacities as advisors to the FRSC management, are well aware of the public health implications of RTCs resulting from faulty road design, layout and maintenance defects, besides the ills of speed and 'drunk driving'.

We would like to highlight that in conjunction with sustained public education and deterrent policing, engineering solutions may also be required. Attention to measures as simple as professional speed breaker design, placement and construction with adequate sign posting, can have a potential impact on prevention of accidents especially those affecting vulnerable road users such as pedestrians and cyclists.

With the lack of a cogent policy on road safety, we may have to resort to locally implemented civic measures which may aim to either reduce or restrict the number of vehicles using residential colony roads, by improving crossing facilities on main roads, by closing off roads i.e. prioritizing pedestrian routes, using one-way systems; or reducing traffic speed by 'traffic calming' measures such as humped pelican crossings, narrowing of roads and mini-roundabouts.

The NRSS slogan is 'Road traffic crash is no death'. Road safety results from deliberate efforts by governance systems, either national or local, and requires policies and programs to be developed to support and maintain it.

Road safety is often treated as a transportation issue, not a public health issue, and road traffic injuries are called 'accidents though most could be prevented. Civic planners need to address issues of speed and alcohol consumption; promoting of helmets and seat belts; improving the design of roads; enforcing road safety laws; and improving emergency response services.

Researchers put far more effort into understanding and preventing diseases that do less harm than into understanding and preventing road traffic injuries. Our commitment as concerned actor/agency (and opinion makers) is a key to mitigation of this epidemic of RTCs, which takes the lives of people in Nigeria every year, disables thousands, and affects their families and communities. Thus a clear message is that road traffic injuries can be prevented, and their consequences can be alleviated. Strong leadership commitment is a key to prevention efforts, and in garrisons, an enabling environment for road safety can be created. Road safety can be considered to be a collective responsibility; with partnerships bridging the various stakeholders such as the Military, Police, Red Cross, NEMA, Federal and state fire services, hospitals and season researchers, to promote and facilitate efforts to prevent road traffic injuries and death.

Chart 1: Chart Illustrating War on Critical Offences

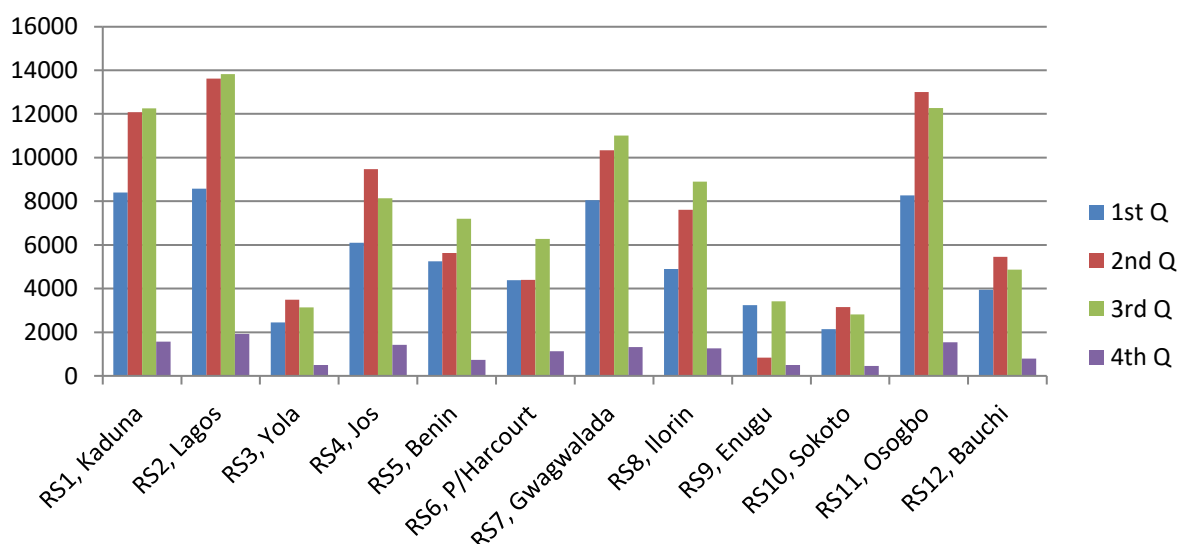

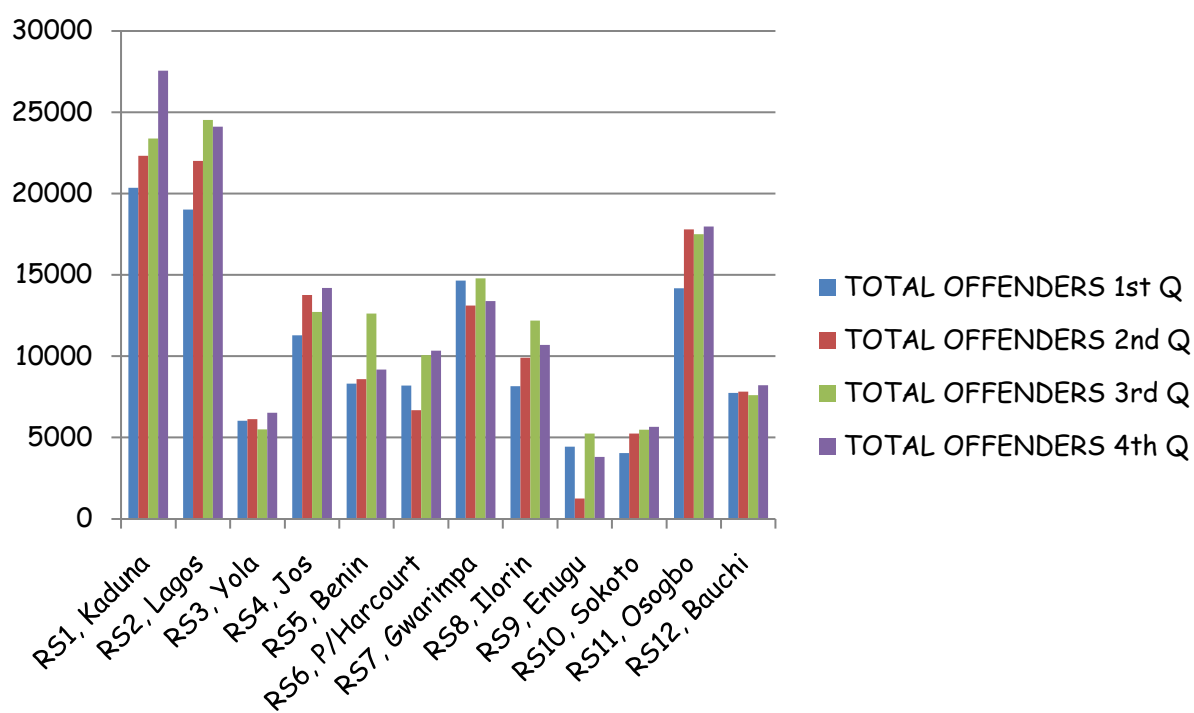
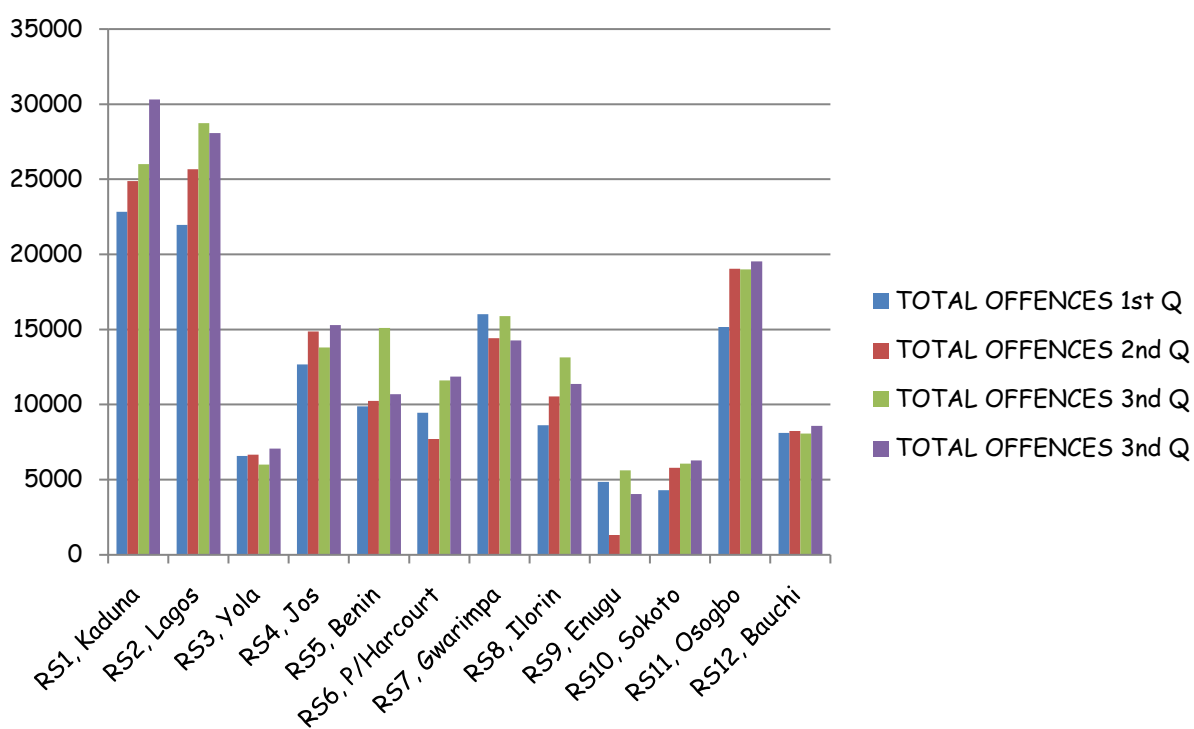
Chart 2: Chart Illustrating Offenders

