THE 4TH UNITED NATIONS WORLD BICYCLE DAY, 3RD JUNE 2022: THEME; CYCLING FOR EARTH AND HUMANITY

The 72nd session of the United Nations General Assembly held on the 12th April 2018 resolved among others that “Acknowledging the uniqueness, longevity and versatility of the bicycle, which has been in use for two centuries, and that it is a simple, affordable, reliable, clean and environmentally fit sustainable means of transportation, fostering environmental stewardship and health, thereafter declared 3rd June, each year as World Bicycle Day”

Three previous editions were held in Abuja and across the Federation Nigeria in 2018, 2019 and 2021 respectively, the 2020 edition could not hold as a result of the corona virus pandemic. The Federal Road Safety Corps hosted this in collaboration with the Cycling Federation of Nigeria, and support of the Indian High Commission to Nigeria. The theme for this 4th edition is “**Cycling for Earth and Humanity**”.

It encourages stakeholders to work together to advance the use of the bicycle as a means of strengthening education, enabling children and young people of school age to ride bicycle to school, older persons, women and other residents being able to explore their neighborhood riding bicycle; to work distance, to markets, and other places of endeavor

The event further emphasize the bicycles as promoting health, preventing disease, promoting tolerance with a sense of community, mutual understanding and respect and facilitating social inclusion. No mode of transport promotes the culture of serenity, order, friendly neighborhood and urban peace as the bicycle does which brings us to this year's theme “Cycling for Earth and Humanity”. It is the only individual means of mobility fit for all residents irrespective of age, gender and class, and the best mode for social distancing in a pandemic era, We urge all stakeholders to expedite action and the general public to take up cycling as a means of commuting within reasonable distance from their residence to work and other places of endeavor to reduce traffic congestion, pollution and urban noise, improve their health and reduce the cost of transportation.

Chart 1: Chart Illustrating War on Critical Offences

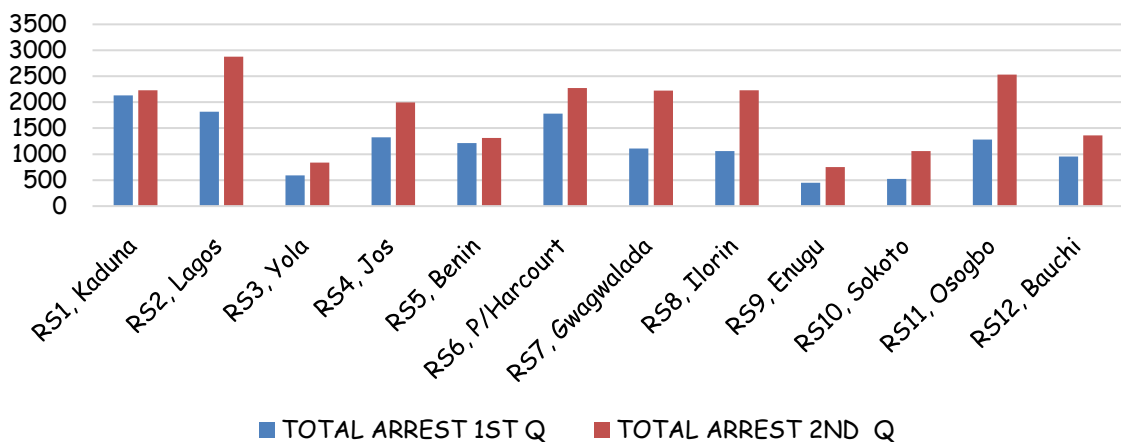
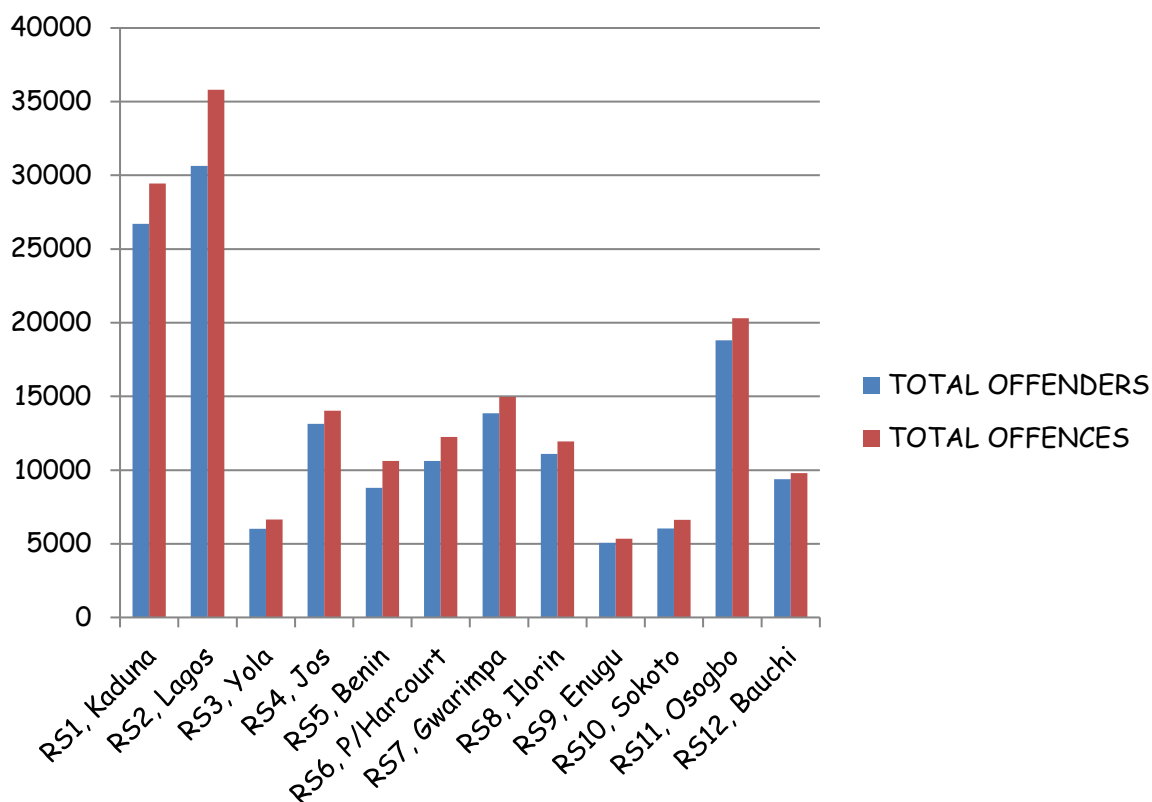

