PERSISTENT REQUEST BY STAFF FOR PREFERENTIAL POSTING: A TREND THAT MUST STOP

The Corps Marshal has lately been besieged with request for preferential or so called juicy postings by Officers and Marshals. More worrisome is the prevalence of highly placed individuals who solicit for such postings of both Senior Officers, Officers and Marshals.

2. In the light of the above, I am directed to express Corps Marshal's displeasure for the ugly trend which is not only against the Standard Operating Procedure of the Corps but also against the Public Service Rules and terms of engagement as entrenched in the appointment letter. Regulation 21 of the FRSC Regulations on Discipline 2018 also clearly prohibits this. Currently the Corps has over one thousand four hundred and forty six (1446) formations which must be actively manned by Personnel in post.

3. Consequent upon the foregoing, the Corps Marshal has directed as follows:

- a. All previous warnings contained in reference A to C above among others remain sacrosanct.
- b. Any staff found to be soliciting for posting either from Senior Officers within the Corps or through the use of an outsider will be severely sanctioned.
- c. Commanding Officers are enjoined to warn staff under their purview to desist from such acts which is capable of diverting the Corps from achieving its goals.

4. The Corps Marshal therefore, urges all staff to recommit themselves to upholding the highest standards of professionalism and teamwork. Soliciting for posting is not in line with these standards and will not be tolerated. Commanding Officers are hereby directed to enlighten and educate staff on the content of this circular.

5. Treat as very imperative, please.