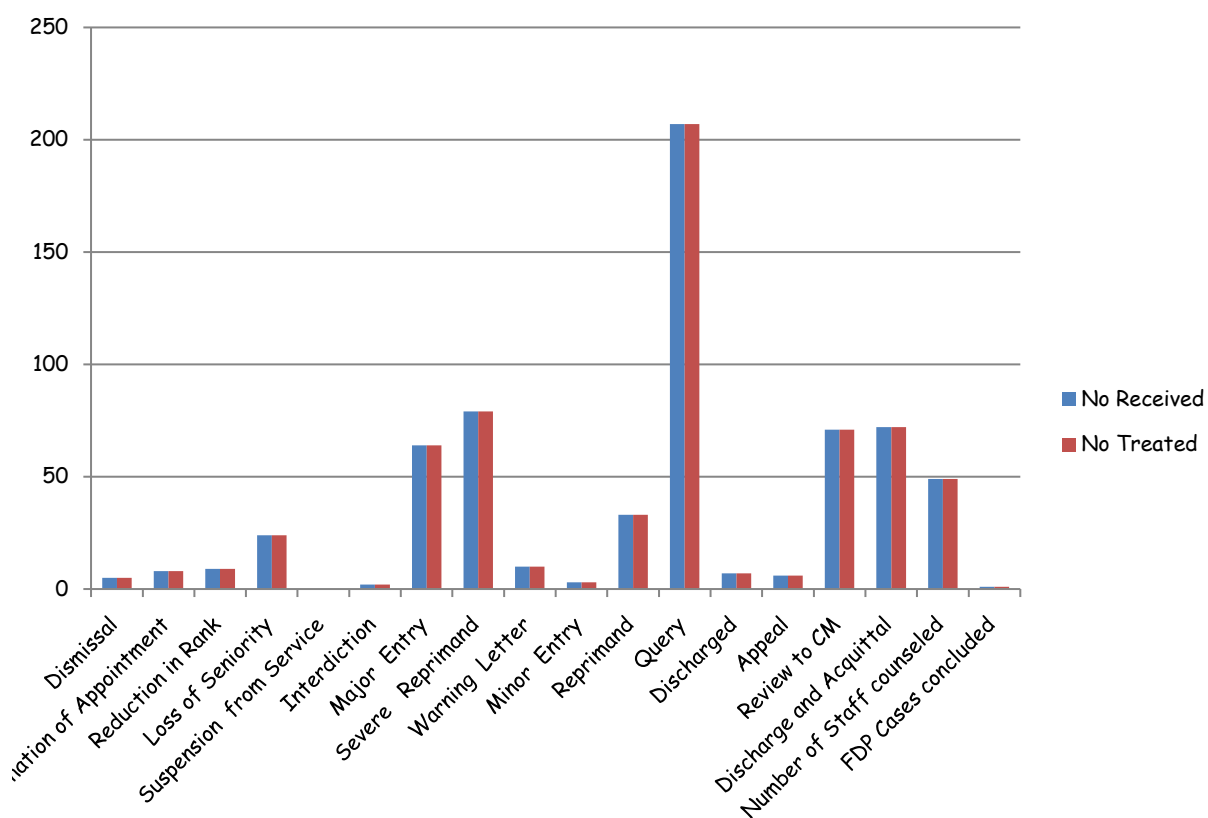
Chart 4: Chart Illustrating Disciplinary Cases Treated

Chart 6: Incoming Requests For Variation Of Staff Salaries (Marshals)