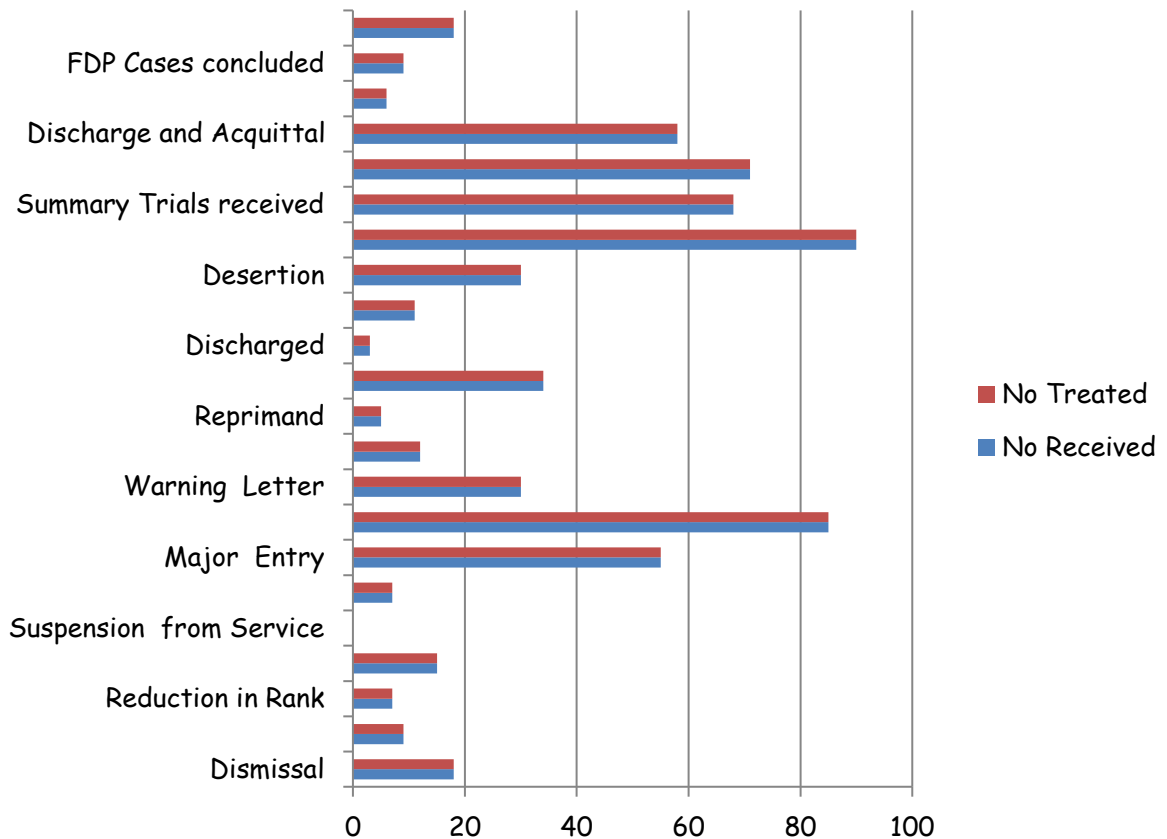

Chart 4: Chart Illustrating Requests For Variation Of Staff Salaries (Officers)

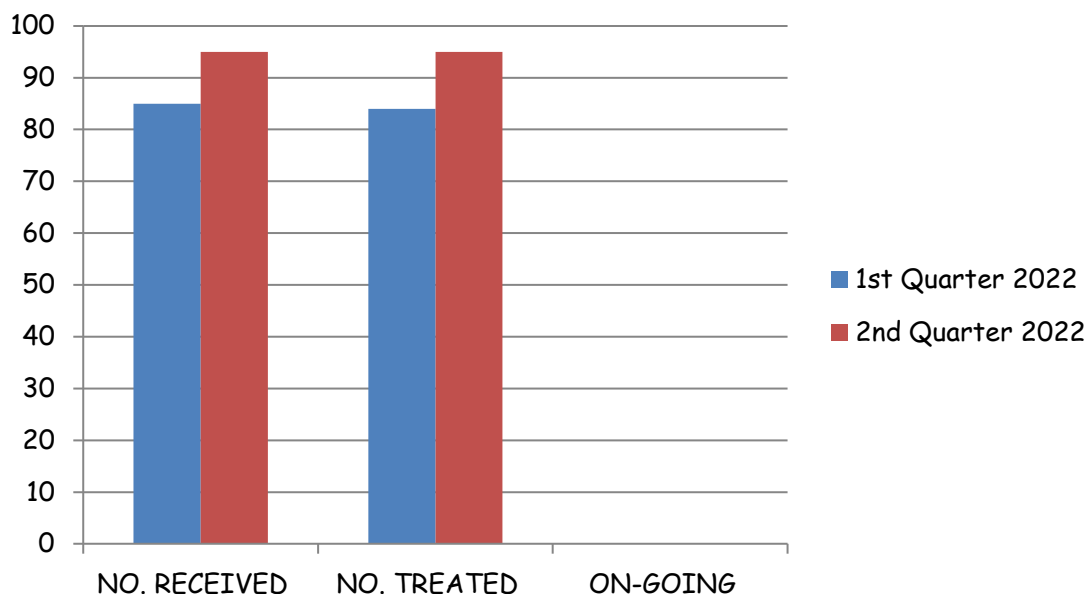

Chart 5: Incoming Requests For Variation Of Staff Salaries (Marshals)

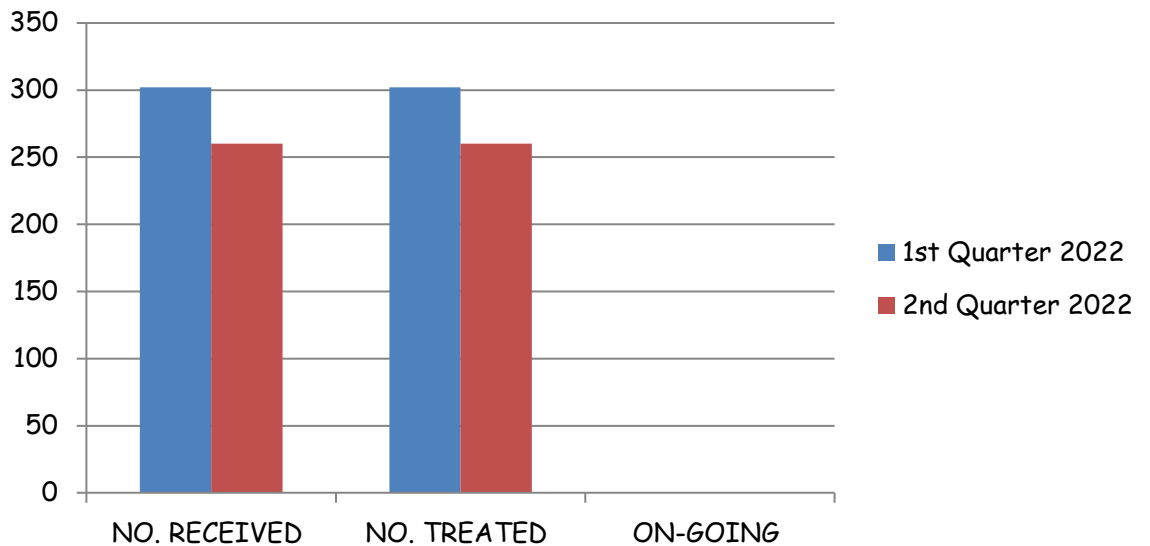
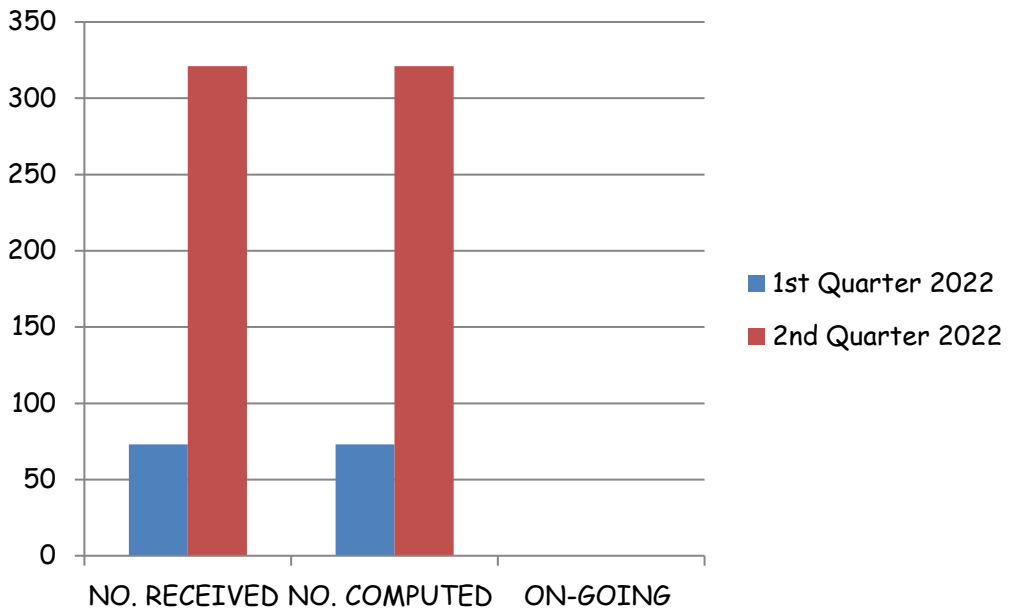