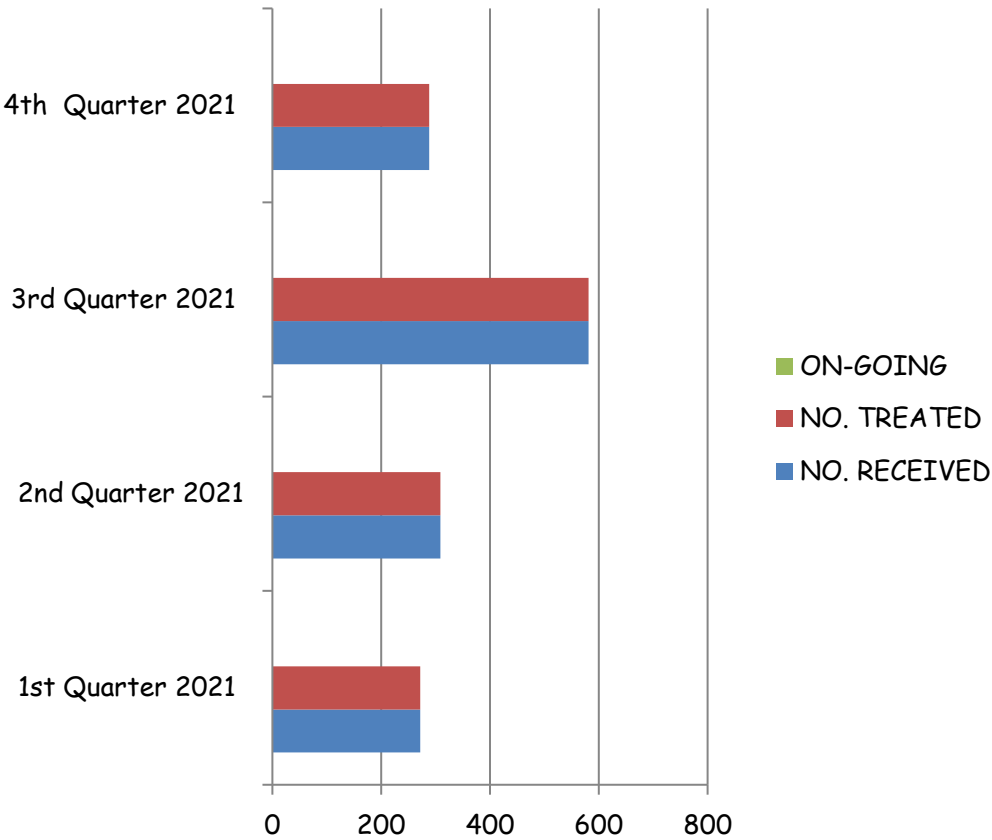
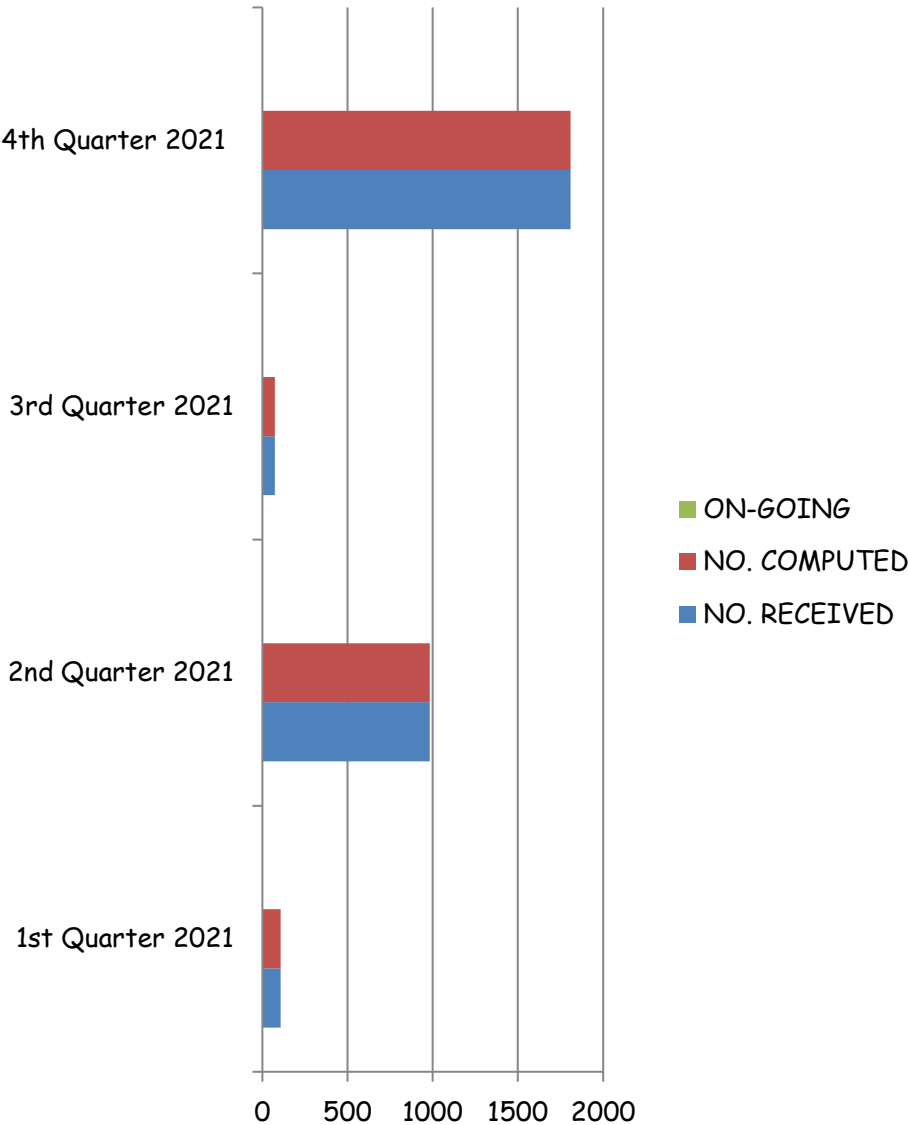

Chart 8: RTC Cases and Medical Cases Chart illustrating Summary of Patients Attended to

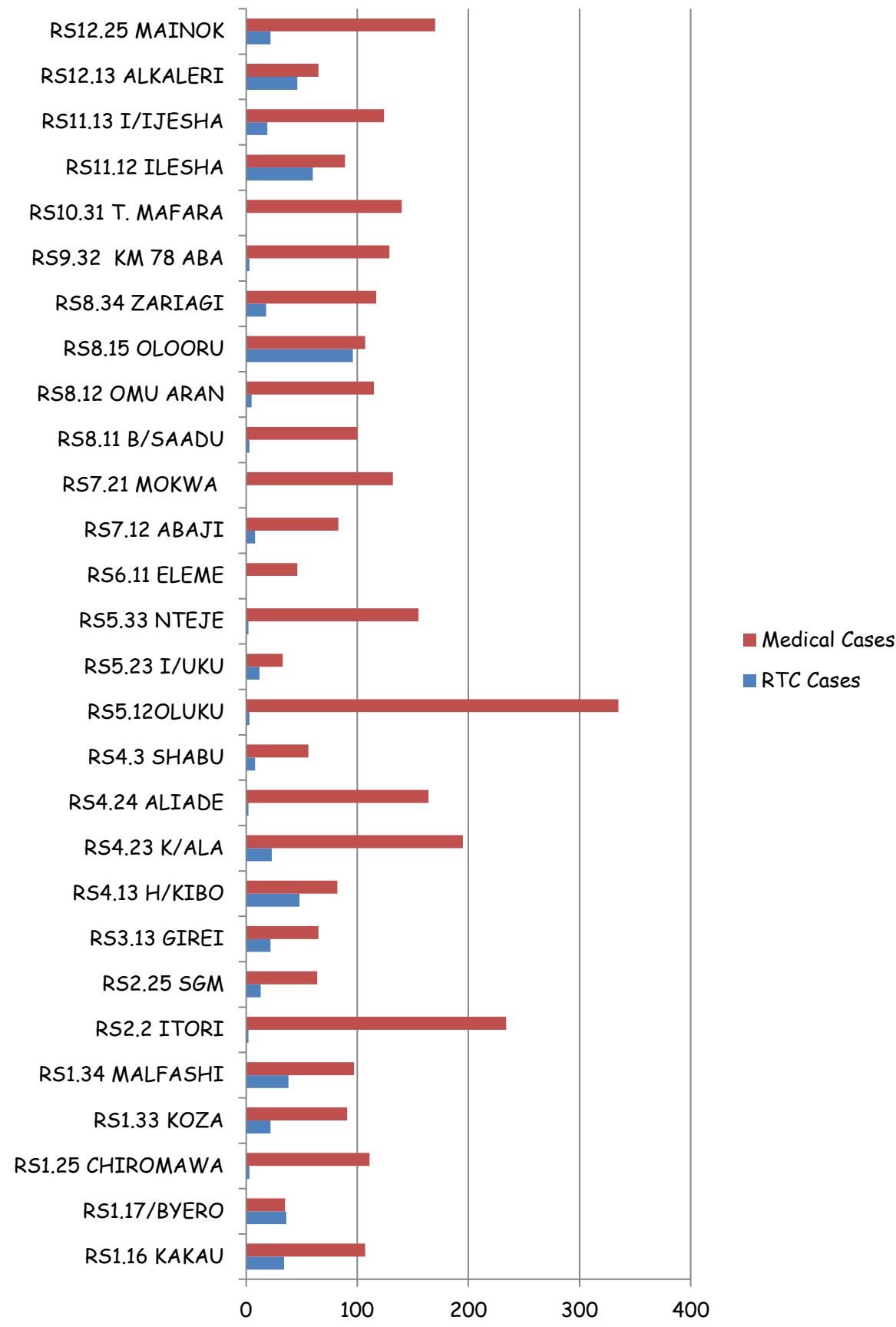

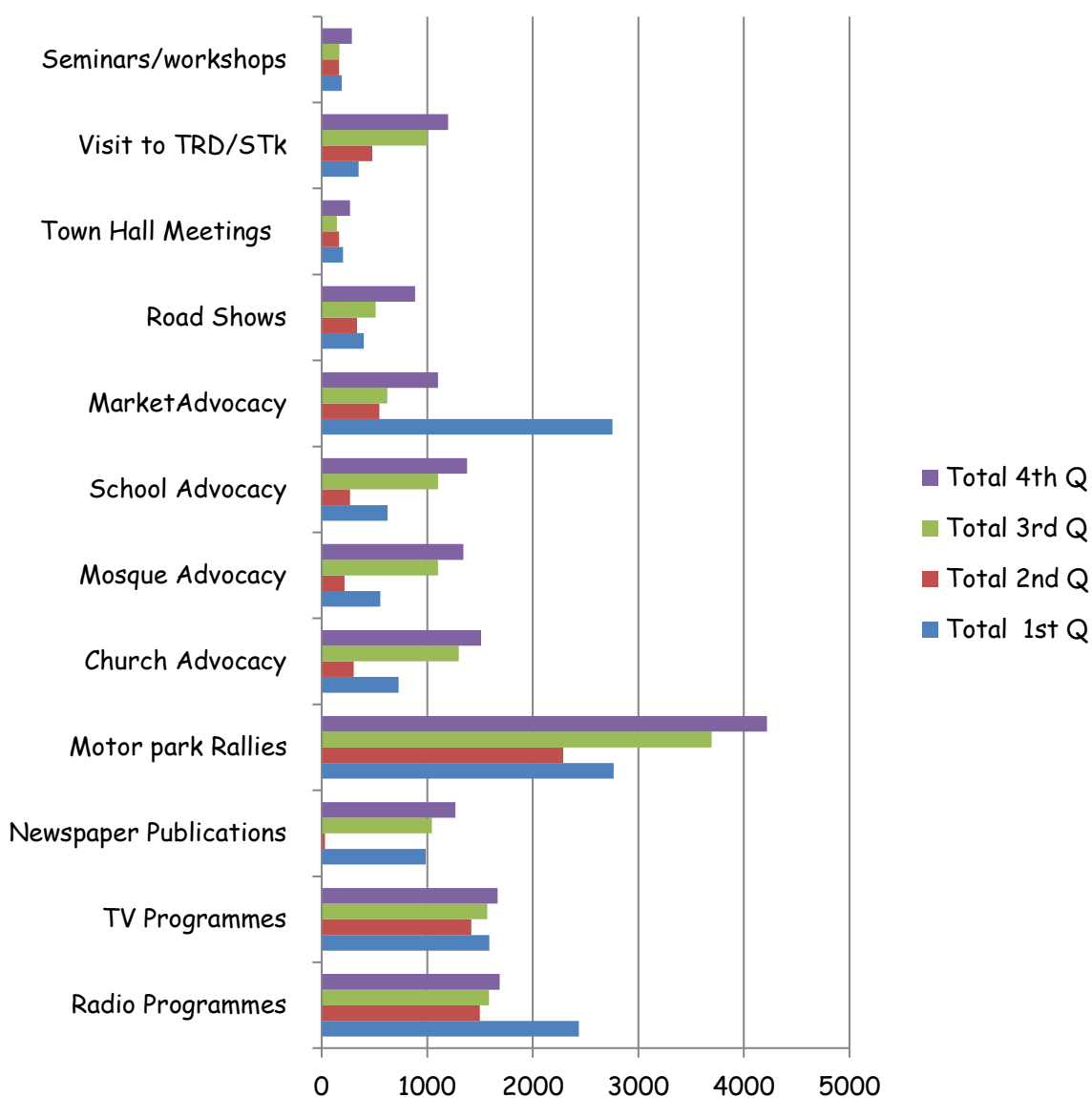

Chart 10: Summary Of RTC Involving Fleet Operators