Chart 7: National Driver License production

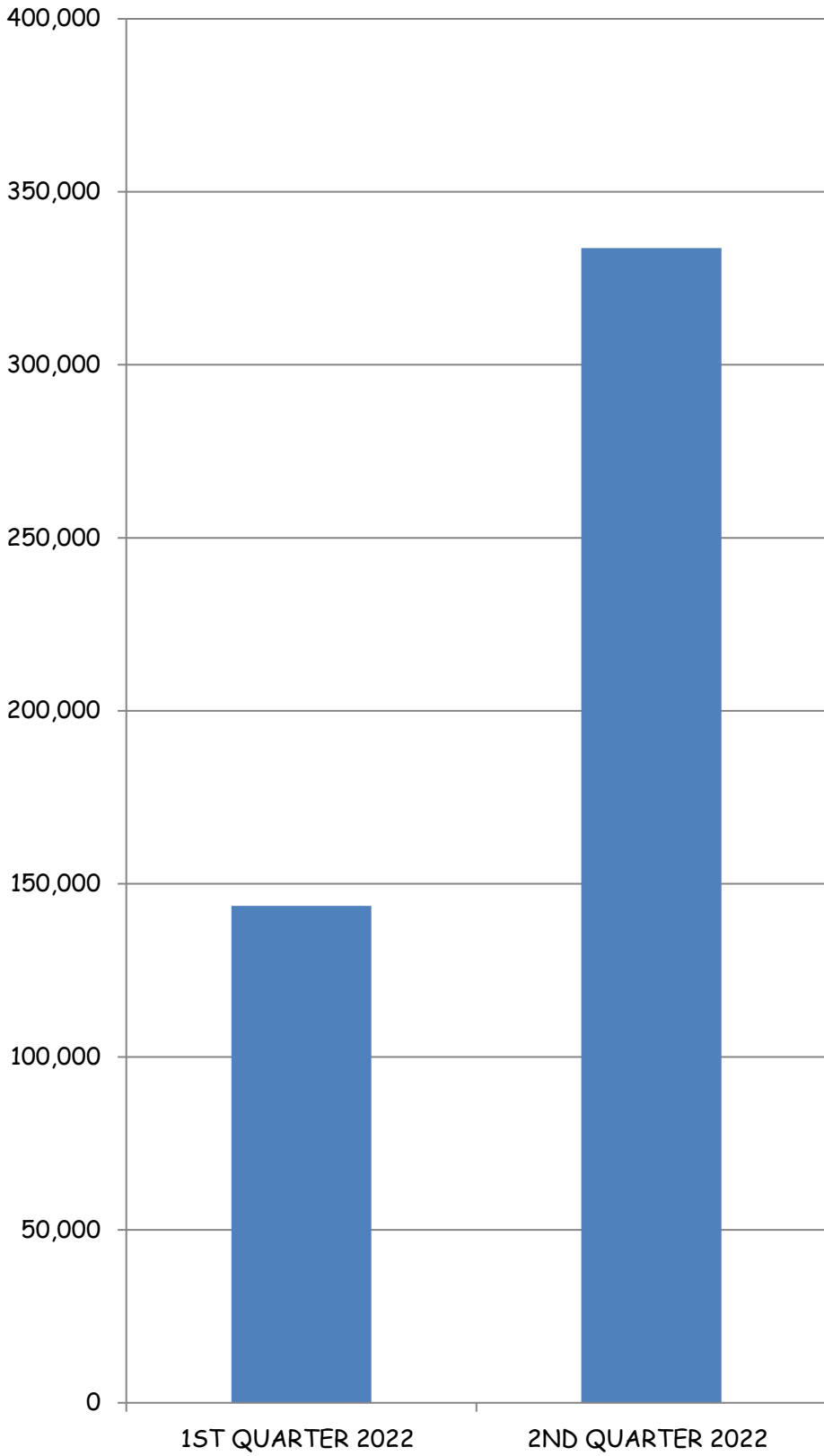
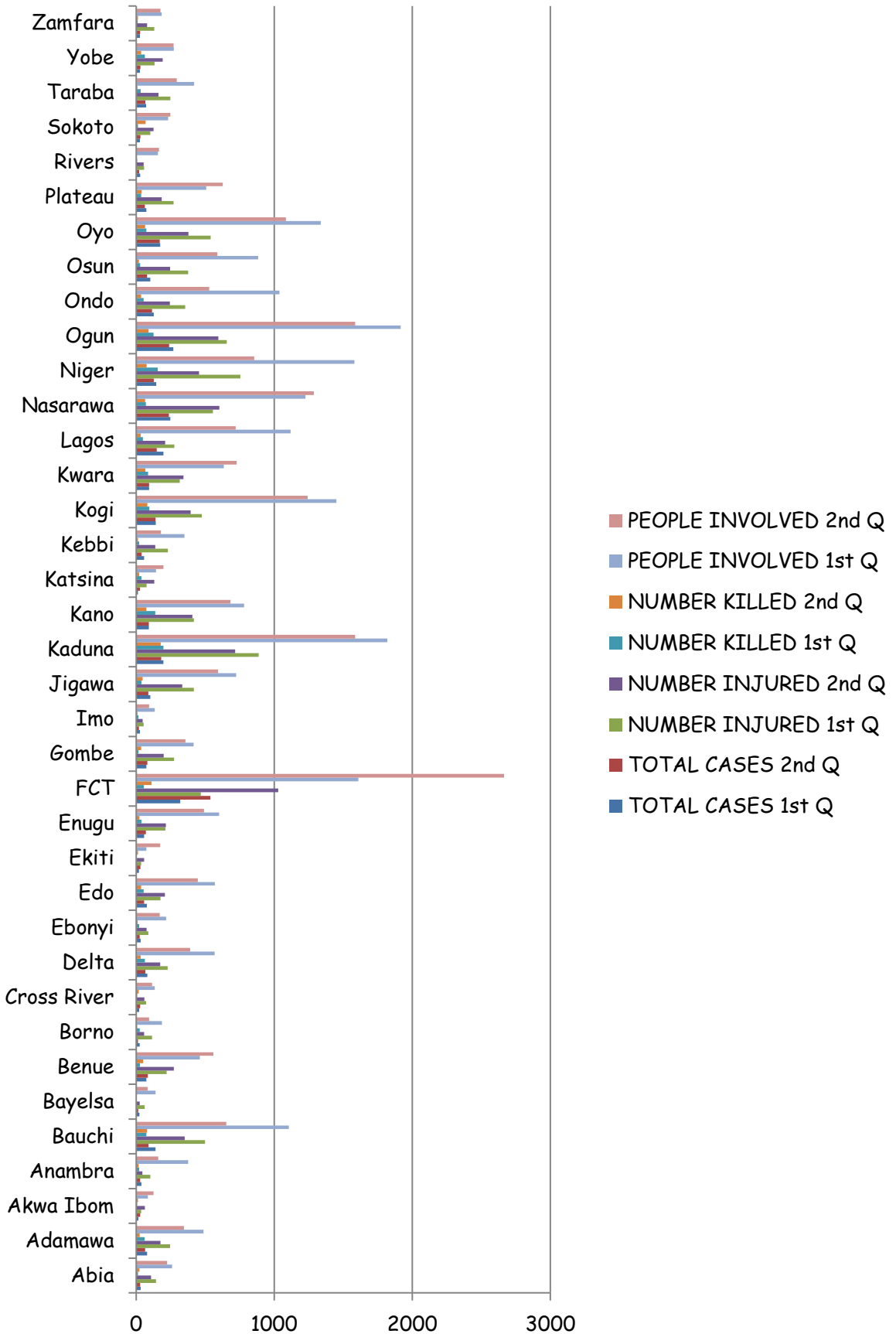