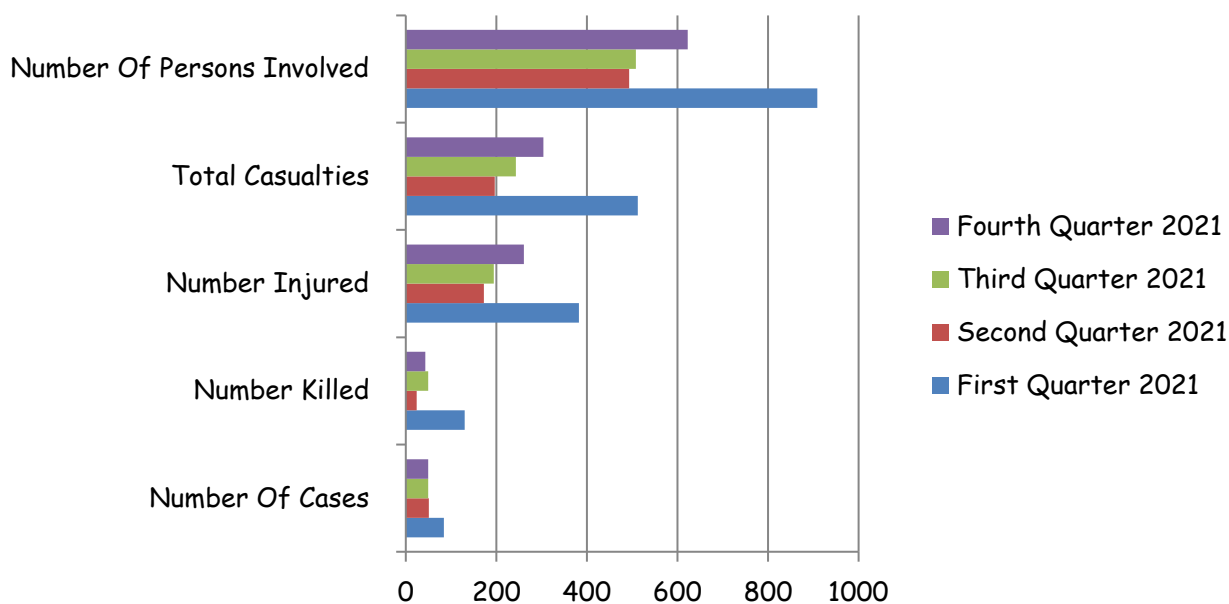

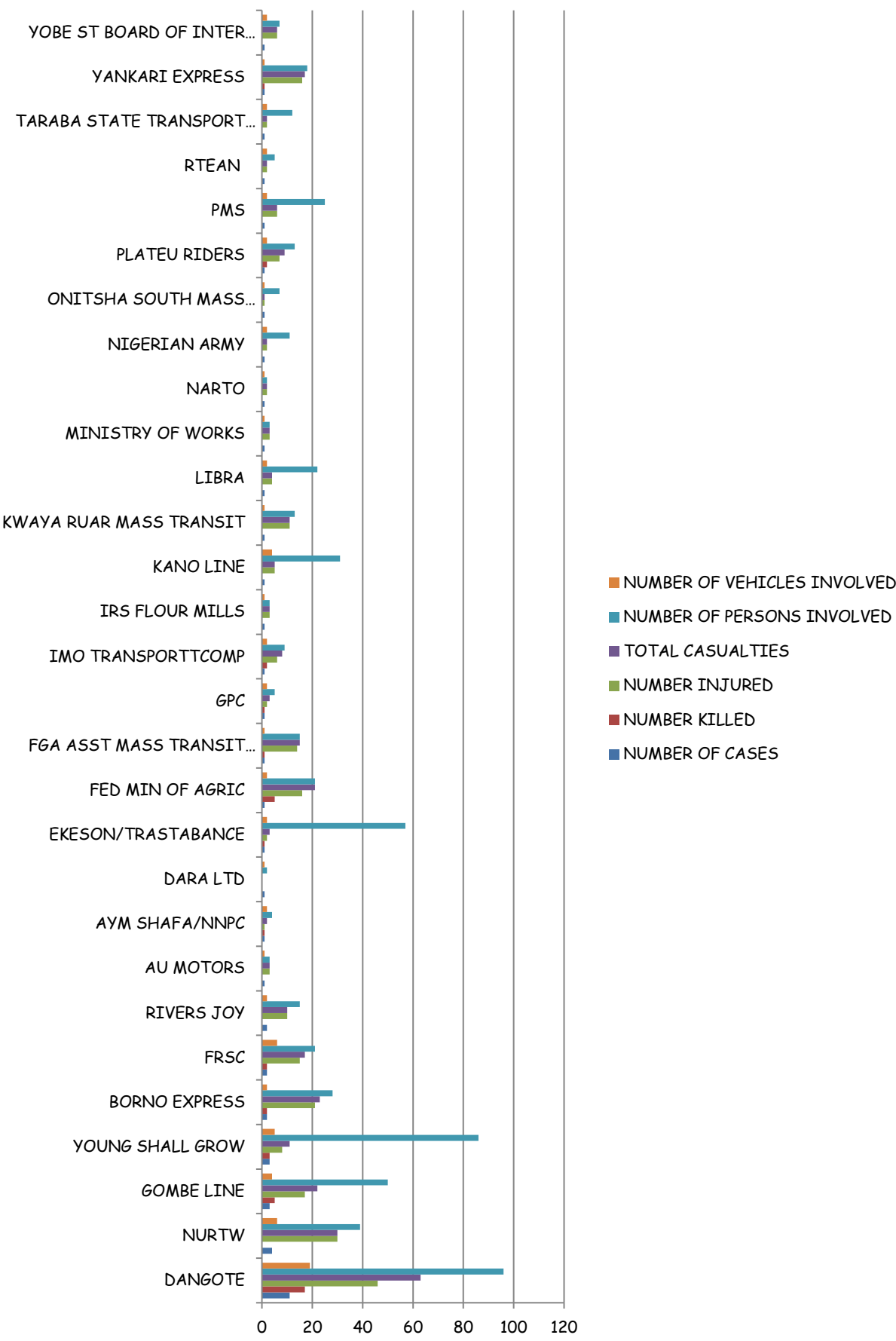
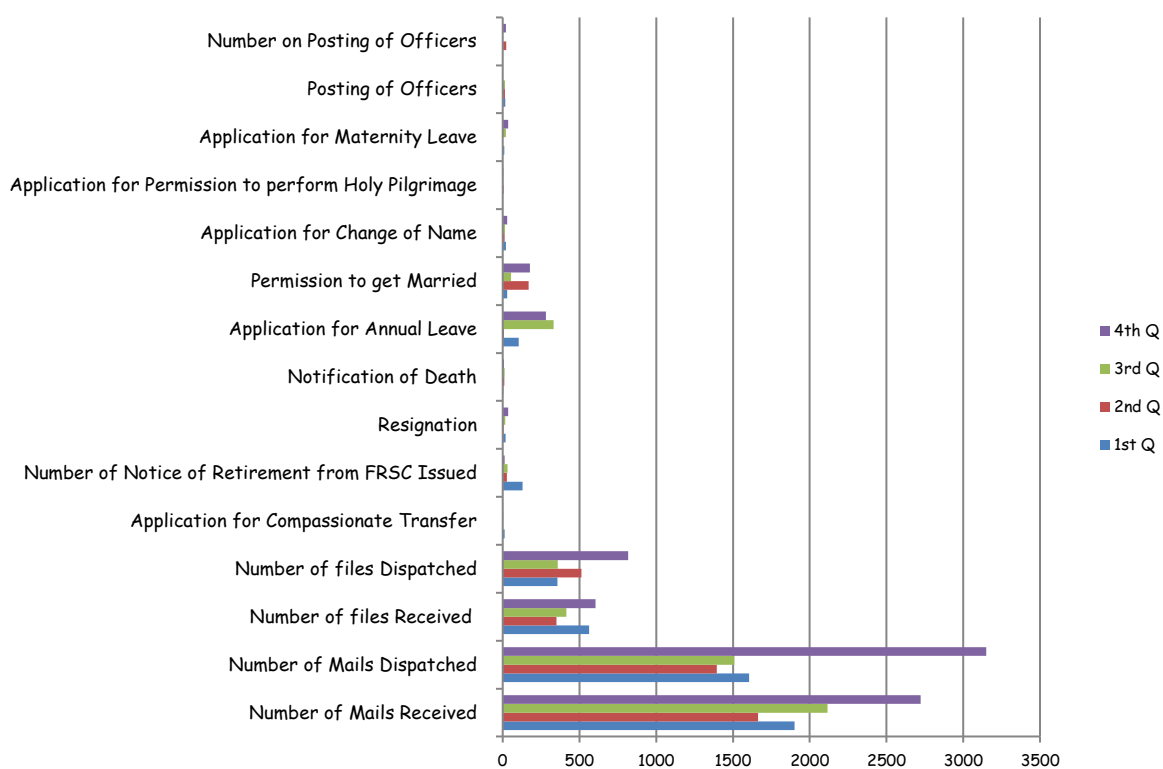

Chart 12: Corps Secretary Activities

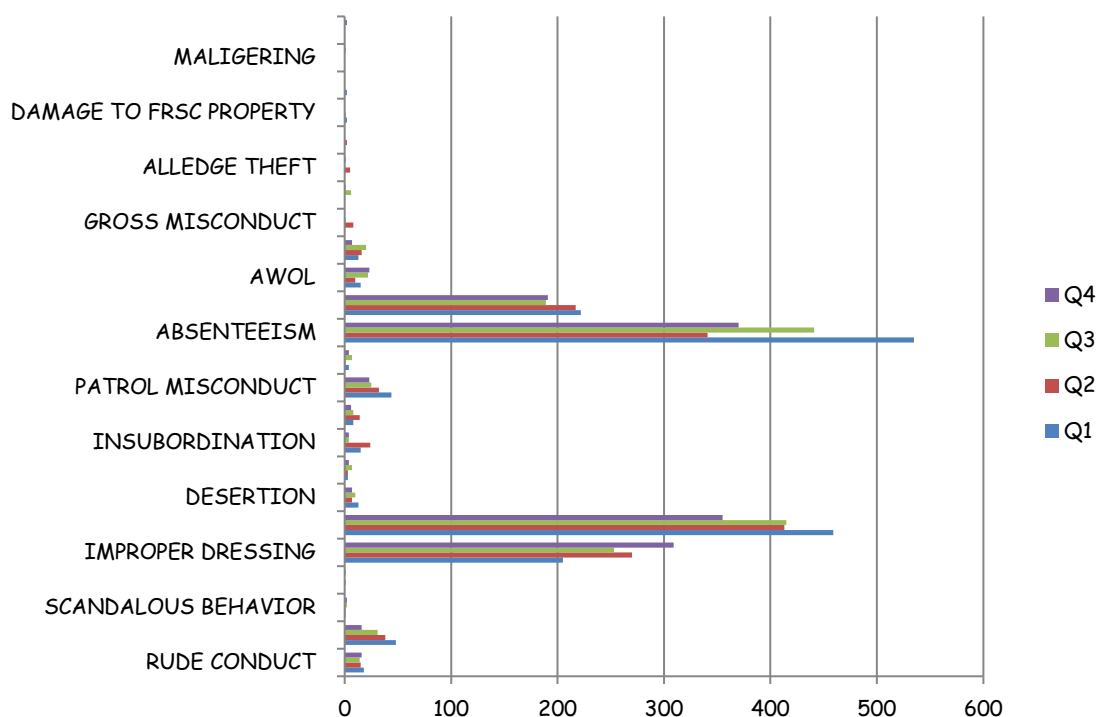

Chart 14: RTC Cases on State Basis

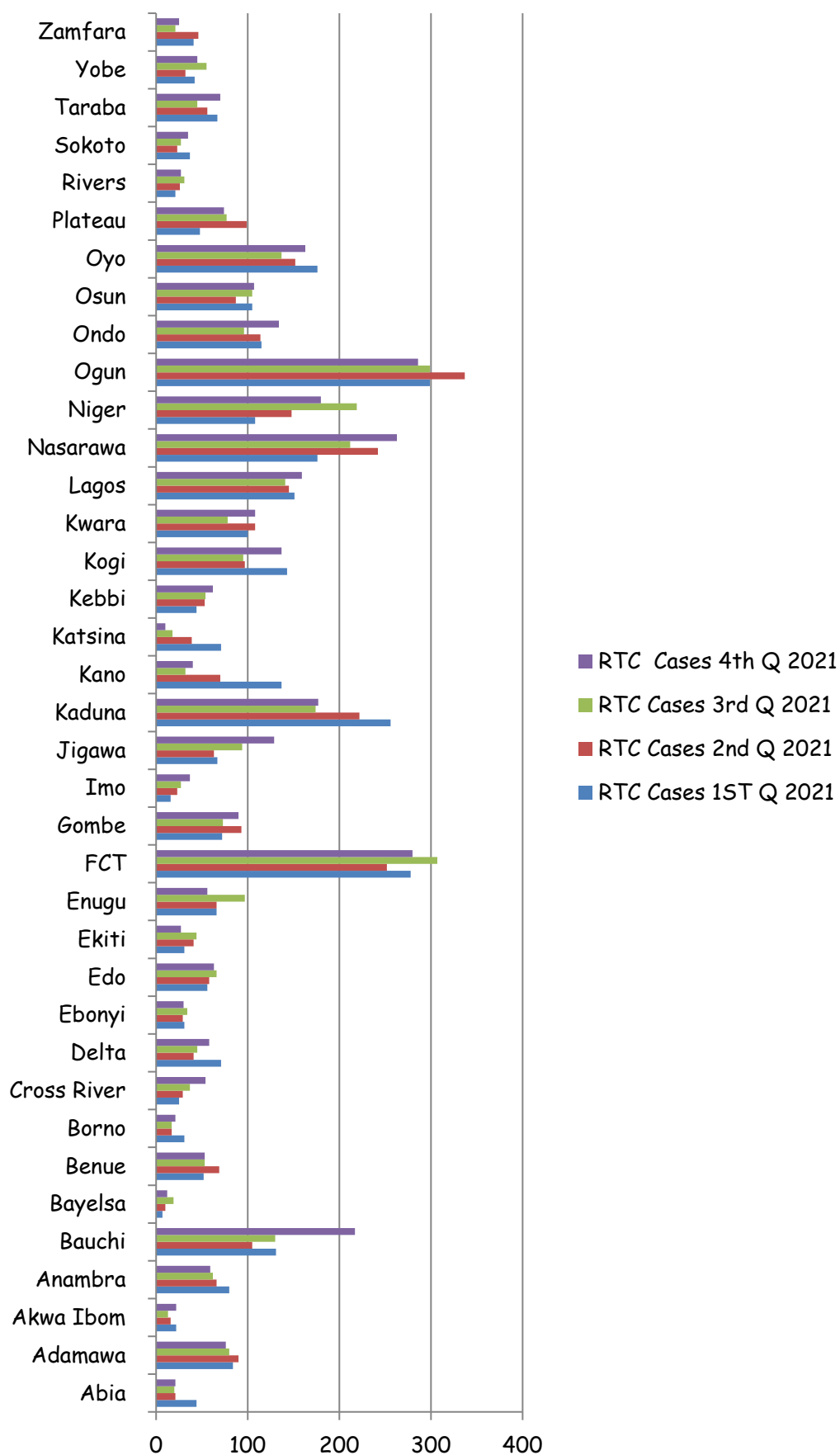

Chart 15: Number Injured