Chart 16: Partnership Analysis of Government Agencies and NGO

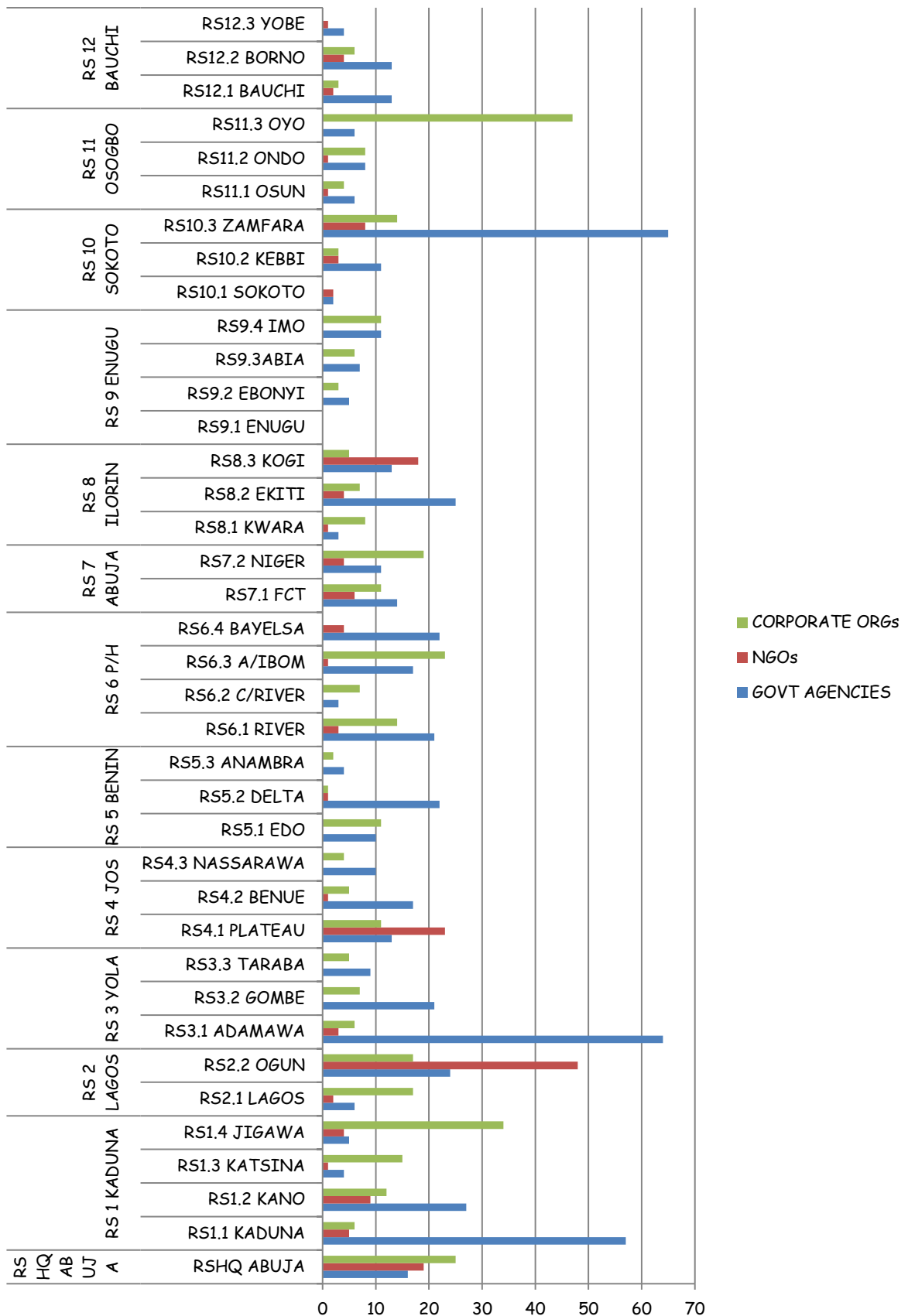
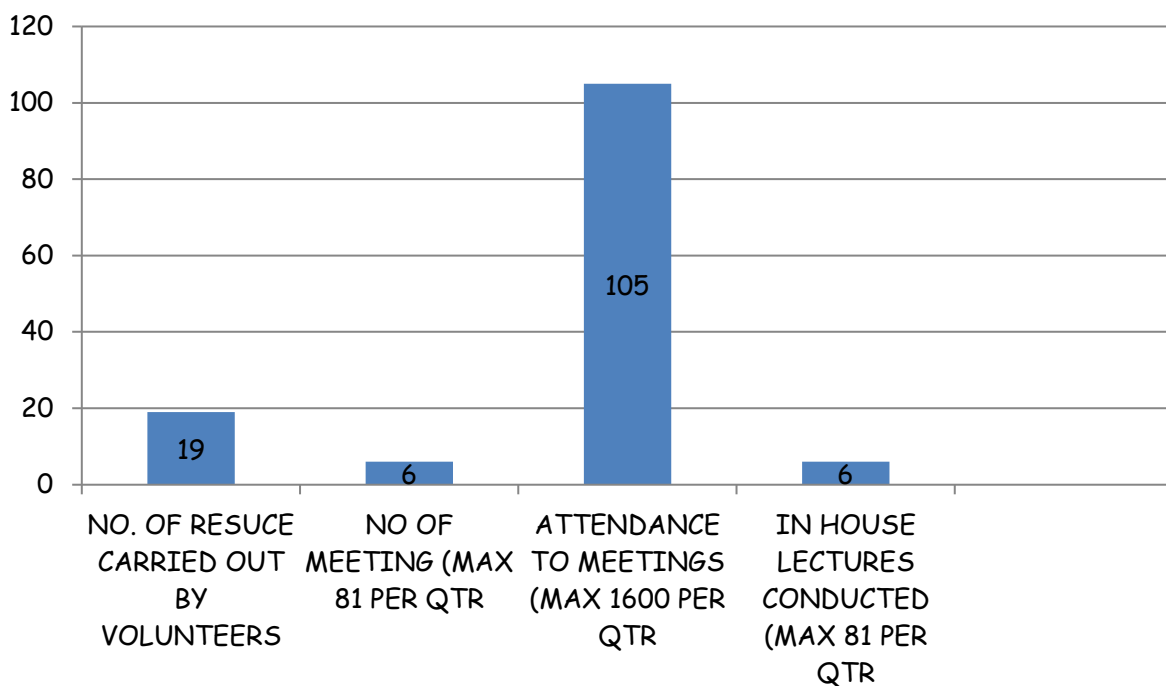

Chart 8: RTC Cases and Medical Cases Chart illustrating Summary of Patients Attended to

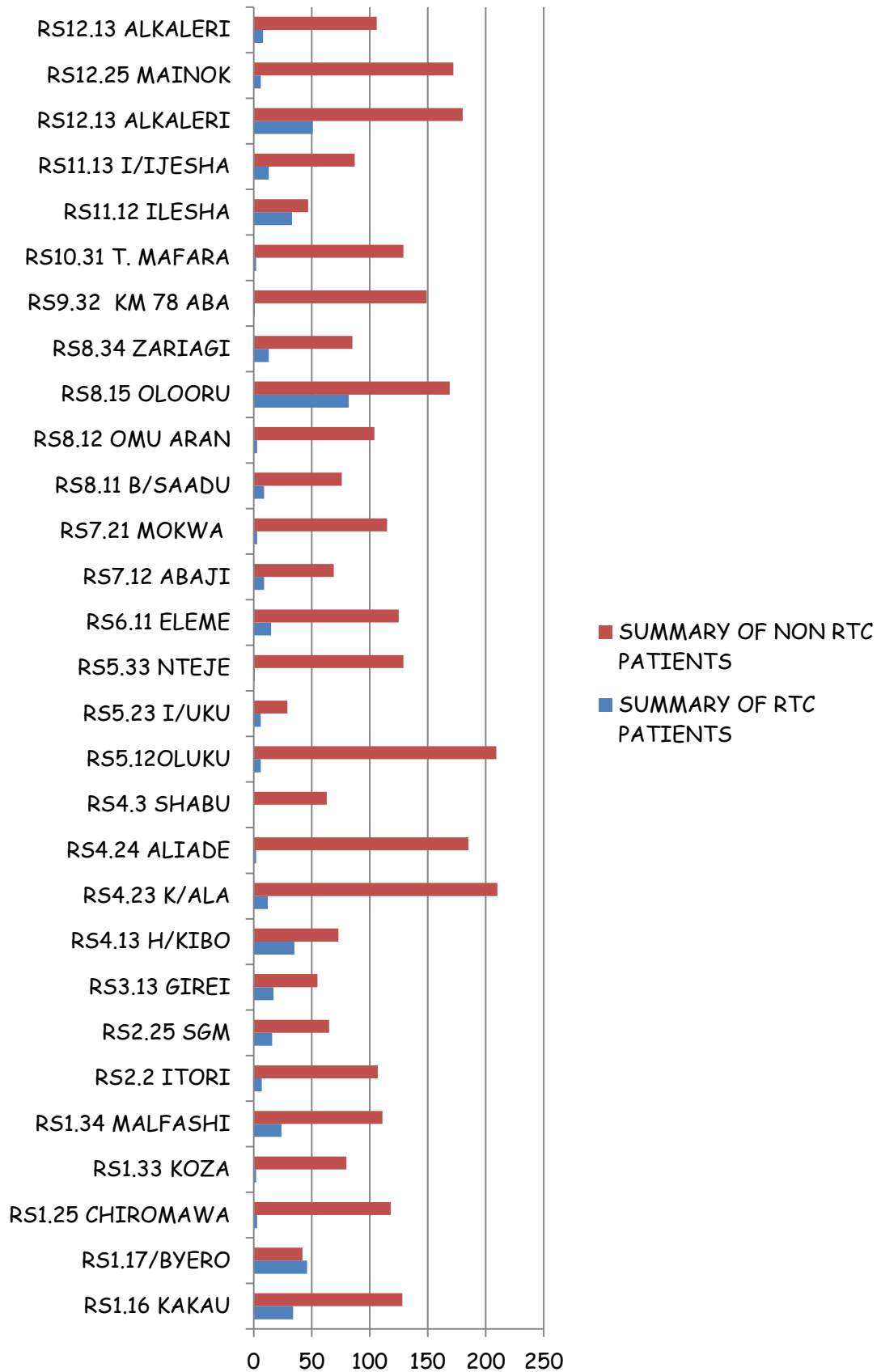

CHART 9: EMERGENCY AMBULANCE SERVICE SCHEME (AKA ZEBRA)