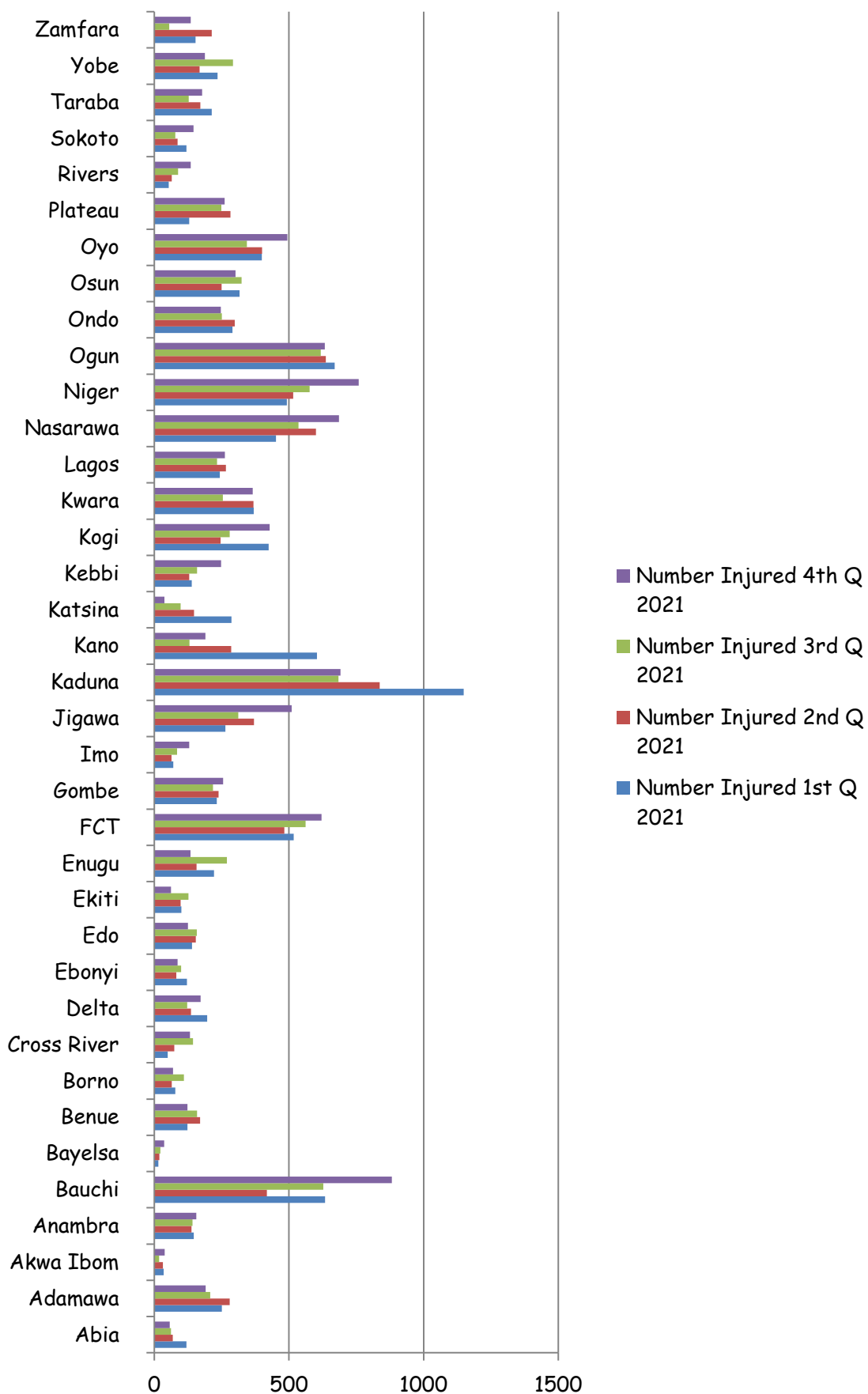

Chart 16: Number Killed on State Basis

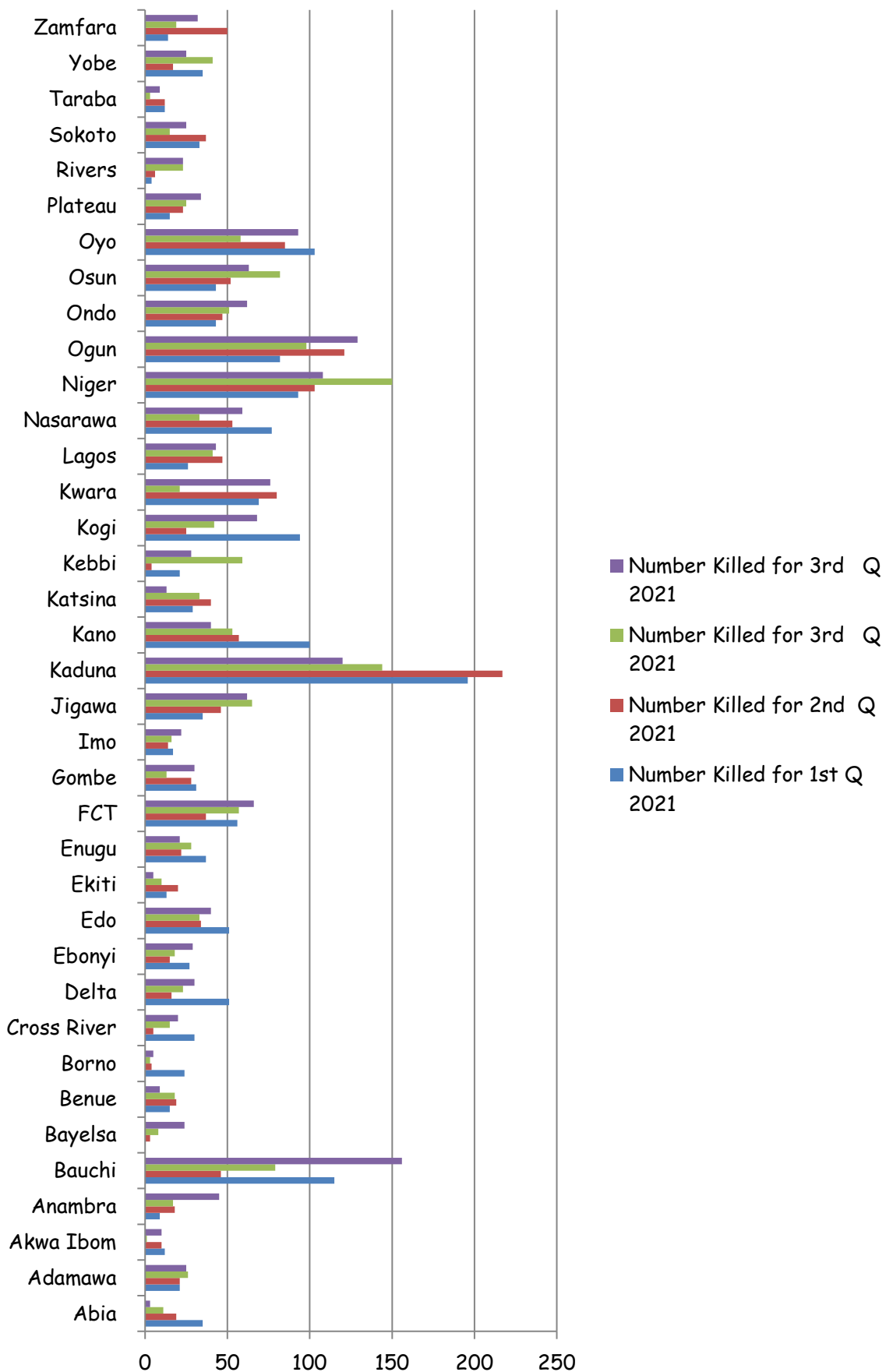
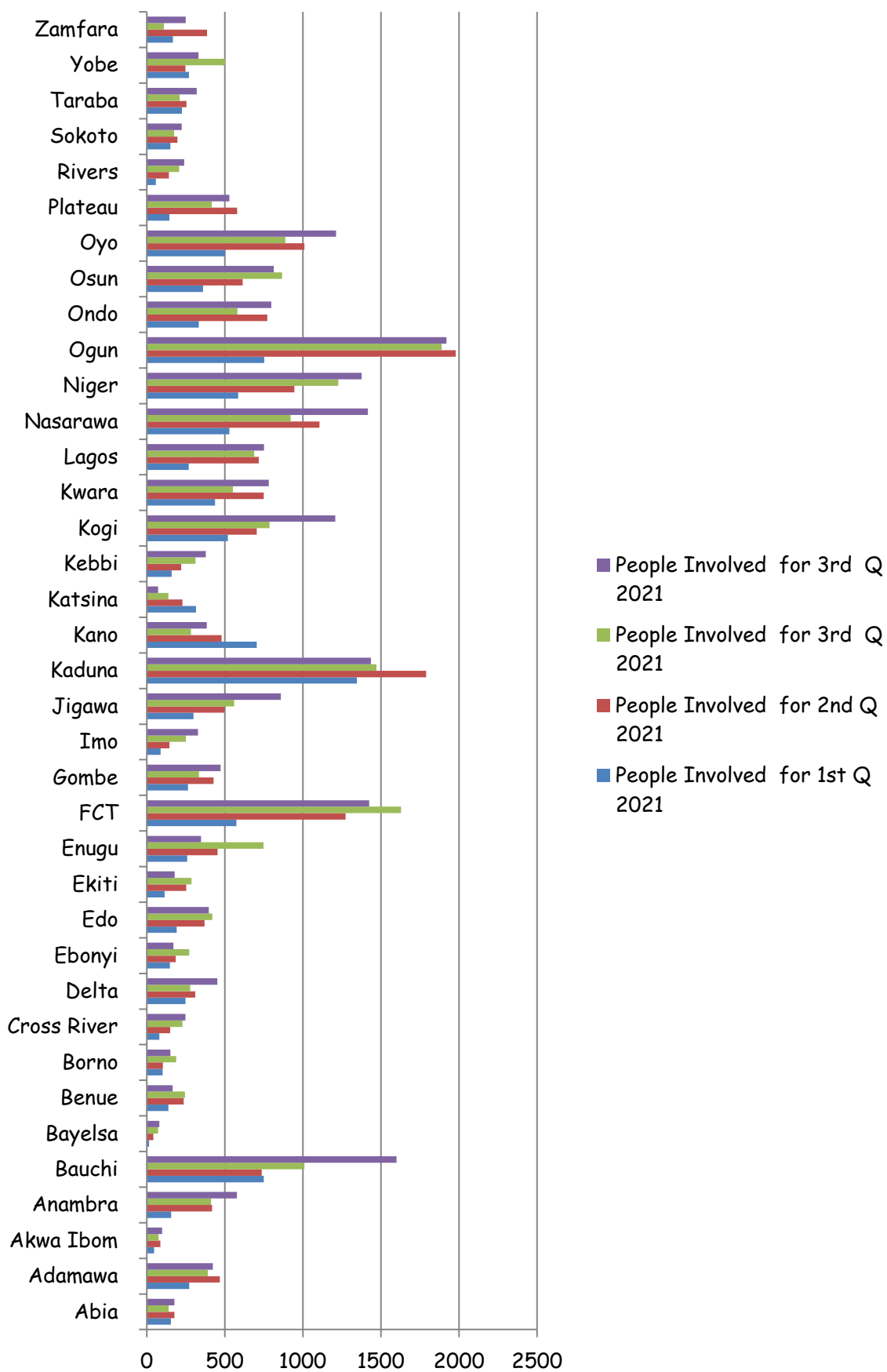