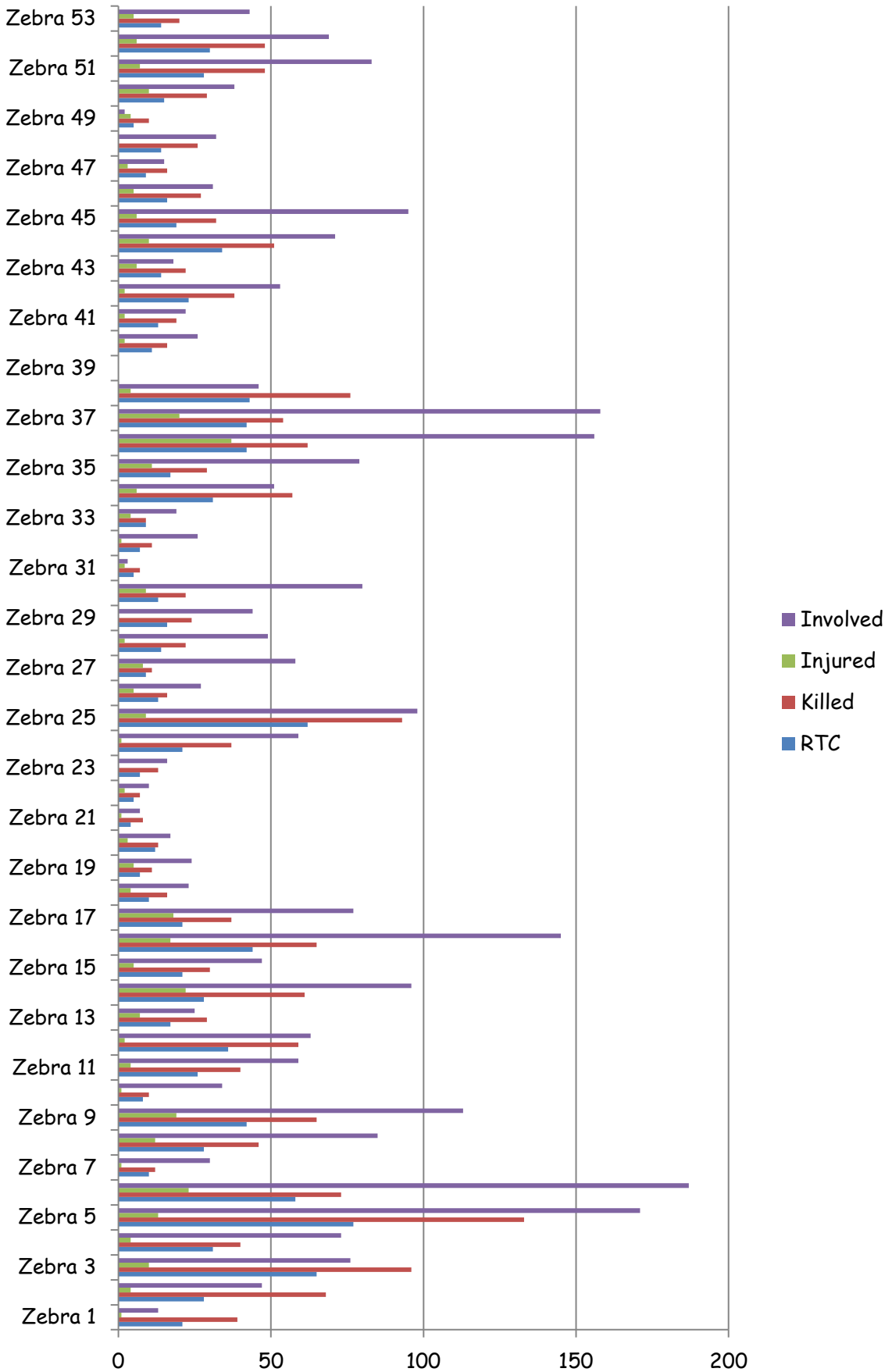

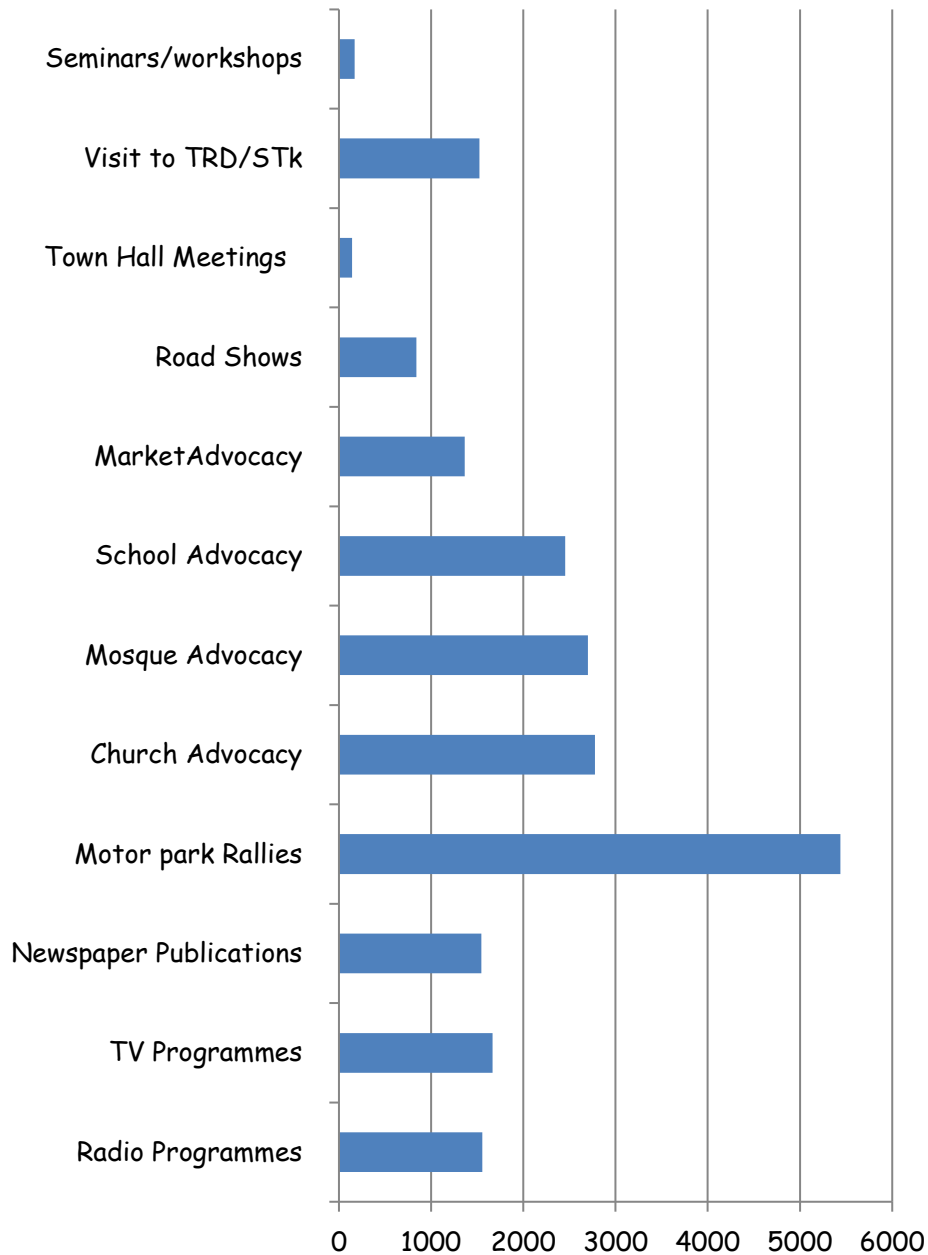

Chart 11: Summary Of RTC Involving Fleet Operators

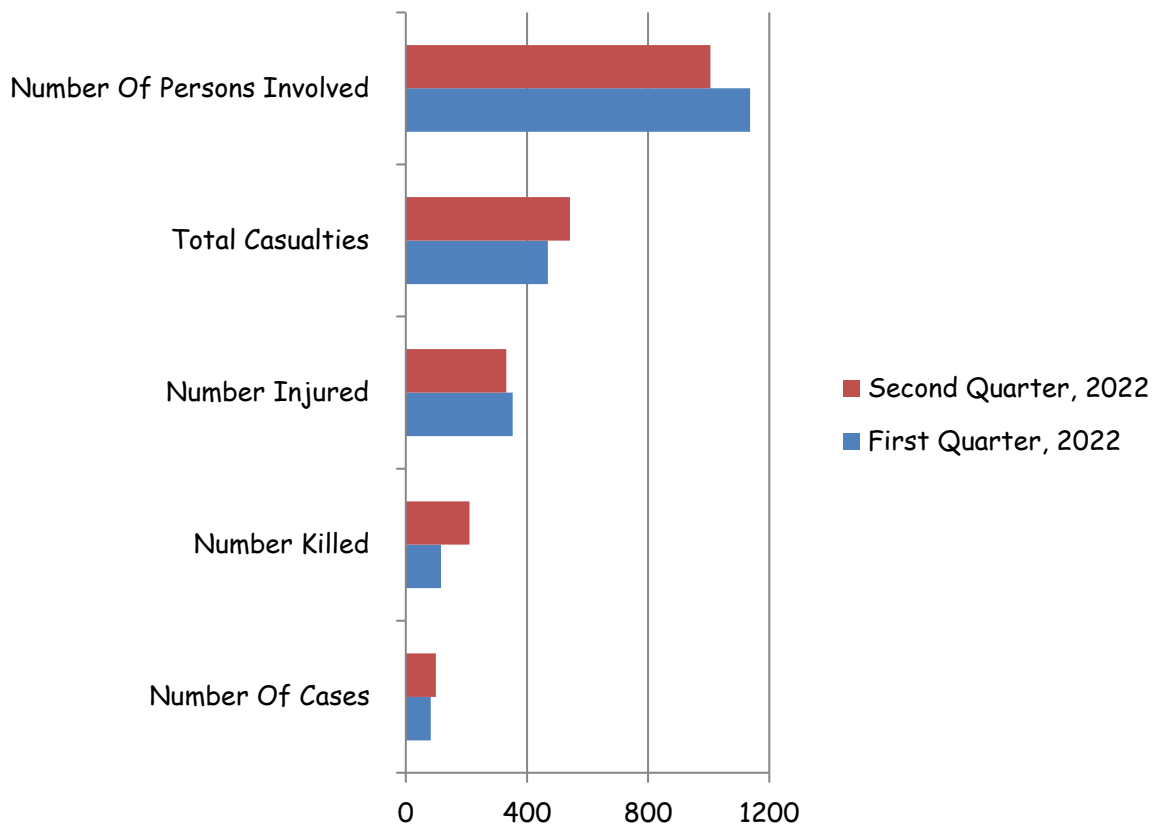
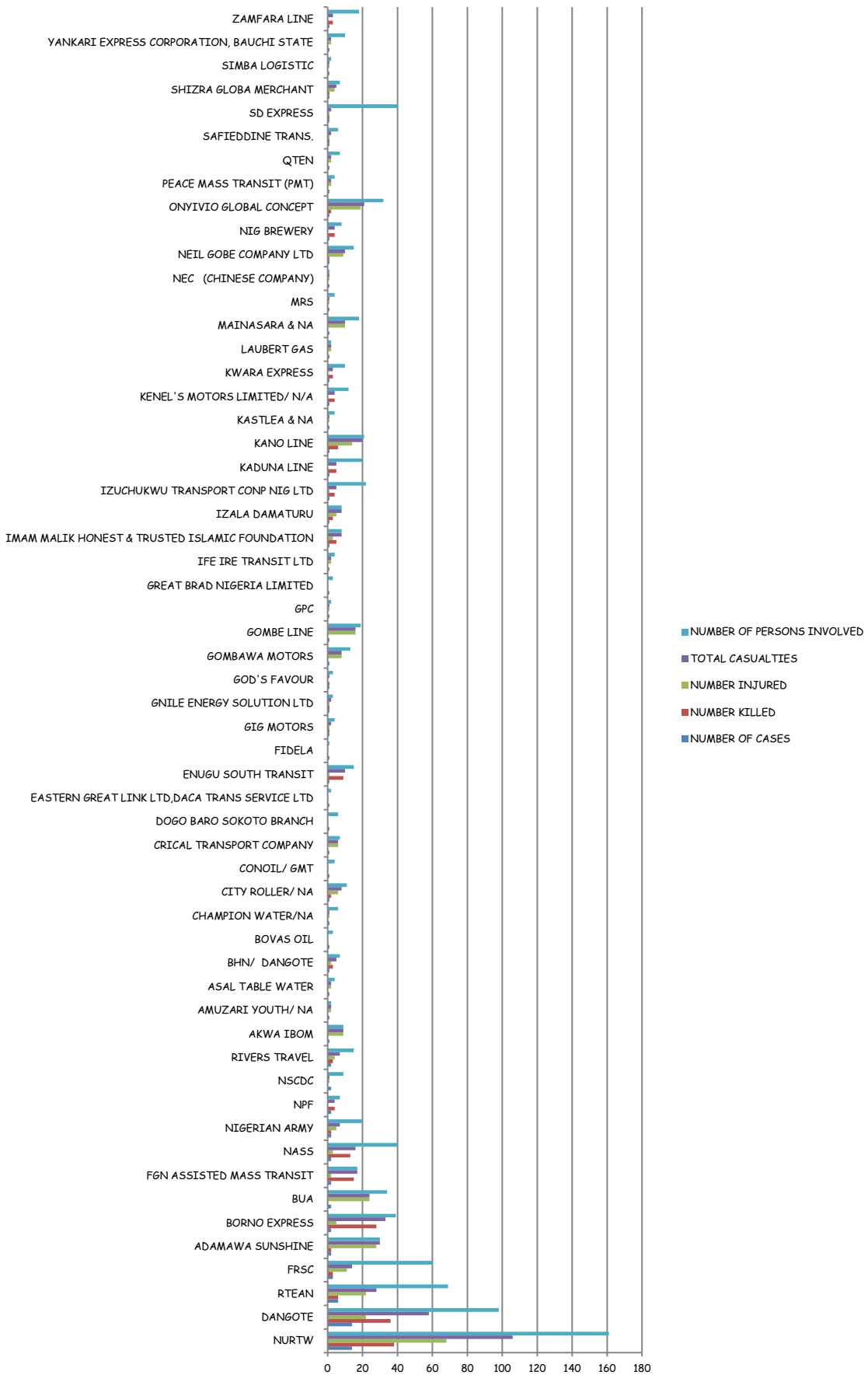