Chart 18: Partnership Analysis of Government Agencies and NGO

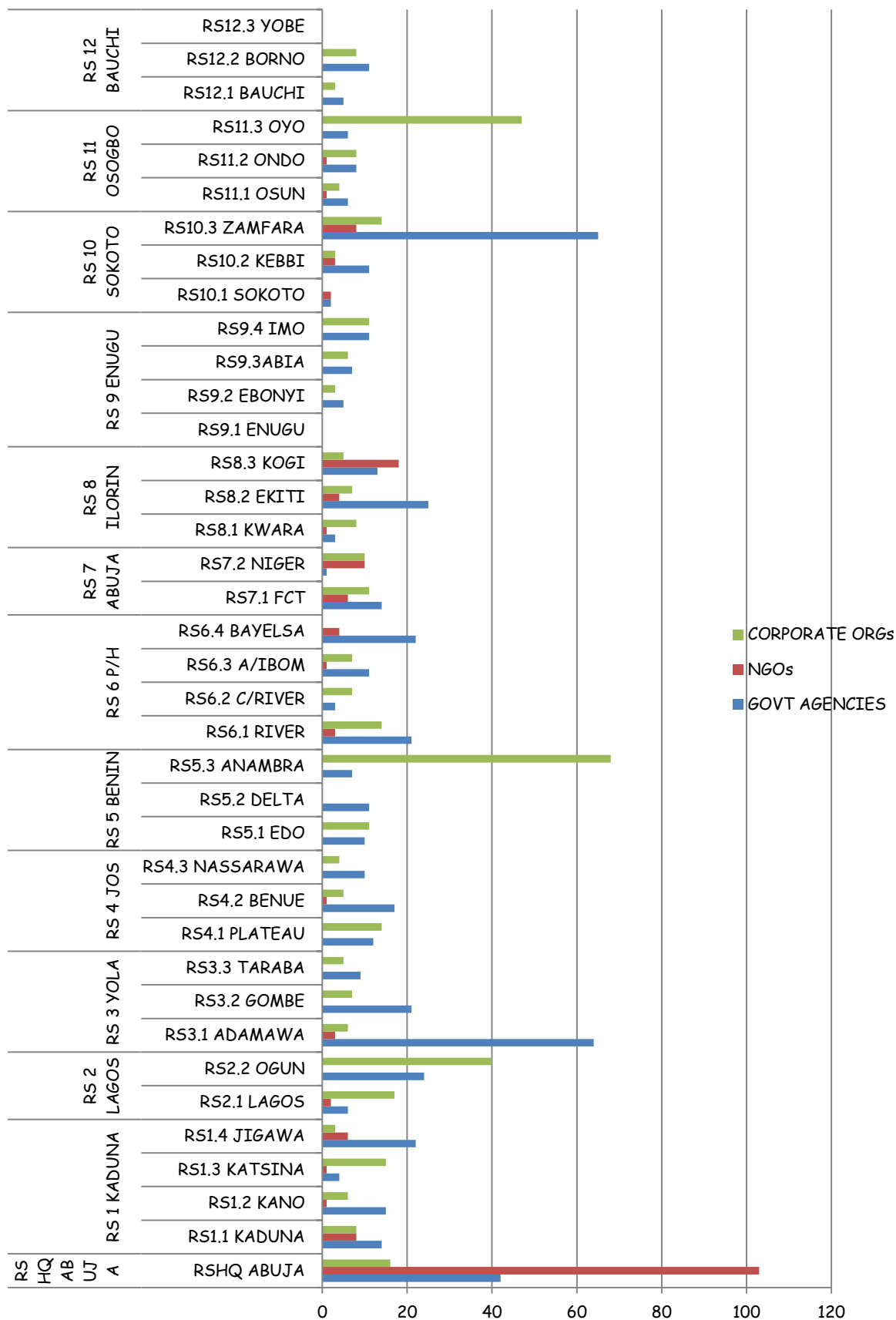

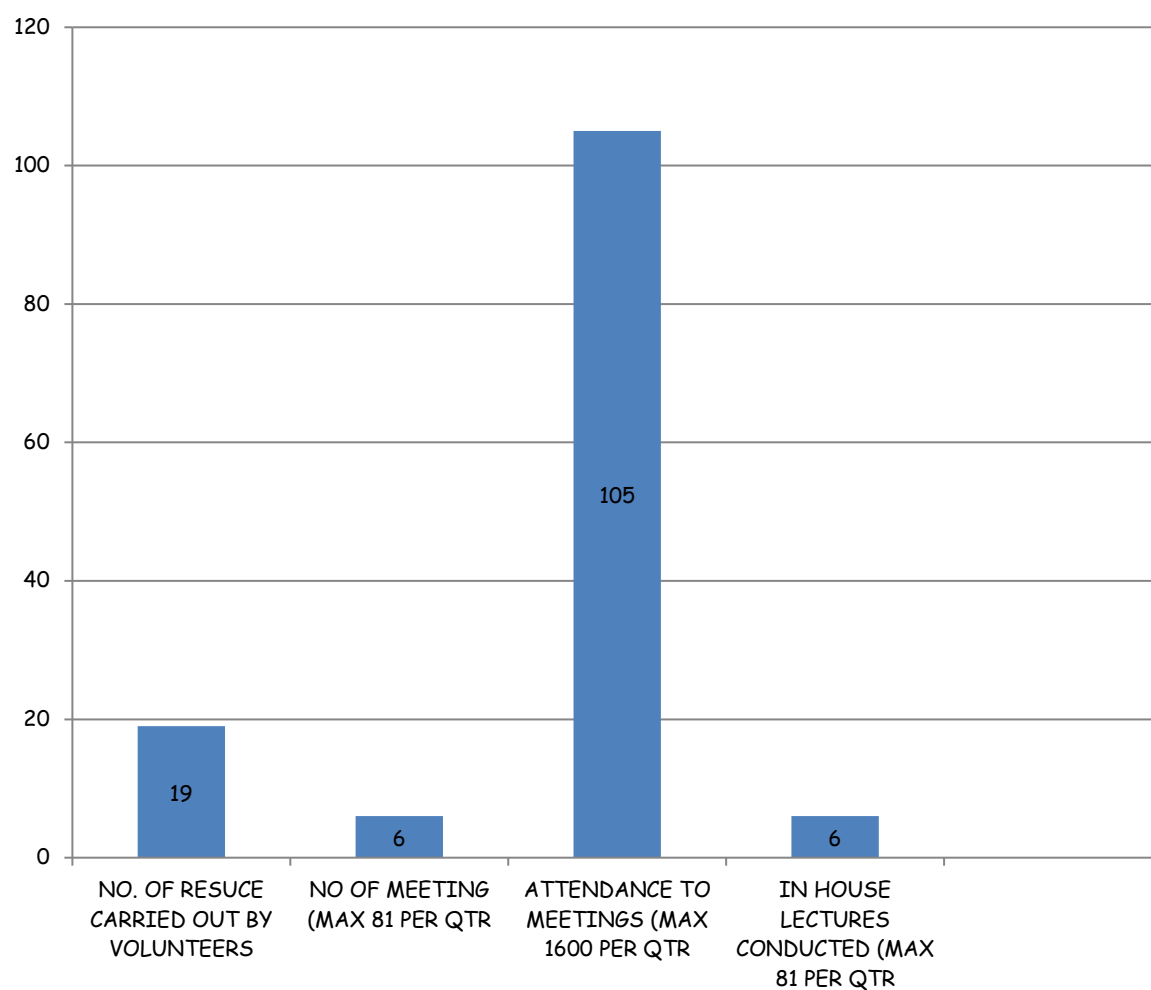

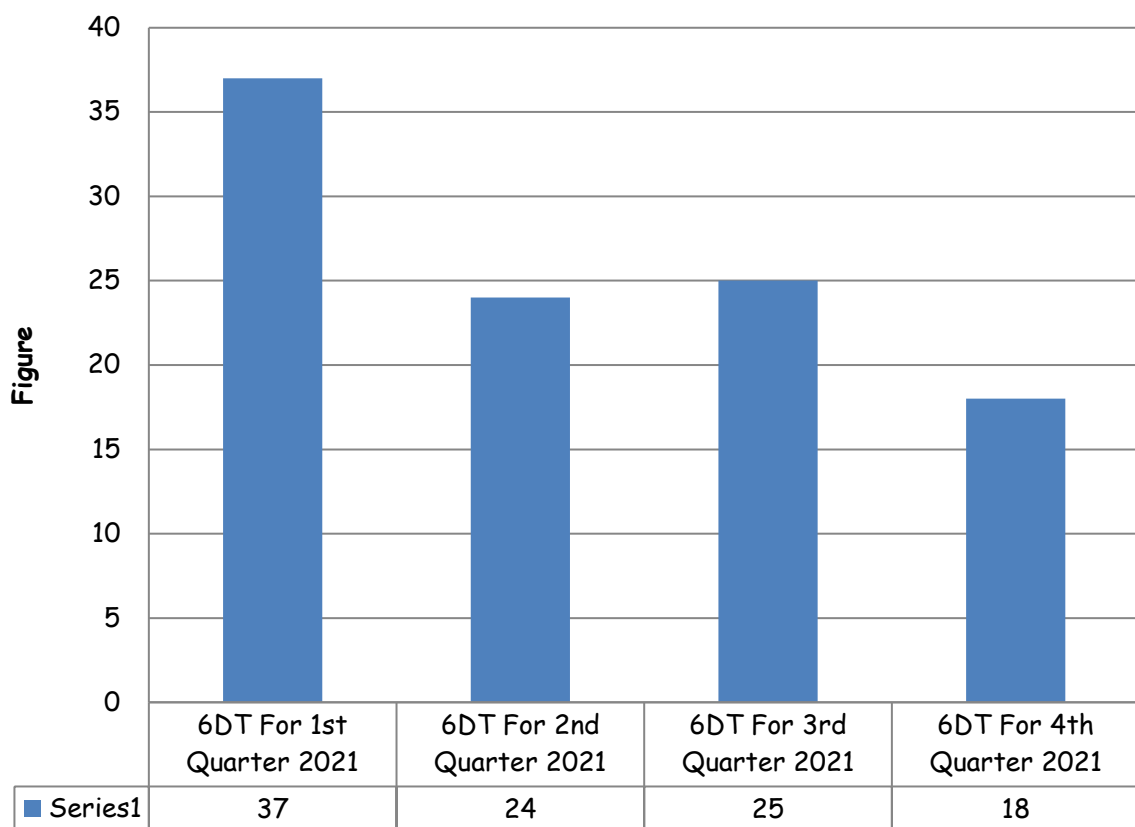