Chart 12: Summary Of RTC Involving Fleet Operators



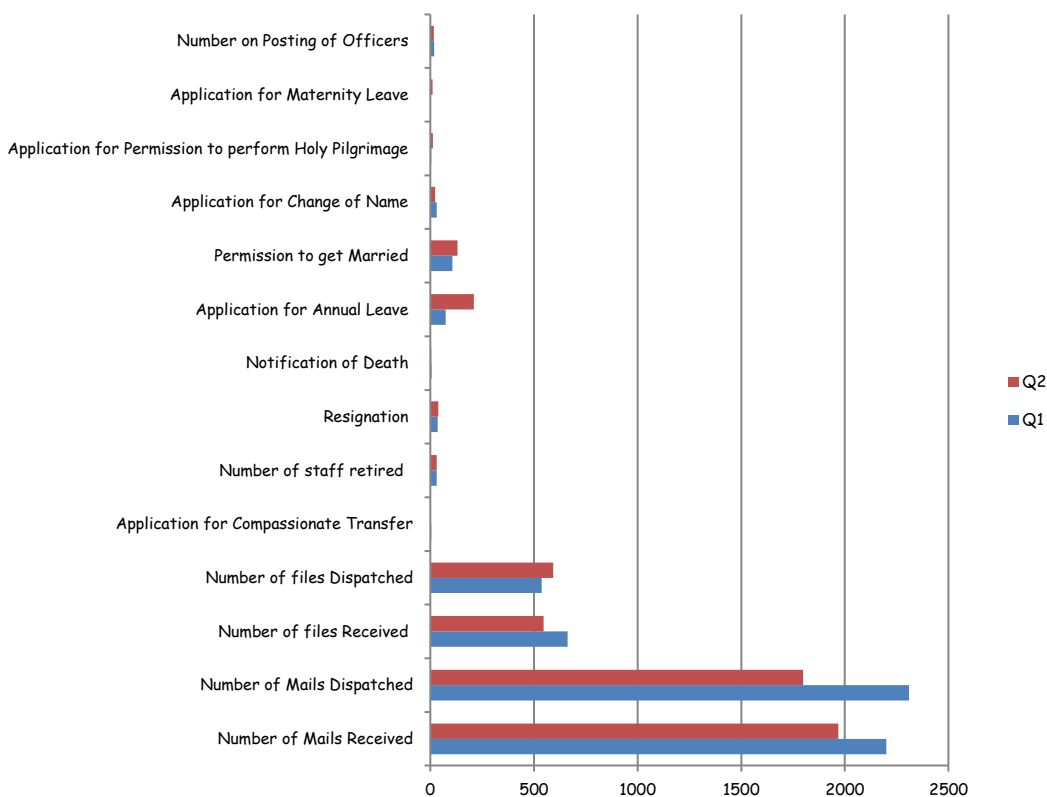

Chart 13: Corps Secretary Activities

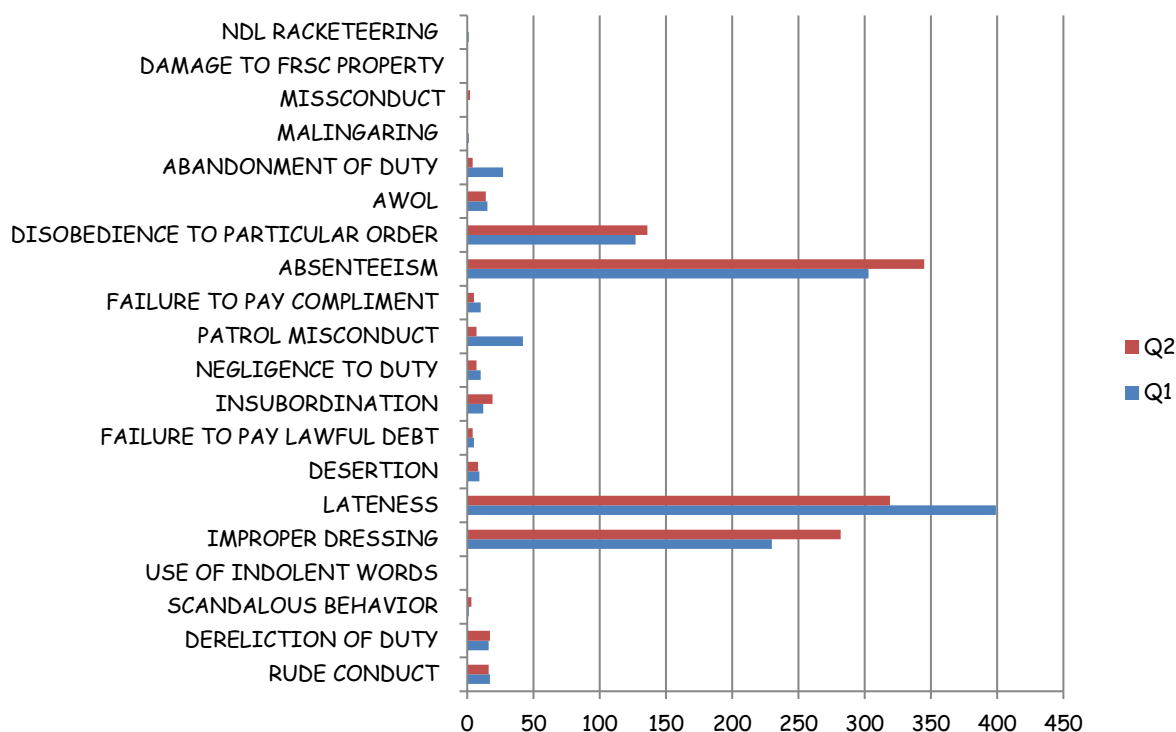

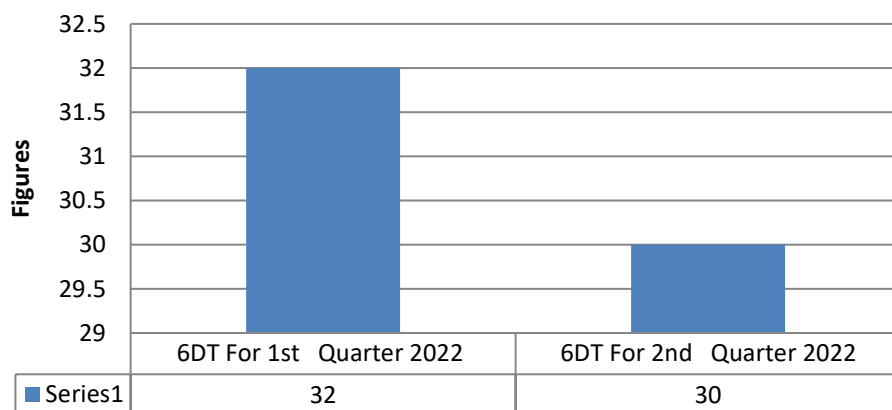
